


A NOTE FROM FR. JAMROG:

"SPAIN: ST. TERESA OF AVILA" - FR. NICHOLAS MISHEK

After Portugal, we travelled through Spain on our way to France. We stopped at several holy sites throughout Spain, and one of the stops included one of my favorite saints, St. Teresa of Avila. Being one of the few women given the title of Doctor of the Church, she is an expert on the spiritual life and reformed the Carmelite order into the powerhouse of prayer that it is today. She was a head-strong woman and when she put her mind to something, she got it done. For example, her father disapproved of her going to religious life, but she ran away and entered the Carmel without his approval and only after some time did her father accept her decision.


When she entered Carmel, Teresa lived a very comfortable life. They had relaxed their rule of life and because of her family's wealthy status she received many perks. She lived like that for 20 years and at the age of fifty she had a deeper conversion and was given a mission to reform the Order. God used her charm, wit, and determination to bring the Order back to its roots. It is never too late to accept God's call and change the world.

*LOVED AS I AM" – By Sr. Miriam James Heidland

Sr. Miriam's middle school years were typical – feelings of insecurity driving her to seek approval of others. Wearing a mask to hide her real feelings and



thoughts. The desire to belong is hardwired into us because God created us. To satisfy this need for relationship in ways that can't fulfill us (outside of God) creates harm and conflict. Although receiving catechesis and the sacraments she had a broken image of God – One who loves unconditionally. A view inspiring fear when one falls into sin and darkness. In watching a political show, one statement brought this reality into sharp focus, "If we don't know where we came from and where we are going, we will be easily manipulated" (pg. 3-4.) Why in a society with an abundant wealth and pleasures is there an increase of suicides, violence and addictions? Why was Jesus able to endure emotional and physical sufferings yet love in extraordinary circumstances? Jesus knew who He was. Jesus never had an identity crisis! Jesus shows us how to live as loved children of God - created in His image and likeness.



SAINT HIGHLIGHT: JUNE 13 - ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA, PRIEST AND DOCTOR

"Tony, Tony, come on down. Something's lost and can't be found." Grandmothers hand on this prayer for when we lose something. The "Tony" of this little prayer refers to St. Anthony of Padua, who is the patron saint of lost items. The reason for the prayer is because he prayed for the return of a Book of Psalms that was stolen from him. In the 13th century, books were very expensive due to the cost of reproducing them, which was by hand. The book was eventually returned to him.

St. Anthony is known for more than just this prayer. He was a Franciscan friar who became a powerful preacher and was even called the Evangelical Doctor. He was the first Franciscan to teach other Franciscans, with the permission of St. Francis of Assisi, and was renowned for his knowledge of Scripture and theology.

St. Anthony is also portrayed holding the child Jesus. There is a legend that Jesus appeared to St. Anthony in the form of a child. However, the image can also be a reminder that St. Anthony is a true follower of St. Francis, who loved Jesus so much to originate the first Christmas crèche. Another reason for the image is that St. Anthony presents the Incarnate Word of God, Jesus, to the whole world through his powerful preaching.

Losing objects is unfortunate and can even be devastating. But even more devastating is the loss of heaven. As the novena to St. Anthony says, "Let me rather lose all things than lose God, my supreme good. Let me never suffer the loss of my greatest treasure, eternal life with God. Amen."




