

WELCOME HOME



THE ABUNDANT HARVEST BY FATHER WALTER NOLTE

"The feast of Pentecost celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energizing them to set about their mission of continuing the ministry of Jesus. The gospel reading is one of the post-resurrection appearances by Jesus when he breathed the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. The actual events of that first Pentecost are recorded in the book of Acts and are recalled in this week's first reading. The use of this postresurrection gospel account is a reminder that Jesus had already imbued the disciples with the Spirit but, as so often throughout his ministry, they were a bit slow to catch on to the significance of what he had done. It seems that they needed a more tangible experience to jolt them into action and Acts records the very physical experience of the Spirit entering their midst as a roaring wind before settling upon them as tongues of flame. Jesus had breathed the Spirit upon them but it took the roaring wind to make a real impression on the disciples. There are frequent references in the gospels to Jesus being "filled with the Spirit." It is this Spirit with which he was filled that he breathed upon his disciples; it is that same Spirit that we receive sacramentally in Confirmation.

For the weeks following the death of Jesus the disciples had lived in fear and confusion, not fully understanding what had happened and not really knowing what to do. When they realized that the Spirit Jesus had breathed upon them was really present and urging them to action they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of Jesus and continue to realize his message in the world.

We can sometimes regard Pentecost as the day the Holy Spirit came into the world. However, the Spirit had long been active in the world before this event. In fact, even the second verse of Genesis Chapter 1 tells us that the Spirit hovered over the waters. The Old Testament is filled with references in which "The Spirit of God came upon (him) with power" and the Spirit was evident at Jesus' baptism and throughout the gospels. Jesus is frequently described as being "filled with the Spirit." So, from the very beginning of creation the Spirit has moved in the world and continues to energize it today.


'Come, Holy Spirit' has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. It is a powerful, simple prayer that can be used at the outset of any significant undertaking or whenever you find yourself in need of inspiration." by Greg Sunter



BOOK REVIEW

"THE PRACTICE OF THE PRESENCE OF GOD" – BROTHER LAWRENCE

Br. Lawrence continually strove to do, say or think nothing that would displease God. This endeavor was a struggle for the first ten years but he would rise



repeatedly after faltering. These "internal adorations" of thinking of God throughout the day led to closer friendship with God and ultimately to having no will but God's will. Doing all out of love of God. He lamented that others were blind and to be pitied because they were happy with so little. "God has infinite treasure to bestow, and we take up with a little sensible devotion, which passes in a moment. Blind as we are, we hinder God and stop the current of His graces. But when He finds a soul penetrated with lively faith. He pours into it His graces and favors plentifully" (pg. 41.) Yet, we stop this flow of graces due to the little value we place upon them. We must work at our spiritual life to advance otherwise we go back. It is never too late to begin this practice that prepares us well for death and eternal life.



SAINT HIGHLIGHT: JUNE 9— ST. EPHREM. THE SYRIAN. DEACON AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

I bet you learned your ABCs by singing the Alphabet Song. You may also know songs that tell what the planets are. You may have difficulty with the Star-Spangle Banner but try reciting it! I imagine you will break into song within the first five lines. Why is that? Music appeals to a different part of the brain and memorization is a lot easier when put to music. Today's saint probably knew that. St. Ephrem, also known as the "Harp of the Holy Spirit," would write over 400 hymns to counter the heretical songs then prevalent.

St. Ephrem was born in AD 306 in Nisibis, Syria, now located in Turkey. He became a deacon but declined the priesthood. He died around AD 373 and was named Doctor of the Church in 1920. When Nisibis fell to the Persians he moved to Edessa and founded a school to teach orthodoxy against Arianism, Manicheism, Gnosticism, and other teachings and religions. He used poetry and music to bring people to Christ. For example, he wrote a

hymn about Mary, which also taught about the Incarnation:

"A wonder is Your mother: the Lord entered her, And became a servant; He entered able to speak And He became silent in her, He entered her thundering, And His voice grew silent; He entered Shepherd of all; A lamb He became in her; He emerged bleating." (113, L. Gambero)

The New Evangelization is a method of bring Christ's message to those who have already heard it. We need to speak, or as St.

Ephrem did, sing the Good News. We need to engage our brothers and sisters to stir their hearts in the joy and peace of Christ's love through the Holy Spirit's inspiration. Let us follow in St. Ephrem's "song" steps.



FEASTING ON OUR FAITH

"After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly." Acts 4:31

Today is a special day. Today is Pentecost. On this day, the disciples were gathered in one place and heard a sound from heaven like a mighty rushing wind. Because of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were able to preach and teach about Jesus like they had never done before. It is also the birthday of the Church!

In order to celebrate Pentecost, why not have a birthday party for the Church. To start your party, what would be a birthday party without balloons! Give your children balloons that have no air in them. Tell your kiddos that the balloons need someone to breathe some life into them. After you blow up a balloon a little bit, tell them that this is what the Holy Spirit did to the disciples. Blow up the balloon a little more and tell them that we need the Holy Spirit to help us keep filling up life into the church.

Finally, have some boxes wrapped as presents. If you want to put something inside the box, maybe put a bag of Flaming Hot Cheetos to remind them of the fire of the Holy Spirit or a kite to remind them of the mighty rushing wind or even some fruit snacks to remind them of the 12 Fruits of the Holy Spirit. Remind your kiddos that on Pentecost, the Holy Spirit gave the church the gifts of forgiveness, truth and a new life. Today, the Holy Spirit gives us the same gifts which helps us live a life pleasing to God. Happy birthday to our Church!




