



# FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DAVE

# <u>DECEMBER 25-26, 2021</u> <u>CHRISTMAS BLESSINGS; THE WAIT IS OVER!</u>

It seemed like a long Advent to me this year, and indeed it was only one day short of its maximum length. But now we have arrived at that day that we have all been waiting for during the past four weeks – the great Feast of Christmas (the Nativity of Our Lord).

It gives me great joy to welcome all of you as we gather with a festive spirit here at St. Bridget's this Christmas weekend, to give praise to God for birth of Jesus his Son. A year ago I thought that covid concerns would be a thing of the past by now, but such has not proven to be the case. Thankfully, for many, the various vaccines and booster shots have provided a level of protection, although not total immunity from the virus dangers. Please know that for those who choose to enact an extra level of protection through masking, we are certainly supportive and welcome your presence, participation and prayers. For those who desire more distancing than seating in the Church provides, the Mass is being video linked to the big screen in the Social Hall with individual chair seating and Communion being distributed in the Social Hall.

You may notice that the pared down level of decorations of last year have now been restored to a more robust level of festivity with additional lights, flowers and trees. The organ, which has been silent throughout Advent, now rejoins our cantors/choir along with our larger and more resonant grand piano donated this past year by the family of Henry and Rita Peloquin. We have consciously tried to schedule all of the well-known Christmas songs that are in our hymnals, plus a few extras, to be used through the course of our two week Christmas Season. So please join in the singing to enrich our and your worship experience.

Just a few words about attendance and finances as we celebrate Christ's birth and also approach the end of the calendar year. St. Bridget's, like many parishes, has not fully recovered from the covid shutdown and gradual re-opening triggered 21 months ago. Many, but certainly not all, have returned to weekend Mass attendance. Beginning in September, our attendance has alternated between 450 and 550 persons per weekend –we'll say an average of 500. Pre-covid attendance hovered around 700 persons per weekend, depending on the time of year (winter snowbirds vs. summer cabiners). So we are currently experiencing attendance that is down by 25-30% from pre-covid levels.

The attendance impacts finances. For the fiscal year

to date (July 1st to the present-5 months) our total of envelope and offertory collections are down by roughly \$44,000 from the current budget and \$18,000 from last year's level. On the expense side, we are also down by roughly \$41,000 from the budget and \$21,000 from last year's spending level. Bottom Line: as of Dec 15 our total actual income has been \$378,947. Our total expenses have been \$352,553., resulting in a year to date surplus of \$26,393 of income over expenses. THANK YOU – that sounds good, right? Yes, BUT, part of that income was a profit of \$30,200 from the sale of one of our rental houses. Without that, we would be running a roughly \$4,000 deficit year to date.

BOTTOM LINE MESSAGE: Thank you so much for your support to St. Bridget's, but please continue, or even increase, if possible, that generosity, especially while covid continues to mean less people are coming to Mass to finance the many and even added services that we provide (video ministry for instance) as well as the capital improvement projects (e.g. rental house needed upgrades) that we have on the "do-to" list. We will provide a more detailed State of the Parish Year to Date in next week's bulletin.

More than anything, Christmas is about blessings and gifts. God has blessed us with the gift of his Son Jesus, and the necessities for our daily life. Similarly, each of you are a blessing and a gift to St. Bridget's parish by your very presence, your prayers, your volunteering, and your financial support. We are grateful for your choosing to be part of St. Bridget's Parish Community. On behalf of our entire Parish Staff, we thank you sincerely and wish you and your loved ones a safe and blessed Christmas Day and Christmas Season!

The things that bring joy in life can have an ongoing and everlasting effect, and that is what happened as a result of these two weeks last Summer. More information will follow.

As I dotted that last sentence, I received a phone call from Julie at Real Life Catholic/Augustine Institute, the publishers of Chris Stefanick's latest book, "Living Joy." As I mentioned two weeks ago, two of my favorite authors are Joyce Meyer and Chris Stefanick. They have both recently published books concentrating on living joy-filled lives. With everything going on in the world today, I guess they both felt that people are taking their eyes off the prize, and they both have the ability and talent to get people to refócus. The reason that I received a call from Real Life Catholic is because I had called them and asked permission to go into a little more depth in Chris Stefanick's Living Joy than I might normally would have. They said to go for it, just give Chris proper credit. Just to let you know, Chris Stefanik is the author of our "Chosen" program, that is used by our 7th and 8th grade Faith Formation classes, so his work is very familiar to me, along with 7th-10th graders. I believe there is lots of great stuff in Chris's 9 Rules of "Living Joy," and I'll be happy to pass it along when I'm in need of a column.

Your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy

from you.—John16:22

We all really want just one thing. Whether it's money, success, impact on the world, a great marriage, a stable family, or a yacht in Hawaii, it's all for one reason, we want to be happy, we want joy. Chris points out the words of St. John Paul II, when he was talking to hundreds of thousands of young people in Toronto, "Dear young people...I have felt the deep longing that beats within your hearts: you want to be happy!"

Now, let's look at the power, or the unstoppable force behind joy. Preferring spiritual pleasure over passing pleasuré makes temptations easier to topple. Forgiving people is easier, because they can't take from you the one thing that matters. We all fail at times, but it can't crush a joyful person. Joy makes a magnetic and attractive leader, and a force for good in the world. In the words of then-Cardinal Ratzinger (later Pope Benedict XVI), "The deepest poverty is the inability of joy, the tediousness of a life considered absurd and contradictory... The inability of joy presupposes and produces the inability to love, produces jealousy, avarice—all defects that devastate the life of individuals and of the world." Thank you Cardinal, and thank you Chris.
