Message from the Pastor

Ash Wednesday ~ March 2nd

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Lent begins with the ancient practice of distributing ashes as a public and communal sign of penance. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest or deacon applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" or "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Ash Wednesday Mass will be at 8:30 AM and 7:00 PM at Immaculate Conception church.

Safety precautions will still be taken. As it was in 2021, this year we will also sprinkle ashes over each person's head instead of making the Sign of the Cross with the ashes on foreheads.

Ash Wednesday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, all Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Beginning Friday, March 4, each Lenten Friday at 7:00 PM, the Stations of the Cross will be celebrated at Immaculate Conception church.

I pray that God will bless our Lenten time with His grace so it will bring to many spiritual fruits for you, your family and our parish.
