

“FRANCE: LOURDES” – FR. NICHOLAS MISHEK

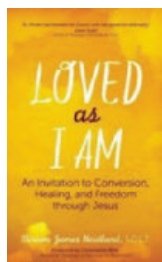
As we crossed the Pyrenees, we entered France and soon arrived at Lourdes. We stayed at a hotel right next to the site that was built by St. Bernadette’s family. While shops and hotels surround the apparition site, as soon as you enter the gates, you are welcomed with peace and serenity. Prayer and silence reign at Lourdes. We were blessed to learn more about St. Bernadette’s life and how God loves to take ordinary, seemingly unimportant people, and make them great. I was blessed to celebrate Mass at the grotto where Our Lady appeared and drink from the miraculous spring. Each of the three basilicas were beautiful in their own way and each night the candlelight procession inspired hope and joy.



The true VIPs at Lourdes are the sick. They are the only ones who can stay on the premise and over 4000 volunteers come from around the world (each week!) to care for them and help pilgrims. Our Lady of Lourdes reminds us to care for the physically and spiritually sick. To pray for sinner and treat the poor like you would treat Christ. The peace of Lourdes reflects the peace we experience in connecting with Christ, in prayer and in the poor. You do not have to go to France to find this peace, the Lord is waiting for us today.

The Calling of St. Matthew painting by Caravaggio with its beauty and stunning play of light mesmerized Sr. Miriam. Only the brilliant artist’s struggle with his broken humanity captivated her more. He was exiled for a fight ending in murder. How can God use a shattered vessel to gift the world with this beautiful masterpiece? *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines the human person as made in the image and likeness of God and is someone not something (CCC 355, 57.) Sometimes we fail to recognize our nobility in our self or others. The human person is not a means to someone’s end. Using another person adds to the brokenness of our world. Each person (even those choosing destructive behaviors) needs to be loved for who they are - not what they can provide. A religious sister’s simplicity and kindness that won children’s hearts silently challenged Sr. Miriam and her prideful ways. While watching a movie, this sister pointed out Jesus. The child sitting on her lap disagreed. That was not Jesus because Jesus was like her. When have we been mistaken for Jesus?

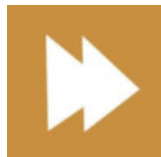

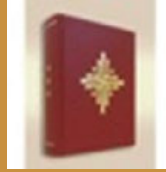

SAINT HIGHLIGHT: STS. PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

It is rare when a saint gets more than one day in the liturgical calendar. The Blessed Virgin Mary has numerous feast days throughout the year. St. John the Baptist has two days and St. Joseph has two days, but Sts. Peter and Paul have three each, including one day for the both of them. Their importance in the early Church forever links them together. They both died in Rome during the persecution of the emperor, Nero. Before that, they both worked together to bring Christianity to the Gentiles as shown in the Acts of the Apostles at the Council of Jerusalem. Both wrote epistles, Peter had two, Paul had 13. They were both apostles, Peter as one of the original twelve and Paul as one specially chosen by Jesus when he was on the road to Damascus. They are the main protagonists in the Acts of the Apostles, Peter in the first part and Paul in the second. Both Peter and Paul shared in the ministry of spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ. Peter was the leader of the entire Church community, the shepherd appointed by Jesus to watch over his flock. Paul was the founder of numerous communities in Asia Minor and Greece, including most of the places to whom he wrote epistles. When portrayed in art, Peter is often shown as holding keys, recalling the passage from Mt. 16:19—"I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven." This symbolized the role of Peter as pope, the one who is the visible sign of the unity of the Church. Paul is often portrayed in art with a sword, which is how he was martyred, or a book, symbolizing his letters in the New Testament. Both Peter and Paul are essential for us today. Peter's role as shepherd-pope reminds us of the importance of the Magisterium and the need to follow its teaching. Paul's role as missionary-letter writer reminds us of the importance of Scripture and Tradition in following Jesus. Both remind us of the importance of witnessing to the faith in Jesus. Since both were martyred in Rome, Peter, according to tradition on an upside-down cross, and Paul by beheading, this shows the primacy of Rome and her bishop, the pope, in leading the Church throughout the world.

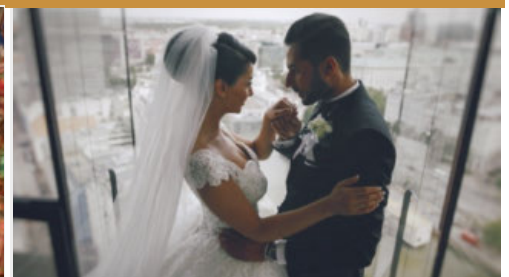

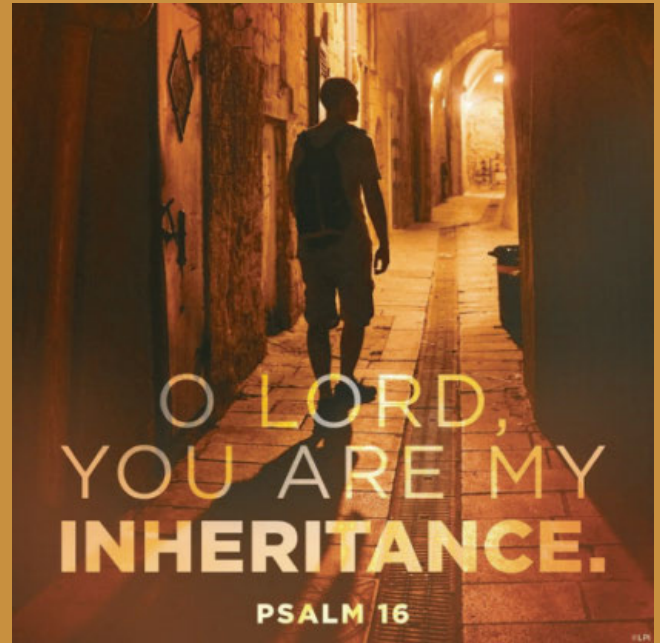

What I am hoping to do is get a group of ladies to take a couple months of the year to make the menus and call the ladies of the church to bring the items to be served those weeks of the month.

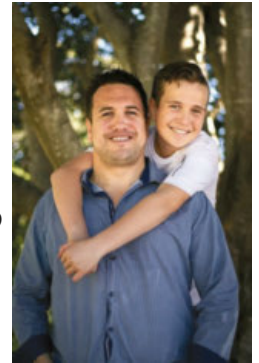
