## FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DAVE

This weekend we are splitting this column by covering two different topics. I will be writing, at the request of the Stewardship Committee, about an update of where we stand on some of the larger parish projects that we either have completed, that are in process, or that are on our future wish list.

Heidi has written an important article about changes in the way that we will handle our written bulletin and online prayer list in the future so as to highlight new people being added to the list and to make more efficient use of limited bulletin space. So, let's begin with Heidi's topic first.....

### PRAYER LIST CHANGE by Heidi Gieske

You may have noticed that the prayer list looks different this week. We want to highlight people who are new on the prayer list, as well as those from our community who are in most urgent need of prayer.

From now on we will publish the entire list of people on the prayer list in the bulletin on the first Sunday of the month. The rest of the month, you will see only the names of people who are new or in critical need of prayer. The new people will remain on the short list for 2 weeks. This will help us more easily notice the new names coming on to the list. You will always be able to find the entire list of people on our prayer list on our website, or on the paper copies in the narthex.

Please continue to remember to tell me, Heidi, when your loved one no longer needs prayer so we can keep the list as current as possible.

Thank you to all those who pray for the needs of our loved ones asking for prayer. Jesus invites us to bring our needs to him in prayer. He wants us to seek him out with our requests. He desires to lavish us with his love and answer our prayers. He may not always answer in just the way we ask, but he always answers with his abiding presence, encouragement, and healing love. When we pray for each other, we become part of the story, we become part of the outpouring of grace flowing down from the Father in heaven to our loved ones. ### UPDATE ON "TO DO" & "HAVE DONE" LISTS

We are rapidly approaching the end of our fiscal year (June 30), which means that it's a good time to not only think about how we stand with the operating budget for the parish, but also to look at present and future large expenditure projects.

Let's start with the three rental houses that we own – fondly referred to as the yellow, the blue, and the white houses. We decided this year that it was definitely time to do some badly needed repairs. Therefore, the yellow house has had both the roof and windows replacement (\$19,737), which puts it in decent shape. The blue house adjoining our driveway from Elm Street has received new (still blue) siding (Total \$24,530), and is now no longer an embarrassment to the parish. The white house, the oldest of the three houses, has had a roof replacement and will soon also receive new windows and siding. (Total repairs to the white house are \$78,717).

We are also moving forward on an LED lighting upgrade to the church in two phases. The first and most urgently needed work is in the sanctuary (\$11,300). Only 6 of the 16 sanctuary floodlight bulbs are still working. They were replaced only a year ago, and at each replacement, we must bring in an outside company with a lift to change them. Plus, when they are all lit they consume a whopping 10,000 watts of electricity. Unfortunately, the electrician is having trouble getting the new fixtures we need (supply chain). But after that project is completed, we will then convert to LED's in the rest of the worship space. (\$57,000) Our lighting bills should drop significantly once the lighting projects are complete.

Also on the list, but not yet committed to is the replacement of the carpet in the Education Building classrooms, hallways and offices (estimated \$45,235), correcting the mistakes that the contractor made in remodeling the Social Hall kitchen (estimated \$30,000), a new telephone system for the campus – it is becoming increasingly unreliable, (actually dropping calls), and parts are getting hard to find. (no estimates yet), upgrading campus security with cameras & electronic locks, and repairs to the ceiling of the east wing, and tile in the Education Building bathrooms. Lots to do, I'll keep you informed.
