

THE ABUNDANT HARVEST BY FATHER WALTER NOLTE

The Solemnity of the Assumption [Reflection By Ricard Leonard SJ]

"The strength and power of Mary's witness is most especially captured in the Magnificat from which we just heard. Here Mary extols how God is saving us by turning the world on its head, doing the very opposite of what was expected. The New Testament does not demonstrate a meek woman, devoid of creativity and initiative. It shows a strong, noble woman who put her free-will at the disposal of God's will. That is what the feast of the Assumption celebrates: that because God will never be outdone in fidelity and generosity, he remained utterly faithful to Mary through death, as she was utterly faithful to him in life.

"The Catholic Tradition has always honored Mary as being obedient, the pre-eminent disciple of her Son and the sign of what could await all Christians who are invited to share in the mission of Jesus on earth. Religious obedience is not passive. We listen to the voice of God and choose to say yes to Christ's love and liberation. Discipleship does not mean our personality counts for nothing. Rather, it's the valuing of every individual's ability to contribute to Christ's kingdom in a unique way. Prefiguring what can happen for all of us does not diminish the particular gifts God lavished on Mary, but reassures us that God recognizes his own in this world and the next.

"May this Assumption Day see us then stop ransoming the image of Mary to the distortions of the past and find in her creative and free self-giving a pattern for our Christian lives, and a beacon of hope to which we can hold firm."

Can you believe we all already are back in school? And that festival weekend is on deck? I pray your summer has been safe and relaxing and that students and parents are ready for the new school year. See you next week! Good luck on winning the 2021 Bronco.

WORDS OF MERCY

"HEARING GOD'S VOICE: INTRODUCTION" BY FATHER BILL CREMERS

In order to participate in the prophetic mission of Jesus, we first need to understand what it means to hear what God is saying. If the role of the prophet is to listen to God and then share His Word with the world, then how do we accomplish that first step?

What does the "voice" of God sound like? Many times, we think that it will be a huge event that comes from outside of ourselves (*This is your GOD!!!*) and then we're disappointed when nothing big happens. Rather, God often speaks to us through our own spiritual and physical senses. Recall Elijah in 1 Kings 19 who heard the voice of the Lord in a "still small voice." Think of the many people in the Scriptures who had images that God gave them or specific thoughts that came. The saints also display how they sensed God calling through small prompts during the day, discerning His will through the desires He gives. Throughout these next weeks, we will explore how God speaks "to us through us" in the spiritual senses.

This shows us the importance of having a personal prayer life that is consistent, honest, and fruitful. If we're not already in the routine of having prayer, then I encourage you to begin with at least 10 minutes a day to be in silence, relate to God what is going on in your heart, and listen to His Word.



BOOK REVIEW

THE WAY OF TRUST & LOVE BY JACQUES PHILIPPE

Jacques Philippe asks how do we choose to live your life? The choice between "discontent and gratitude" is not the result of our experience but rather it comes from a freedom we can put into



practice (pg 114). We can choose to turn in on ourselves from fear or unhappiness because of our life, others, or government. Yet this results in becoming more unhappy. He emphasizes the basic rule of life: the more we trust and thank God for our lives especially when things aren't as we would like then we will receive more from God causing our hearts to overflow. In our society of victim mentality, the remedies are faith, hope, love and gratitude. St. Therese wrote, "The only happiness on this earth is to be determined always to find that what Jesus gives us is delightful" (pg 115). This may require heroic virtue but it is excellent spiritual training that bears abundant fruit in our lives.



SAINT HIGHLIGHT AUGUST 19—SERVANT OF GOD NICHOLAS BLACK ELK, HOLY MAN

John G. Neihardt wrote *Black Elk Speaks* as an account of the destruction of the Native American culture with the Massacre of Wounded Knee as the final battle of the Indian Wars. But there is more to his life than the ending of a time and culture. Black Elk was a boy of nine when he had a vision where he was visited by spirits, shown the sacred tree, and called to save his people. His vision became the core of Neihardt's book, as well as his life up to Wounded Knee. He came from a long line of medicine men. He participated in the Battle of the Little Bighorn and traveled to England with Buffalo Bill's Wild West show. He also fought at and survived Wounded Knee. That is where *Black Elk Speaks* ends with a later postscript showing Black Elk on top of Harney Peak, now named Black Elk Peak. There is no mention of how Black Elk became Nicholas Black Elk, a Catholic catechist.



FEASTING ON OUR FAITH

"And Mary said: My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant." Luke 1:46-48

Today is the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary which helps us remember when Mary was taken ("assumed") into heaven, body and soul, after she died. It seems fitting that we celebrate our Blessed Mother's Assumption as our earthly mothers have been sending their children off to begin another school year! Here are a few ways to help your children remember Blessed Mary's Assumption. One way is to say the Glorious Mysteries of the rosary together as a family or just a decade and focus on the Assumption. Another way is to read a story about Mary to your children. One suggestion is The Life of Mary For Children by Sr. Karen Cavanaugh.

Perhaps your children love to cook with you. Since it is traditional to bless fruits and herbs on the feast of the Assumption, you could use fruits and herbs in your dishes today. One idea is to make blueberry pancakes for brunch since blue represents Our Lady. You could also make mini fruit tarts using mini graham cracker crusts, vanilla pudding, berries and whipped cream!

A final way is to go on a walk to pick flowers, collect a few rocks and find a few small sticks. When you get home, put the rocks in the bottom of the vase to represent the tomb. Next put in the flowers on the sticks. On the top of the sticks, carefully place some cotton to represent clouds. On the clouds, paper clip some pictures of Mary and angels onto the heavenly clouds! You will then have a wonderful centerpiece for your table for the feast of the Assumption!




