



THE ABUNDANT HARVEST BY FATHER WALTER NOLTE

“Repent and believe in the gospel.”

These are the first words out of the mouth of Jesus in his inaugural address to people gathered by the Sea of Galilee as recorded in the first chapter of the Gospel of Mark. Jesus immediately calls them to change the way they were living their lives, urging them to a radical conversion of heart: a metanoia. We also hear him specifically invite Simon, Andrew, James, and John to an even deeper calling to be his disciples. His preaching inspires an immediate response from these four fishermen to do just that. They leave everything behind, follow Him along the way, and learn from His example of holiness.

This invitation, though, brings us to a place of interior questioning. What does it mean for us to repent and to believe in the Gospel? To repent means that we acknowledge our sinfulness and make a decisive change in the direction our lives are going if that direction is leading us away from the love of God. We exercise the gift of our free-will and choose to ask for forgiveness for our sins trusting in the ocean of mercy that Jesus offers each one of us from the Cross. To believe in the Gospel, or the Good News, means we choose to no longer seek comfort and solace in things of the world. We choose, instead, to ground ourselves and our identity in the love of Jesus. To believe in the Gospel means that we live in the confidence that the words Jesus spoke then are just as true for us today as they were when He first uttered them.

Jesus' call to conversion started a revolution of love in a world wearied by sin. He is still calling disciples today to gather around Him and to live the message He first preached by the Sea of Galilee. He is still inviting souls to abandon themselves to His mercy and to live the good news. The power of His love can do infinitely more in us than we can ever dream or imagine. The time to respond to His call is now, not tomorrow. Take courage, for the Master is calling you.

WORDS OF MERCY

"HEALING—JESUS' COMMISSION" BY FR. BILL CREMERS

As we see the many instances of Jesus healing all of those who were ill, it's easy for us to think, "Could this really happen today?" As we read the Scriptures, however, it becomes clear that Jesus himself expects for this to continue. At the Last Supper, Jesus said to his apostles, "Whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father" (John 14:12). Do you believe in Jesus? Then you can do even greater works than he did!



This becomes even more clear at the Great Commission. Jesus said to the apostles in the Gospel of Matthew, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (28:20). In Mark, we see him add, "These signs will accompany those who believe; in my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. . . . They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover" (Mark 16:17-18). The Gospel then speaks of the disciples: "They went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs" (16:20). Therefore, just as Jesus performed signs of healing to show that the Gospel was true, he desired to give to the Church that same authority, as we will see next week in the Acts of the Apostles.

BOOK REVIEW

HEALING: BRINGING THE GIFT OF GOD'S MERCY TO THE WORLD – MARY HEALY




The first miracle after Pentecost involved the lame man at the temple (Acts 3). Notably, Acts describes Peter as gazing intently at the man and calling the man to look at them. A suggestion for this request is that upon looking at the apostle's face and seeing his faith, the man's faith is strengthened. The Holy Spirit can impart power through a gaze of faith. This act of "gazing intently" also occurs at Jesus' Ascension with the apostles, Jewish leaders gazing at Stephen's face before he was martyred as it became like an angel's face, and other events in Acts (Acts 1:10, 7:55). Peter begins this miracle by admitting that "he is broke" so it will not be by his means that the man is healed. Peter witnesses to his faith by commanding the man to "walk in the name of Jesus" in the midst of a crowd. Faith requires a risk, a stepping out. Peter had so much confidence in Jesus responding to this need that he risks his reputation so that the God's kingdom is manifest in the healing of the man lame from birth.

HUMAN VITAE (ON HUMAN LIFE)




The papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae* (On Human Life) made headlines worldwide in 1968 but few actually read it. Why is it perhaps the most controversial document in modern Church history? Mary Eberstadt, James Hitchcock, and Jennifer Fulwiler provide commentary to address this question and shed light on the document's enduring wisdom.

Pope Paul VI's explains why the Catholic Church rejects contraception based on two aspects of human sexuality: the unitive and the procreative. He prophetically warned of the consequences if contraception became widely practiced: greater infidelity in marriage, confusion regarding the nature of human sexuality and its role in society, the objectification of women for sexual pleasure, compulsory government birth control policies, and the reduction of the human body to an instrument of human manipulation. Other consequences include: artificial reproduction technologies, including cloning, that threaten the dignity of the human person.

SAINT HIGHLIGHT

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: JANUARY 20 – ST. SEBASTIAN, Martyr

St. Sebastian died a martyr during the worst persecution of the early Church, under the Emperor Diocletian. He was a soldier in the emperor's own Praetorian Guard and comforted those who were sentenced to death. He was eventually discovered and also sentenced to death. He was shot through with arrows, but did not die. He is often depicted with the arrows in his body and his arms tied behind his back. Although left for dead, a saintly woman came to bury him, but discovered he was alive and brought him back to health. Once he was strong enough, he came before the emperor and denounced him to his face for his cruelty to Christians. He was then beaten to death on the emperor's orders. St. Sebastian is the patron saint of archers, athletes (for his physical endurance), and of soldiers. He is a model to us of courage and faithfulness and standing up for truth in the face of great opposition.

We also live in a time of opposition to the truths of the faith: of the sanctity of life from conception to natural death; of the sacredness of marriage as God intended between a man and a woman; of the right to avoid government interference with respect to freedom of religion. We are often shot through with the arrows of false civil rights and absolute personal autonomy. We need to pray for the intercession of St. Sebastian for moral endurance and fortitude as we proclaim the good news of love and steadfastly denounce Satan, the father of lies.




