The obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation continues to be suspended as long as the pandemic continues. This means that you are not presently obligated to attend Mass. All COVID-19 positive persons, those who are symptomatic, and those living with them, must stay home.

UPDATED MASS DIRECTIVES

Face coverings are no longer required for those who attend Mass, Confession, and Adoration. You are welcome to wear a mask if that is your preference. Priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion will wear masks for the distribution of Holy Communion.

Social distancing is no longer required during Masses. Consequently, during our weekday and Sunday morning Masses, we will no longer leave open pews between seated pews. However, given that some people will still prefer social distancing, we will continue to leave open pews during our 5:00 p.m. Saturday Vigil Mass.

FROM FATHER MARQUARD

RENEWED AND RECOMMITTED

After many months of uncertainty and waiting, I am happy to announce that Archbishop Hebda has appointed me to another six-year term as pastor at Good Shepherd. I received unofficial word that this was coming a couple of weeks ago, but was told to keep this confidential, especially as it could change. "Wait for the letter" is the general refrain when it comes to assignments. I have been on the lookout for that letter ever since learning that I would likely be staying. After a few false alarms (other letters from the archdiocese), the real thing finally came on Saturday. I am grateful to be staying. And I am hopeful for what we will be able to experience together of God's goodness and love in the coming years.

In his letter, the archbishop asked me to care for all of you with the love of a father and shepherd. I ask your prayers that, with divine assistance, I will be able to do so. The archbishop also asked me to recommit to the responsibilities of a pastor as established in Canon Law. Some of the canons mentioned have to do with who can appoint pastors and for how long and what to do when there is no pastor and that sort of thing. The canons printed below outline what I am to be about as your pastor. Please pray that I will be able to commit myself wholeheartedly to these responsibilities.

Can. 519 The pastor (parochus) is the proper pastor (pastor) of the parish entrusted to him, exercising the pastoral care of the community committed to him under the authority of the diocesan bishop in whose ministry of Christ he has been called to share, so that for that same community he carries out the functions of teaching, sanctifying, and governing, also with the cooperation of other presbyters or deacons and with the assistance of lay members of the Christian faithful, according to the norm of law.

Can. 528 §1. A pastor is obliged to make provision so that the word of God is proclaimed in its entirety to those living in the parish; for this reason, he is to take care that the lay members of the Christian faithful are instructed in the truths of the faith, especially by giving a homily on Sundays and holy days of obligation and by offering catechetical instruction. He is to foster works through which the spirit of the gospel is promoted, even in what pertains to social justice. He is to have particular care for the Catholic education of children and youth. He is to make every effort, even with the collaboration of the Christian faithful, so that the message of the gospel comes also to those who have ceased the practice of their religion or do not profess the true faith.

§2. The pastor is to see to it that the Most Holy Eucharist is the center of the parish assembly of the faithful. He is to work so that the Christian faithful are nourished through the devout celebration of the sacraments and, in a special way, that they frequently approach the sacraments of the Most Holy Eucharist and penance. He is also to endeavor that they are led to practice prayer even as families and take part consciously and actively in the sacred liturgy which, under the

Dear Father Marquard,

Thank you for your service as pastor of the Church of the Good Shepherd in Golden Valley, Minnesota, an office that you have been exercising faithfully and well since 2015.

I have reviewed your request to continue as pastor for another term. In accord with the Archdiocesan Policy on Term Limits for Pastors, I am pleased to renew your assignment as pastor of the Church of the Good Shepherd for an additional six years, with an anticipated end date of June 30, 2027. You will continue to hold all the rights, privileges, and obligations of a pastor as defined in the Code of Canon Law and the particular law of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis.

By virtue of this extension, I am asking you to commit yourself once again to the responsibilities of teaching, sanctifying, and governing that are set forth for a pastor in canons 519-537 of the Code of Canon Law. Care for the souls in your parish and school with the love of a father and shepherd.

Father Marquard, I am deeply grateful for your commitment to your parish and school. I hope this extension of time as pastor proves to e pastorally fruitful for your parishioners and a blessing in your priestly life.

authority of the diocesan bishop, the pastor must direct in his own parish and is bound to watch over so that no abuses creep in.

Can. 529 §1. In order to fulfill his office diligently, a pastor is to strive to know the faithful entrusted to his care. Therefore he is to visit families, sharing especially in the cares, anxieties, and griefs of the faithful, strengthening them in the Lord, and prudently correcting them if they are failing in certain areas. With generous love he is to help the sick, particularly those close to death, by refreshing them solicitously with the sacraments and commending their souls to God; with particular diligence he is to seek out the poor, the afflicted, the lonely, those exiled from their country, and similarly those weighed down by special difficulties. He is to work so that spouses and parents are supported in fulfilling their proper duties and is to foster growth of Christian life in the family.

§2. A pastor is to recognize and promote the proper part which the lay members of the Christian faithful have in the mission of the Church, by fostering their associations for the purposes of religion. He is to cooperate with his own bishop and the presbyterium of the diocese, also working so that the faithful have concern for parochial communion, consider themselves members of the diocese and of the universal Church, and participate in and sustain efforts to promote this same communion.
