THE ABUNDANT HARVEST BY FATHER WALTER NOLTE

He is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!

The suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ is the most decisive victory ever won over an enemy. The enemy is Satan. His preferred weapons of war were/are sin and death. Jesus defeated the enemy of our human soul through the strength of His humility. St. Paul tells us, “*He did not deem equality with God something to be grasped at, rather He emptied himself*” of everything taking his seat upon the throne of the Cross allowing God to be His strength. He solely sought to glorify His heavenly Father, whereas Satan sought to bring glory and honor to himself.

Humility is the foundation of prayer and holiness. Jesus’ obedience to death of the Cross was the prayer that He prayed to the Father on the behalf of all humanity. He left us this example to follow so that we could grow in holiness and knowledge of the great love the Father has for us and for each and every soul. Humility is the key to our own victory over Satan and the temptations He places before us daily. The humble heart is able to recognize the truth that only God alone can defend it. The humble heart is able to rest in that place of dependency/ waiting upon the Father because it knows and understands that our strength is found in God alone. We imitate Jesus when we empty ourselves of the idea/false belief that it all depends upon us and we have to “fight the good fight” alone. - H: Help.
“I raise my eyes toward the mountains.-From whence shall come my help? My help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth.” Ps. 121:1-2
- U: Us
“For as in one body we have many parts, and all the parts do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ* and individually parts of one another.”Romans 12:4-5
- M: Mary
“Mary said, “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.” Then the angel departed from her. Luke 1:38
- B: Become
“Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children,* you will not enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.” Matt 18:3-4
- L: Little
“He must increase; I must decrease.” John 3:30
- E: Everyday
“Give us this day our daily bread.” Matt 6:11

The Love of God, the Holy Spirit, knits us all together into the Body of Christ hiding us in His glorious wounds. We are not alone in our journey of faith. We each have different strengths and weaknesses that, when united in faith to the Cross of Jesus, has the potential to produce an abundance of graces. WORDS OF MERCY

“THE SEVEN DEADLY WOUNDS OVERVIEW” BY FR. NICHOLAS MISHEK

Christ is Risen! As this article is coming out on Easter it may seem strange to talk about wounds. However, Jesus does something with wounds that we could never imagine, Jesus glorifies them! Think about how Jesus appeared to His apostles after the Resurrection, he appeared to them in his glorified body, and yet he still had the wounds in his hands, feet, and side. Instead of being places of shame they became places of mercy and glory for all who encountered them. Jesus wants to do the same, **with our wounds!** It is when we acknowledge these wounds and bring them before Jesus that they can be glorified and become places of mercy like his.

In these upcoming weeks we will look at each wound individually and the corresponding sacrament that brings about its healing. These wounds are Rejection, Powerlessness, Abandonment, Confusion, Fear, Shame, and Hopelessness. These wounds become the “foundation for our false identity” and “they disfigure the image of God within us.” If left unhealed, they will distort the vision we have of ourselves, others, and God. It is important to remember that there is nothing lacking in God’s grace and in his sacraments, Jesus in his tenderness will not go and heal certain places unless we let him. He respects us and our freedom too much. During this Easter, invite Jesus to reveal and walk with you through these wounds. Jesus sees you as a person to be loved, not a problem to be fixed.

BOOK REVIEW

HEALING: BRINGING THE GIFT OF GOD’S MERCY TO THE WORLD – MARY HEALY



Mary Healy ponders what our Church and world would look like if many Christians took Jesus’ call to proclaim the gospel seriously. She offers three keys to open us to the Lord’s healing grace. First, God acts more freely the more we are united to Him. “I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing” John 15:5. By reading scripture daily and spending time with Jesus, we grow in intimacy with Him. Second, God wants us to ask for good things but in His name and in union with Him. “Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened” Matt. 7:7-8. Have you asked for the gift of healing and the graces to be effective? Lastly, “Do whatever He tells you” John 2:5. Listen to God’s promptings and be willing to take risks and trust He will lead you.



FEAST OF DIVINE MERCY

In the 1930s, St. Faustina Kowalska, a young Polish Roman Catholic nun and mystic wrote a diary recording revelations she received about God's mercy. [The Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska: Divine Mercy in My Soul](#) shares the message that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone—especially the greatest sinners. The message exhorts us to ask for God's mercy, be merciful to others and to be aware that God's mercy is dependent upon our trust in Jesus. The Divine Mercy image was painted based on her visions and Pope John Paul II established the Feast of Divine Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter. Jesus asked that a Novena to the Divine Mercy begin on Good Friday by praying the Divine Mercy chaplet with a specific daily intention, with the most difficult intention of all on the last day: for the souls

SAINT HIGHLIGHT

APRIL 7 – ST. JOHN BAPTIST DE LA SALLE, PRIEST

If you have been to a school with others in a classroom, you can thank St. John Baptist de la Salle. If you have been in a grade, or had a core curriculum, or learned in your mother tongue, or had vocational training, or had teachers who were trained to teach, you can thank St. John Baptist de la Salle. It is due to his innovations in education that much of what we take for granted today has been the preferred method for centuries.

St. John Baptist de la Salle was the son of wealthy parents who decided to become a priest. It was at a chance meeting with a fellow priest who was trying to start a school to educate young girls that he began to come up with the idea to teach poor boys in a free school. His methods of education involved teaching them in French and not Latin, with others together of similar ages rather than individually as with a tutor, and by means of separate classes that comprised a core curriculum. He wanted them to be educated in manners and in a trade as well as in religion. He wanted the boys to be good citizens on earth and good saints for heaven. He founded the Brothers of the Christian Schools in the 17th century and was named patron of school teachers in 1950. We send our

children to school in order to become good citizens, which is one of the primary purposes of St. John Baptist de la Salle's schools and order. But we also need to provide for their moral and religious education so that they may be saints. We may send them to a parish religious education program, home school them, or send them to a Catholic school. Nonetheless, our children, and we too, are citizens of two societies, that of earthly society and of heaven. Let us follow John Baptist de la Salle in preparing our children for both.



FORMING OUR YOUTH

FEASTING ON OUR FAITH

“Then the angel said to the women in reply, “Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay.” Matthew 28: 5-6

He is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia! Isn't Easter wonderful? The weather outside is starting to show renewed life just like our Savior has given us new life through His resurrection! Today is also a wonderful time for families to celebrate His resurrection. While some families may not be gathering this year for safety concerns, here are directions for making a “Resurrection Garden”.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

1 Terra Cotta plant saucer, 1 small Terra Cotta pot, large rock, small rocks, potting soil, grass seed, small sticks, hot glue and a hot glue gun

WHAT YOU DO:

- Place the small pot in the middle of the saucer and put the large rock in front of it.
- Add the small rocks in front of the pot and around the sides, halfway.
- Put dirt on the other half of the small pot and on top to form a mound.
- Sprinkle the grass seed over the dirt, then add a thin layer of additional dirt over the grass seed.
- Cut small twigs to desired lengths then hot glue together to form three crosses.
- Once dry, place in the dirt.
- Place in a sunny, warm location and water as needed.
- Enjoy this most glorious Sunday and Happy Easter!

- Who went to the tomb and saw the stone rolled away? (*Mary Magdalene*) - *John 20:1*
- Who saw Jesus after His resurrection on the road to Emmaus? (*Cleopas*) – *Luke 24:18*
