WORDS OF MERCY

"OUR FIRST PERSONAL RESPONSE: WORSHIP" BY FR. BILL CREMERS

The first and primary way that we can respond to God's grace is by worship and adoration. The Catechism in paragraph 2096 states, "Adoration is the first act of the virtue of religion. To adore God is to acknowledge him as God, as the Creator and Savior, the Lord and Master of everything that exists, as infinite and merciful Love." This means that we worship God for who He is, not just for what He's done.

Think about how many things we can easily "worship" in our society: we're willing to become crazy and enthusiastic for sports teams, follow celebrities' actions very closely, and wear emblems of many organizations and groups. Do we share this same enthusiasm for our faith? Do we often find ourselves preoccupied by the things of this world rather than the Person of God? Whenever we come to prayer or Mass, this is our first response: not to "get something out of it" but to give our entire selves. This helps us to grow in faith, knowing that everything is a gift from God. Take some time this week to simply worship God, whether in speech or in silence, and give Him all the glory!


BOOK REVIEW

THE REED OF GOD BY CARYLL HOUSELANDER

Mary gave human nature to God. A vulnerable Christ suffers thirst, hunger, coldness of human hearts, betrayal, and death. The Incarnation begins the Passion. Mary understood God gave Christ to her and to humanity. Do parents understand their child is a gift to them but also to all? Christ was formed in her and after His birth she lived in Him. She didn't withdraw her gift of self when she couldn't protect Him from suffering but rather chose to suffer with her son.

When we ask the Holy Spirit to form Christ in us, Christ suffers in us and we suffer in Him. The mystical Christ is not beside us. We are in Him. He acts and suffers in all we do. When called to humility and charity, Christ in us must be humble and charitable. Christ wants to do this. Christ tells Pontius Pilate and us, "You have no power over Me, if it were not given to you from above" (John 19:11.) If we resent experiences or avoid

suffering like Peter we are discouraging
Christ from the Passion. When we ask,
"Why me?" contemplate Luke 24:26,
"Ought not Christ to suffer these things and so enter into His glory?" (pg. 64.)



SAINT HIGHLIGHT: JANUARY 13: ST. HILARY OF POITIERS, BISHOP & DOCTOR

Is Jesus God or not? That was key question of the fourth century and beyond that faced the Church. Some, with Arius, said that since Jesus was "begotten of the Father," that meant he was a creature, albeit the first creature of God. Others, with St. Athanasius, said that Jesus is "begotten, not made" and thus consubstantial with the God the Father. Today's saint helped hammer home the truth of who Jesus is by his opposition to the Arians and support of St. Athanasius, so much so he was called "Hammer of the Arians" and "Athanasius of the West." Born about A.D. 310 in Poitiers, France to pagan parents, St. Hilary received a good pagan education, later studying Scripture, thus resulting in his conversion to Christianity, along with his wife and daughter. He was elected bishop of Poitiers around A.D 350. Even though Arianism was condemned at the Council of Nicaea in A.D. 325 it was still in force throughout the empire, much due to the efforts of different emperors. So

St. Hilary attempted to get Arian bishops turned back to the true faith. He also wrote Emperor Constantius II to stop Arians persecuting orthodox Christians, which resulted in his exile in 356. After his exile in 361, he returned in Poitiers and continued to fight for the true understanding of the Trinity against the Arians. He died in 367.

Falsehoods and lies take a long time to die. They are like a many-headed hydra, which keeps sprouting new variations on lies that are condemned and refuted. We need to endure and persevere in living the Truth. St. Paul wrote: "No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us" (Rom. 8:37). 

FORMING OUR YOUTH

FEASTING ON OUR FAITH

LORI KISBY DIRECTOR OF YOUTH FORMATION

"As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased.'

Today we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord. As Catholics, we understand that when we were baptized, we became children of God as well as washed away our original sin. However, when Jesus asked John the Baptist to baptize him, Jesus did not really need to be baptized since he was born without sin. By being baptized, Jesus gave us an example and a sign of his true identity. He is God's son, the living presence of God on earth.

This would be a good day to talk to your kiddos about their own baptism even if you've done this before! Talk about who was there, how you decided who would be the godparents as well as the celebration that you had after Mass. You might even want to include some fun details. Maybe a sibling had the giggles during his/her sibling's baptism or a sibling dropped his/ her pacifier in the baptismal font during the blessed event! What a great time to share that Jesus is with us always, even when things don't go as perfectly planned. You might even want to show them what they wore as well as what they received at baptism.

After you visit with your children about their baptisms, take time to visit about similarities and differences with Jesus' baptism. You could read with your children about Jesus' baptism in Matthew 3:13-17.

Another way to visit with your youth about Jesus' baptism is to go to You Tube. One video by EWTN is called "My Time with Jesus – Baptism". If your children like music, this would be a great video for your family. If you have a preschooler, you might try "Bible Stories for Preschoolers: Baptism of Jesus for Kids". It is by Sharefaith Kids. There are other good videos to watch about Jesus' baptism.

Whatever you and your family do to celebrate Jesus' baptism, it can lead to some great family time as well as learning about Jesus!



First of all, we want to thank all of our parishioners and visitors who have taken an hour of their day to spend with Jesus in front of the Blessed Sacrament.



So, Monday through Friday, the hours are 6:00 am - 10:00 pm and Sunday after the Spanish mass at 1:00 pm until 10:00 pm, and reposing of the Blessed Sacrament at 10:00 pm. No 10:00 pm hour of Exposition. That doesn't mean that you can not make an hour at any other hour of the day. It just means that the Blessed Sacrament will only be exposed during these designated hours.



It has been increasingly difficult to expect the Deacons (who still work) to start their day well before 3:00 am to expose the Blessed Sacrament, and repose at 11:00 pm. 




