FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DAVE

WE REMEMBER OUR HEROES

It hardly seems possible that we could already be at this point in the month of May, but the Memorial Day weekend is upon us. To many, this represents the unofficial beginning of the season of summer, but much more than that, it is the national holiday when we remember those men and women in the military who have given their lives in the service of their country.

The holiday's origins go back to the mid 1800's, originating in the period of re-unification after the Civil War. Both its scope and its date have evolved over the years. Originally marked on May 30 (no matter what day of the week it fell upon), it was later changed to the last Monday in May to accommodate the "3 day weekend" practice. Likewise, the focus has broadened over the years to include honoring all of the dead – military and civilian – although special tributes are still accorded to our war dead.

Around the country, including in the Twin Cities, many ceremonies will take place with the laying of ceremonial wreathes, the playing of Taps, and firing of rifle volleys. Within the Archdiocese, many of the Catholic Cemeteries traditionally celebrate a Mass in the cemetery itself for the intention of all the departed members of the parishes who have served in the military through the various wars over the years. We are blessed in this country to enjoy the degree of freedom that so many of us easily take for granted. Unfortunately, other than on a weekend like this, we far too seldom recognize the tremendous sacrifices that have been and continue to be made to ensure that our freedom is maintained and protected.

How many women and men have given their lives over time in the service of the United States? On this weekend, we honor all those who have served in the various branches of our Armed Forces – prayerfully remembering those who have passed away, and also gratefully thanking both those who have served honorably and the returned to civilian life, and those who currently remain vigilant on our behalf to help ensure a more peaceful world for us and for future generations.

The best prayer that we as Catholics can offer is the sacrifice of the Mass, and we will do just that at St. Bridget's in this Monday, Memorial Day at 9:00 am in the Church. Before the Mass begins we will continue the tradition of running a slide show of anyone whose picture we have that is or has served in the military. In addition, a color guard of American Legion Post #272 members will present the colors as a prelude to our opening hymn (the National Anthem).

In the prayer that underlies this holiday in our Catholic tradition, we ask God to look kindly on the many sacrifices that our loved ones have made in order to grant us the freedom that we all take for granted. It is a freedom that has been won at great cost – the cost of many lives. Since we are still in the Easter Season, it is not just the crucified Christ hanging above the altar as we celebrate the Mass that we call to mind, in recognition of his sacrifice that won the forgiveness of our sins, but it is also the Risen Christ that gives us the image of what we one day hope to be.

I invite you and your family, before you begin your holiday festivities to join us for this prayerful remembrance of what Memorial Day is all about. Then, let the Summer begin!
