So don't go spending all of your money at the State Fair this week. Make sure that you save some \$\$\$ to spend right here at home. (Of course, it's not just about the money – it's even more importantly about the fellowship – having a good time with neighbors and friends and parishioners.)

Make sure to begin training your hearty appetite for next Saturday night's delicious turkey dinner. Think about it – steaming hot turkey and all the fixin's (stuffing, mashed potatoes, corn, cranberries, dinner roll, PLUS our world famous pumpkin bars for desert, AND a beverage included.) All for the price of \$14. Surely you will want to invite your friends, relatives and neighbors! And....if you prefer something a little more casual, the Concession Stand will have lots of burgers, brats, hot dogs, candy, ice cream, soda and other assorted treats. Let's not forget the ability to soak in the music of A Hard Day's Night with a short intro of Buddy Holly tunes, then Beatles music for the rest of the evening for you munching, dancing and listening enjoyment. The Silent Auction (which runs Saturday night and again until noon on Sunday) always provides unique and varied items that I find hard to resist. Of course, we surely we can't forget the Raffle. <u>Please</u> <u>pick up your tickets if you have not already done so</u>. The Raffle is by far the major source of Block Party income.

So as a reminder, what is the purpose of our Block Party – or any parish festival, for that matter? I would see it as basically threefold. I am not ashamed to say the following statement publicly: – one of the purposes of the Block Party is to make money! This year, we budgeted roughly \$13,000 in income from the event. While nowhere close to the largest part of our income, we nevertheless still really depend on the money to help support our parish programs.

A second purpose for our Block Party is to have fun and to build a sense of unity and community within our parish. As you well know, there are lots of people working very hard to make all of the facets of Block Party happen. I am deeply grateful for that effort, and hope that everyone who has any role in pulling this off has a good time and a few laughs in the process.

Finally, an equally important purpose for our annual Block Party is to welcome and build bonds of friendship and good will with the broader Lindstrom (and Lakes Area) community. So, bring as many people as you can, and spread the word far and wide. (P.S. – I'll be responsible for the weather.)




A message from Joe Kuschel Youth Minister 651-257-2474 x56
