

New Year's Message and Appeal to educate kids in South Sudan

Sisters and brothers, fellow parishioners and dear people of God, Happy New Year to you all and blessings from above to your families. This is the beginning of another New Year of grace, and a great time we always spend asking for blessings and the best things from God. Wishing someone a happy new year in a religious way sometimes becomes difficult for us. That is why I pray and hope that God will shower you with His uncountable blessings throughout the year. May 2022 be a year of joy, peace, unity, love and success for your families and your loved ones. May it also be a year where God will answer our prayers and free the world from the monster pandemic known as Covid. As we thank God for his many blessings, care and protection in 2021, may this New Year be an excellent opportunity to seek His forgiveness for our past mistakes, in order for us to receive his unconditional mercy and uncountable blessings. As we have just celebrated the Feast of the Holy

Family a Sunday after Christmas, I have this to say to those who are married; look your partner in the eye and say to him/her, "As I believe in God, I also believe in our love. As the family God is Holy, let us make our family to look like theirs in holiness." For those who want to give up their marriage because of challenges, I say to you, never give up! God is watching over you, you are capable of fixing anything wrong in it through His help in order to continue in this difficult journey together in 2022 and beyond.

This Sunday the Church Celebrates the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Baptism illustrates new birth and the identification of those baptized with Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. In the Catechism of the Catholic Church n. 537 we are instructed that: "Through Baptism the Christian is sacramentally assimilated to Jesus, who in his own baptism anticipates his death and resurrection..." That said, as the Baptism of Christ was a public act of faith, so should our baptism be likewise. That is why St. Augustine of Hippo insisted that, "baptism does not profit a man outside his/her unity with the Church." That is simply because, "Every baptized person should consider that it is in the womb of the Church where he/she is transformed from a child of Adam to a child of God" (St. Vincent Ferrer). We should also recall Jesus' words to Nicodemus in Jn 3:5: "Unless a man is born again of water and the Holy Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God." Here, the Lord is reminding us of how important baptism is for our entrance into Heaven. Thus, may we all pray for those who are not baptized to seek these Holy waters that does not only cleanse original sin, but much more opens for us the gate of Heaven.

Through Baptism we are above all invited to serve our needy brothers and sisters, especially the vulnerable among us. Together, our kindness and generosity can make this world a safer place, and one home for poor children in particular. For the past four years we have been taking the second collection in January or February to assist the orphans and poor students in South Sudan. Our collections for these past four years, gave hope to many children in the war-torn country of South Sudan. On their behalf, I take this opportunity to thank you and your families for your help and generosity. For these children, you are all special type of people that changes lives, lifts people up, and makes the world a better place. Thank you for your donation and your love for South Sudanese children. That said, I now appeal that we will take the second collection for the Tuition Fees and school supplies for these children the week end of February 5-6, 2022 at all of our Masses.




INTRODUCING: BEN HOSKINS— ST. AMBROSE'S NEW MUSIC DIRECTOR AND ORGANIST!


