

SEEK HIM: LENT 2022



Each month I typically hear from at least one person who is seeking to join the church. We begin to meet regularly and our conversations center around what led them to this moment, their journey of faith, and an exploration of what they are seeking not just now, but also in the future. I have heard some of the most beautiful testimonies, whether it's a desire to raise a family

in faith or to receive the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, people are seeking something important as they walk into my office. As I reflect on these encounters I think of the Disciples in the Gospel of John (6:67-69) when all but the twelve leave Jesus and Jesus asks them, "do you also want to leave?" and Peter replies "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." Peter knows Jesus is the "Holy One of God." As we seek Jesus in our own lives it can be easy to act as the other disciples who found Jesus' teaching hard and walk away. However, when you seek Jesus and come to know Him, you are willing to be bold like Peter and the rest of the 12, staying with Jesus even when it is hard.

Lent is a more intense spiritual preparation for the "Elect" (those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil). It is during these final weeks of preparation that they are no longer learning about faith, but instead are going through a time of deeper reflection intended to "purify the minds and hearts of the elect as they search their own consciences and do penance. This period is intended as well to enlighten the minds and hearts of the elect with a deeper knowledge of Christ the Savior" (RCIA 139). During Lent, we, with the elect, are called to repent, to let go of those things that hold us back from really knowing Jesus, thus opening up and freeing our hearts to fully receive Him.


Scholarships Available

Q How can the assembly help the catechumens?

A In many ways! Through their friendly, welcoming demeanor toward catechumens, by learning their names, greeting them, and



engaging them in conversation, assembly members reassure them that they have a place in the community. Most of the rites of initiation take place at Sunday Mass. By its attention and participation in these rites, the assembly expresses the community's care and encouragement for the catechumens. What's more, at every liturgy, catechumens look to assembly members as models, following their example and reflecting on the meaning of the rituals as they watch the assembly's responses. Welcoming the catechumens into parish activities not only makes them feel included, it also provides them glimpses of the life of disciples. Becoming a sponsor for a catechumen is yet another way assembly members could be helpful. Finally, the faithful can pray for the catechumens throughout the week.





2nd Sunday in Lent

Gn 15:5-12, 17-18 | Phil 3:17-4:1 | Lk 9:28b-36

GROW: AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In today's Gospel from Luke, Jesus is transfigured before the disciples: They see a glorious vision of him wearing dazzling white, with a "face changed in appearance," and conversing with Moses and Elijah about the "exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem." This is in marked contrast to what Luke had recounted just prior to these verses: Jesus' prediction of his suffering and death, and the assertion that his disciples must take up their crosses daily in order to follow him. So it is no surprise that Peter, likely somewhat stunned after being a part of both moments. "did not know what he was saying." Then a cloud passes over and, while they are frightened, they hear God's voice affirm what they have just seen: "This my chosen Son; listen to him." We all experience these extremes - days where all seems lost; others where we feel as though we've had glimpses of heaven. Today's Gospel encourages us to look to Jesus, who has experienced the frailty of humanity and the glory of divinity. Through his suffering, death, and resurrection, we are redeemed, and ultimately - as the disciples glimpsed today - "he will change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body."

GO: EVANGELIZE | PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Life can bring unexpected joys and disappointments. One day we

celebrate a birth; another we grieve the loss of a loved one. We fall in love; we experience broken relationships. Many of us may find ourselves in flux much of the time: Will this pandemic ever end? Will the cancer recur? What's next now that the kids are grown? Today's readings give me great hope in the knowledge that God is with us through all the twists and turns and ups and downs of our lives. Just as God fulfilled his promises to Abraham, God has given us a Savior in Jesus Christ and promises that we will someday share in his glory. To that end, we can strive to ensure that no darkness in our world prevents us from becoming a source of light to others. Jesus and the saints walk before us. We pray, then, for the grace to listen to God's chosen Son, and to "stand firm in the Lord."

PRAY: Lent is a good time to try a new form of prayer. Do you often pray silently? Try the rosary or spoken prayer. Do you normally pray out loud.? Try centering prayer

or another form of quiet or silent prayer, such as Lectio Divina.


