FOLLOW HIM: LENT 2022



Jesus tells us how to follow Him, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" (Mt 16:24).

Have you ever stood there at the beginning or end of Mass and watched the procession? Do you notice the cross, and its placement in the procession? The cross leads, those in the procession follow the cross. For the last several

months I have been drawn to the cross as it leads Father both to the altar for the Mass, and as it leads him out of the church into what some call the "mission field," or place where we are all called to go and share the love and mercy of Jesus with those we meet throughout the week. In RCIA the first public rite that we do is called the Rite of Acceptance, this is where a person entering the journey has completed initial conversations and is ready to say "Yes, I want to become Catholic." It is during this Rite that Father gives them the "cross of Christ." Here, at OLIH, Father literally hands them the processional cross. Because of its weight Father leans the cross towards them as they receive it, a beautifully symbolic gesture to remind us of the weight of the cross and how we may need to build our spiritual muscles if we are to lift high our cross.

One of my favorite parts of the Rite of Acceptance is the signing of the senses, which immediately follows the reception of the cross. As a sponsor makes the sign of the cross over each part of the body, Father reads the words that remind both them and us, the faithful, of how we use our bodies to live the life Jesus calls us to, to live as followers of Jesus. Read the words below and challenge yourself to ask - do I use this sense for the purpose of bringing God glory?

Receive the sign of the cross on your ears, that you may hear the voice of the Lord.

Receive the sign of the cross on your eyes, that you may see the glory of God.

Receive the sign of the cross on your lips, that you may respond to the word of God.

Receive the sign of the cross over your heart, that Christ dwell there by faith.

Receive the sign of the cross on your shoulders, that you may bear the gentle yoke of Christ.

Receive the sign of the cross on your hands, that Christ may be known in the work you do.

Receive the sign of the cross on your feet, that you may walk in the way of Christ.

My hope is that what we do in RCIA leads a person closer to knowing Jesus, loving Jesus, and following Jesus in their everyday life. The life of a disciple is different than earning a degree or a certification: there's no perfect checklist, nor is there a guarantee that once you become a disciple that you will remain there. The Annual Diocesan Appeal is a way for each parish to support all the parishes in the Diocese. Once you leave the Des Moines

metro area, the diocesan parishes you encounter are small and rural, until you reach Council Bluffs. Contributing to the ADA helps provide the smaller rural parishes, that have much smaller staff, with faith-enriching resources for their parishioners.



The ADA is not optional—every parish contributes an amount based on its ability to pay. For OLIH that amount is \$281,000 and we are at 63% with just 403 of our families (17% of our total) contributing. Let's come together and wrap up this year's ADA in April by successfully meeting our goal.

Common Questions about the *Ignitel* **Campaign** How will the Diocese determine the pledge amounts that families are asked to consider?

Pledge amounts are based, in large part, on your previous generosity toward the Diocese of Des Moines, your history of parish support, and whether you participated in the planning



study. The Stewardship Office certainly doesn't know everyone's financial situation, however, Bishop Joensen's goal is to challenge every family to make a meaningful gift. Please note, the suggested pledge amount is not an expectation. It is an invitation for each family to participate at a meaningful

level. We will be grateful for any support you offer.

How are parish goals determined?

A Clergy Committee comprised of 13 pastors from parishes throughout the Diocese was engaged to determine parish goals, which are based on 1.28 times the average annual offertory over the three previous years. A parish goal is not a mandate. Parishes will not be billed for the difference if they do not achieve their goal provided they put forth a good faith effort to reach the campaign goal.

April 10, 2022

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Is 50:4-7 | Phil 2:6-11 | Lk 22:14-23:56 or Lk 23:1-49

GROW: AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE Palm Sunday can seem like a study in contrasts. We hear the jubilant account of Jesus riding triumphantly into Jerusalem. Then we listen to the Passion narrative, reminded that Jesus' kingship bears little resemblance to royalty as we perceive it. He will suffer and he will die. As Paul describes it, "He humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him." Jesus tries to explain this to the disciples, who don't fully grasp the events about to take place, instead guarreling over who would be the greatest. Yet even in this chaos of misunderstanding, Jesus continues to teach them, promising that those who stand by him in his trials will join him in the kingdom of heaven. There are certainly times when we fail to fully perceive and understand all that the Lord is teaching us, or why we are undergoing certain trials and difficulties. As we enter into Holy Week, we can ask Jesus to help us understand the meaning of the cross in our own lives, using this time to reflect on the meaning of his sacrifice for each of us.

GO: EVANGELIZE | PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

As we listen to the Passion narrative, we hear Peter betray Jesus, the soldiers jeer at him, and a passer-by being told to carry

Christ's cross. Only Luke's account describes the two criminals, one of whom demanded that Jesus "save yourself and us." The second criminal rebukes him, asking Jesus to "remember me when you come into your kingdom." After Jesus dies, the centurion glorifies God, a good man takes him down from the cross, the women prepare his body for burial. As we enter Holy Week, we will have time to reflect on Jesus' last days, but also on the individuals in the crowd the day he died. How did they react? How would we have reacted? What can we learn from the women who stayed beside Jesus, the criminal who looked beyond his own pain and sin to see Jesus as Messiah, and even Peter in his initial betrayal? During the week ahead, we can also make an effort to attend each liturgy of the Triduum, using this time to deepen our faith as we prepare for Easter.

PRAY Take time to read the Passion

narrative at home. Invite Jesus into your heart. If you've fallen a little behind on your Lenten commitments, Holy Week is a great time to hit refresh.
