They pulled together to secure our property, build our church and school, and expand through the decades.

Now, it's our turn. Now is our time to help Good Shepherd move boldly into the next 75 years. I'm grateful that we're here now and that we have this opportunity. And I am confident because of what I see happening at Good Shepherd. We are flourishing in many ways. We plan to be here for a long time.

Sometime this week, all of our registered parishioners and school families will receive by mail an introductory document that outlines the scope of our project and the next steps for Good Shepherd. Next weekend, as we kick off Catholic Schools Week, we will also introduce our plans to everyone who is here. We are excited to share with you the new and improved vision and scope of this bold project.

And we are excited to hear what you have to say about it. You will have an opportunity to share your feedback and discuss our proposal during two feedback sessions. NET NIGHT UPDATES

As we look ahead to our upcoming NET Nights, we have decided to make a change to our start time in January and February. This change will mean that we will NOT offer dinner for our teens. Our new start time will be **6:00 p.m**. We will continue with our 8:30 p.m. end time. **This will apply to NET Nights on January 26 and February 9.**

Thank you for making the NET Night time change work. Our decision to stop the dinner portion was not made easily, as community is so important for this age group. Our rationale is twofold: Most importantly, we heard feedback from parents about their concerns regarding the current rise in COVID-19 in our community. We are hoping that by eliminating the dinner portion, we lessen the concern about our teens being unmasked for a significant amount of time. The second reason for our change is continued increase in food cost. Taking a two-month break will allow us to stay within budget. Our goal is to bring back the dinner portion in March, as the community formed through food is a huge benefit.
