From the Detailed Rules for Monks by Saint Basil the Great, bishop

The ability to love is within each of us

"Love of God is not something that we can be taught. We did not learn from someone else how to rejoice in light or want to live, or to love our parents or guardians. It is the same, perhaps even more so, with our love for God: it does not come by another's teaching. As soon as the living creature (that is, man) comes to be, a power of reason is implanted in us like a seed, containing within it the ability and the need to love. When the school of God's law admits this power of reason, it cultivates it diligently, skillfully nurtures it, and with God's help brings it to perfection.

"For this reason, as by God's gift, I find you with the zeal necessary to attain this end, and you on your

part help me with your prayers. I will try to fan into flame the spark of divine love that is hidden within you, as far as I am able through the power of the Holy Spirit.

"First, let me say that we have already received from God the ability to fulfill all his commands. We have then no reason to resent them, as if something beyond our capacity were being asked of us. We have no reason either to be angry, as if we had to pay back more than we had received. When we use this ability in a right and fitting way, we lead a life of virtue and holiness. But if we misuse it, we fall into sin.


"This is the definition of sin: the misuse of powers given us by God for doing good, a use contrary to God's commandments. On the other hand, the virtue that God asks of us is the use of the same powers based on a good conscience in accordance with God's command.

"Since this is so, we can say the same about love. Since we received a command to love God, we possess from the first moment of our existence an innate power and ability to love. The proof of this is not to be sought outside ourselves, but each one can learn this from himself and in himself. It is natural for us to want things that are good and pleasing to the eye, even though at first different things seem beautiful and good to different people. In the same way, we love what is related to us or near to us, though we have not been taught to do so, and we spontaneously feel well disposed to our benefactors.

"What, I ask, is more wonderful than the beauty of God? What thought is more pleasing and satisfying than God's majesty? What desire is as urgent and overpowering as the desire implanted by God in a soul that is completely purified of sin and cries out in its love: I am wounded by love? The radiance of the divine beauty is altogether beyond the power of words to describe."

The passage above is from our "Office of Readings" from the Liturgy of the Hours for January 11. Take time to read it slowly and pray through each part. Ask God what he is saying to you through these words.

WORDS OF MERCY

"OUR PERSONAL RESPONSE: THANKSGIVING" BY FR. BILL CREMERS

We reflected last week on the nature of worship as giving God what is due to Him. What comes primary is who God is, not just what He does. However, by what He does for us, we can experience His goodness and grow in trust in Him! This is where thanksgiving comes in – we need to take time each and every day to be thankful to God.

One of my friends in seminary experienced the power of this in a particular way. He received a recommendation to begin every time of prayer with remembering five things that he was grateful to God for. As he began doing this, he shared that he experienced greater joy and freedom as he prayed, and this helped him trust in God's presence throughout the day. This also helped me grow in my own gratitude as I prayed!

Additionally, we can also learn to thank God "in advance" for what He will do. This can help us see that He does desire our fullest good, even if that may not be readily apparent to us. Therefore, we grow in trust and confidence in His power, and that makes us even more generous in sharing ourselves with others.


BOOK REVIEW

THE REED OF GOD BY CARYLL HOUSELANDER

After the Passover, Jesus chose to leave the company He was with and return to Jerusalem. Our Lady did not lose Christ. He chose to leave her as He would later for public ministry. Then she would wait outside in the crowd to see Him. She would follow Him to the cross where He was laid in her arms. Why did Christ leave her in these times? Mary and Jesus had absolute trust in each other. She led a perfect life in Christ by never denying God's will.

Her flesh, blood and will was in Christ and His suffering was hers. As Christ sensed being forsaken by God, Mary also suffered this experience. This common experience is purifying (page 97.) These sufferings allowed Mary's love to be purified. Mary offered her purity at the Temple for Purification. These purifications were unnecessary for her but they demonstrate her love for us. Her love for God and us provided the strength to suffer with and in Christ. We suffer the loss of

Mary's Divine child in different ways: spiritual aridity, loss of faith in the true Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist or desire for material things that dampen our awareness of Christ.

AINT HIGHLIGHT: JANUARY 19 – STS. MARIUS, MARTHA, AUDIFAX & ABACHUM Today we celebrate a family of martyrs! They were martyred in A.D. 270 in Rome. They buried other martyrs and then became the object of persecution and torture. Marius and his sons were beheaded, and their bodies burnt. Martha was drowned outside of Rome at a place now called Santa Ninfa. According to tradition, a Roman woman gathered the remains of the family and had them buried on her estate, which became a place of pilgrimage. They are inscribed in the Roman Martyrology, which is the official list of saints recognized by the Church. They are not on the General Roman Calendar because we only know with certainty their names and their place of burial. How is it that a whole family could be martyred? They were willing to die for what they believed in. They were witnesses to their faith in Jesus Christ and the hope of the Resurrection. Are our families prepared to do the same? Do we believe to the point of witnessing to our faith in Jesus Christ? Are we willing to live lives of heroic virtue? Do people see in us what others saw in our saints—a love of God which can't be denied or suppressed? Do we live the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy so that others cannot but see our

faith? We need to clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick and the imprisoned, give food and drink to the hungry and thirsty, bury the dead, instruct the ignorant, comfort the afflicted, warn the sinner, counsel the doubtful, bear wrongs patiently, forgive offenses patiently, and pray for the living and the dead. This is Jesus' command! Then everyone will know we are Christians, by our love! May Sts. Marius, Martha, Audifax, and Abachum guide us and pray for us!

FEASTING ON OUR FAITH

"Before I formed you in your mother's body I chose you. Before you were born I set you apart to serve me. I appointed you to be a prophet to the nations." Jeremiah 1:5

This week we will have 5 parishioners pilgrimage to Washington DC for the March for Life Rally. They will have an opportunity to stand up for their belief that before we were formed, our Heavenly Father chose us.

A popular children's movie is <u>Horton</u> <u>Hears a Who</u>. It is about an elephant who hears a cry coming from a speck of dust. Even though Horton can't see anyone on the speck, he decides to protect them and help them. One of the popular quotes from this movie is "After all, a person is a person, no matter how small."

As you pray for our parishioners who will be attending March for Life this week, you might want to read this book with your children. As you enjoy the book together, you could discuss how we started in our mother's womb very, very tiny. Share with your children how God knew you before your mother and father even knew you. Tell your children that we want to pray this week for everyone this week who, like Horton, wants to make sure that everyone, no matter how small, is protected.

You could even make some signs. One of the signs could be of Horton saying, "A person is a person, no matter how small." Another sign could be made by using your finger print dipped in paint or ink to make tiny feet representing a babies. You could put Horton's infamous phrase or simply say, "Choose Life". It may be a messy project but one that will be a fun way to teach your child about the importance of everyone's life, no matter how small.




