THE ABUNDANT HARVEST BY FATHER WALTER NOLTE

“But who do you say that I am?”

Wow! What an awesome question Jesus poses to His disciples. He artfully begins His conversation with them by asking them what the people are saying about His identity. This is an easy conversation that requires very little from them. They simply have to act as reporters recounting to Jesus what they had heard and seen. Jesus, however, quickly shifts gears by making the question more personal, requiring introspection on their part. His question to them will require a commitment of sorts from them.

Peter, the Rock, boldly professes the truth his heart has come to know and understand. He goes “all in” stating, “You are the Christ”. This is the proverbial mic drop when Peter then can look at his fellow disciples challenging them to follow suit and commit their lives to the “Anointed One” who had become their friend.

Following Jesus requires us, like these first disciples, to face the mystery of the Cross and the implications it has for our own discipleship. It’s not easy and requires a daily commitment on our part. Our words, deeds, and actions are meant to testify to the world that Jesus is our Lord and Savior and we will boldly follow him anywhere this truth leads us.

Are we willing to answer the same question that Jesus poses to us? Who do we say that He is for us? Are we willing to be courageously radical in a world that needs more disciples like St. Peter and to be “all in” for Jesus? WORDS OF MERCY

“SPIRITUAL SENSES: FEELING” BY FR. BILL CREMERS

We looked at the spiritual senses of seeing (imagination) and hearing (vox mentis – voice of the mind) over these past few weeks, knowing that God speaks to us through us. Another spiritual sense is “feeling,” emotions that we experience that signify God’s presence or our need for Him.

Ephesians 1:18 prays that “May the eyes of your heart be enlightened that you may know what is the hope that belongs to His call.” We commonly associate our heart with the emotions we experience, and these feelings can tell us much about our spiritual lives. We hear throughout the Bible how God bestows both peace and power, and we can experience either of these in our prayer. God can calm our restless hearts with His spirit of peace, and He can give us energy and strength through power.

Our other emotions can also help us pray with others. Maybe we suddenly start feeling anxiety or fear for no apparent reason – maybe this is God’s invitation for us to pray for someone who is experiencing this. When I’ve done this, I’ve been surprised how often someone will talk with or message me who is going through that, and I can pray for them more effectively. When someone experiences a powerful emotion from the Lord, this draws them more closely to trust in Him, so that when it fades, they are dedicated to being in His presence.

BOOK REVIEW

THE FLAME OF LOVE BY ELIZABETH KINDELMAN

Total confidence during trials is key to Jesus’ Heart. Jesus explained that He never let go of her but instead she let go of Him. She had looked to her children for help rather than Him. When her children refused to help, Jesus understood. Jesus knew this rejection by His children. Jesus was asking now for her help to “use all your strength to bring sinners to me...by your desires you have entered entirely into My heart.” When Elizabeth asked why she was chosen, Jesus said, “From among the worst sinners, I choose souls for My work. If they accept, I fill them with great graces” (pg. 17.) Jesus encouraged her saying, “Be humble and refrain your tongue, not saying unneeded words. Do not worry that you can only give me little things.” Our Lady gave Elizabeth her Flame of Love from her Heart. Elizabeth was to add her love to this Flame and pass it to others. Our Lady explained that she was not working miracles as she had done in Fatima because despite those miracles, people ignored her request for the First Saturday devotion.





ST. MAXIMILLIAN KOLBE AND THE PROBLEM OF FREEMASONRY

SAINT HIGHLIGHT:

SEPTEMBER 12–THE SERVANT OF GOD THOMAS PRICE: PRIEST AND MISSIONARY

Until 1908, the United States Catholic Church was a missionary church, in other words, supervised by the Propagation of the Faith headquartered in the Vatican. Three years later, today's saint-candidate, Fr. Price and three other men founded *The Catholic Foreign Missionary Society of America*, to spread the Good News to other people, notably in China. Today, Maryknoll consists of the Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers, the Maryknoll Sisters, and the Maryknoll Lay Missioners. The Maryknoll Affiliates are men and women who do educational mission service and immersion experiences within the Maryknoll Movement. Fr. Price was from North Carolina and met Fr. James Walsh of Boston in 1910, as both were trying to promote a missionary society. They presented their plans to the American bishops and traveled to Rome where Pope St. Pius X gave approval in 1911. The four Maryknoll priests then went to Hong Kong, China in 1918 and began their efforts in Yangjiang on the South China Coast. Fr. Price suffered from physical ailments and developed appendicitis in 1919, dying on the feast of the Most Holy Name of Mary, September 12, 1919. His body was exhumed and transferred to the cemetery at Maryknoll, New York. Fr. Price had a great devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He visited Lourdes, France and learned about the apparitions to St. Bernadette. He even renamed the location of the headquarters of the CFMSA from Sunset Hill to Mary's Knoll, giving rise to the name Maryknoll Missioners. Our Blessed Mother guides us to her son, Jesus. She intercedes for us and gives us her motherly love and protection. Our Lord Jesus gave her to us through his beloved disciple at the cross on Calvary when he said, "Woman, behold, your son" and "Behold, your mother" (Jn. 19:26-27). Let us pray for Fr. Price's canonization.



RCIA is for those:

Who wish to explore the teaching of the Catholic Church with the desire to become Catholic.


