If the red light is on (and sometime the green as well) then we are in the confessional with a penitent. You may not enter. I hope this helps dispel any confusion.

"THE PILGRIMAGE OF LIFE" - FR. NICHOLAS MISHEK


For those of you who may not have been aware, I went on a pilgrimage recently. A pilgrimage is where someone travels to a holy site for spiritual renewal. I was blessed to be a spiritual director for a trip that visited two of the most well-known Marian Apparitions sites, Fatima, and Lourdes. Even though you were not able to join me on this wonderful journey I want to share some graces and experiences from this trip. Along the way we stopped at several sites along the way in Spain and I would love to share those experiences as well.

There is another reason to go on pilgrimage as well, to remind us of our true home. Christians would travel miles and spend their whole life savings to go and receive blessings from these sites. They knew that all their wealth could not obtain true fulfillment and happiness, only Christ could give that. By making these external sacrifices, they were showing their internal devotion and understanding that this life is a journey itself, a journey to the Kingdom of God. Making pilgrimages here can remind us of the greatest pilgrimage we are not right now, our life.

BOOK REVIEW

"THE PRACTICE OF THE PRESENCE OF GOD" – Brother Lawrence

The foundation of Br. Lawrence's spiritual life was to perform all his actions for love of God. When his thoughts wandered from God for a while he calmly

turned them back to God. He found himself more united to God in outward duties then when he left them for devotions or rest. In struggles, Br. Lawrence found great graces came forth from trust in God. It is impossible for God to deceive or to leave a soul suffering that is surrendered perfectly to God. God assured him no matter evil was allowed that God would give him the strength to persevere. Br. Lawrence had such perfect resignation to God that he was ready to lay down his life for love of God without fear. He counseled a friend to be faithful to daily duties and to deny yourself then you will experience God's immeasurable grace. He cautioned that many do not advance spiritually because they practice devotions and penances but neglect the love of God to which these should lead. This was also evident by the lack of virtue.

Formation Highlights

FOLLOW ME, AND I WILL MAKE YOU FISHERS OF MEN

OUR LADY OF FATIMA APPARITION

After receiving two parts of the secret, the children saw an Angel with a sword that appeared about to set the world on fire but Our Lady extinguished the flames as the Angel called out "Penance!" They saw the Holy Father, bishops, priests and religious climbing a mountain with a cross at the top. The children saw the Holy Father shot and others including priests, religious and lay people martyred. There have been double the number of martyrs in the twentieth century than in all previous centuries. On May 13, 1981, St. John Paul II miraculously survived an assassination at-



tempt. He attributed the miracle to Our Lady of Fatima and realized that Fatima is more relevant today than in 1917. He saw the world in the midst of a spiritual battle between good and evil with the result being either a civilization of love and trust in God or one of oppression and hatred based on contempt of God and His Church. In 1984, St. John Paul II consecrated the world to Our Lady. Pope Pius XII had consecrated the world to Our Lady in 1942 and Pope Francis' consecration specifically referenced Russia.

MARK YOUR CALENDAR: There will be a Mass at Calvary Cemetery at 9:00 am on Monday, May 30, which is Memorial Day. At 8:30 am, the Rosary will be prayed, then once the Rosary is concluded, the American Legion Color Guard will raise our flag, fire the salute and play taps. After this, Mass will begin. In case of Rain,



Mass will be held at St. Patrick Church. Refreshments and rolls will be provided after the Mass. As in the past, you may wish to bring a lawn chair for your use during Mass. Also, please try not to park along the interior roadways of the Cemetery. We would like these locations to be available to those who have a difficult time walking.



Saint Highlight: May 25 - St. Gregory VII. Pope

What happens when a ruler wants to take over the Church? Our saint today had that problem back in the eleventh century. Pope St. Gregory VII was pope at a time when the emperor was trying to control the Church through his investing of authority to bishops. If Emperor Henry IV could "hire" the bishops, then he could control them and rule them, and the Church, the way he ruled the empire. This corrupt use of power was called lay investiture, giving authority to leaders of the Church by lay rulers.

Pope St. Gregory VII was a reforming pope. Before he became pope he was an advisor to popes in their efforts to help the Church retain their religious rights and liberties against local rulers who wanted to make those bishops and abbots another part of the government. Gregory excommunicated Henry at one point, but Henry repented and Gregory lifted the excommunication. Whereupon, Henry consolidated his power, gathered his forces, arrested Gregory, and exiled him, then Gregory died.

The Church has the right to minister as she sees fit without restriction by the government. She has the right to teach the faith. She has the right to choose who may teach the faith and the right to require those teachers to be faithful to her teachings. She as the right to serve the poor without being required to follow the latest government dogmas on a new and unjust standard of equality. She has the right to speak out against injustices perpetrated by

the government. Pope St. Gregory VII would recognize ours as a time of struggle between Church and State. Pope St. Gregory VII, pray for us.



FEASTING ON OUR FAITH

"And after He had said these things, He was lifted up while they were watching, and a cloud took Him up, out of their sight." Acts 1:9

This Thursday we will celebrate the Ascension of our Lord. This is a holy day of obligation where we celebrate Jesus ascending into heaven on His own abilities. Before He ascended into heaven, Jesus told the apostles to wait for the Holy Spirit to come upon them. The ascension of Jesus is also the 2nd glorious mystery of the rosary.

How could you teach about the ascension to your children. A good place to start is to read Acts 1:9-12 or you could watch on You Tube "Catholic Kids Media: What is Ascension?"

Another way is to grab a balloon you have blown up for each child as well as a balloon filled with helium and head outside. Tell your children that after Jesus rose from the dead on Easter, he stayed on earth for 40 days. To help the children understand how long is 40 days, give each child a balloon that you blew up. Tell them that they must keep up their balloon for 40 seconds. If it touches the ground they are disqualified. Next, grab your balloon filled with helium. Ask your children what happens when you let go of the balloon. It will float in the air and it is fun to watch it float away until it totally disappears....we just have to let go. Tell your children that after 40 days, Jesus told His disciples that it was time to return to His Father in heaven and the Holy Spirit would come to be with them. The Bible tells us that Jesus lifted his hands and blessed His disciples. While He was blessing them, He was lifted up and was taken up into heaven "up, up and away." Let go of the balloon filled with helium and watch it float away, while you pray, "Dear Father in Heaven, thank you for sending your son, Jesus to die for our sins. We are so glad He rose from the dead and returned to you in Heaven. We love you. In your name we pray. Amen"


