
THE ABUNDANT HARVEST BY FATHER WALTER NOLTE

WORDS OF MERCY

POWER TO HEAL - TESTIFY - FR. BILL CREMERS

For Refiner's Fire, we are going through the series "Power to Heal" by Randy Clark. What follows is a paraphrased summary of the fourth section, "Testify" (study guide, page 61).



Just like a salvation testimony has the ability to charge an atmosphere with faith for salvation, miracle testimonies infuse an atmosphere with faith for healing. Healing and miracle stories remind people that the same God who was healed then can heal again today. Jesus is eternally unchanging and no respecter of persons. If he healed one person, He will do it for another!

We need to combine prayer and testimony in order to have the greatest impact in the pursuit of healing. Testimonies release power and build faith as they are shared. We were never meant to simply keep the stories of God's mighty acts to ourselves. Throughout the Bible, we are constantly told to remember and to tell. This includes everything from the supernatural work of salvation to the healing miracles He releases to us and through us.

Take some time to pray and think: what is a testimony you can share with others about healing, faith, miracles, etc.? Who can you share this with during this week?

*LOVED AS | AM" – By Sr. Miriam James Heidland

When Sr. Miriam discovered she was adopted, her parents asked that she keep it secret. The discovery and the request for secrecy had a great impact on her. Her



healing from rejection and abandonment began by recognizing that for God no pregnancy is unplanned. God created her and desired her to live. She was not an accident or unwanted by God. God never intended sorrow and suffering in the world but it entered through sin. If we reject belief in sin, we still must live with its consequences: envy, hatred, greed,... In Crossing the Threshold, St. John Paul II defined original sin as an attempt to abolish the fatherhood of God by placing doubt into the minds of Adam and Eve as to God's goodness (pg. 38.) They tried to provide for their desires themselves and were reduced to living in fear and shame. How many times do we reach out to grab what we desire because we lack trust for God to give us what is best? We make ourselves into orphans needing to find our way in this world.

HOW MUCH IS THE MASS WORTH?: Years ago, in a town in Luxembourg, a Captain of the Forest Guards was talking to a butcher. A poor old lady entered the shop and asked the butcher, "Could you please give me a little meat?". "Only a little meat," he asked, "but how much are you going to pay me?" The poor woman explained, "I am sorry I have no money, but I will hear Mass for you!" The butcher and the captain did not care much about the Catholic religion, and they began to scoff at the old woman's answer. "All right, then," said the butcher. "You go out and hear Mass for me, and when you come back, I'll give you as much meat as the Mass is worth." The woman left the shop and returned later. She approached the counter, and the butcher seeing her said, "All right then, we'll see!" He took a piece of paper and wrote on it, "I heard a Mass for you." He then placed the paper on the scale and a thin bone on the other side, but nothing happened! Next, he placed a piece of meat instead of the bone, but still the paper was heavier. Both men were beginning to feel ashamed of what they had said. The butcher then placed a large piece of meat on the scale, but still the paper was heavier! The butcher was shocked and examined the scales, but found they were all right! "What do you want, my good woman? Must I give you a whole leg of lamb?" He placed the whole leg of lamb on the balance, but the paper still outweighed the meat! A larger piece of meat was put on, but again the paper remained heavier! The butcher was converted on the spot and promised to give the poor lady some meat every day. The Captain stood shocked and became a great lover of daily Holy Mass. SAINT HIGHLIGHT: JULY 14 - ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA, VIRGIN

Is there a Native American saint? Yes, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, also known as Lily of the Mohawks or Flower of the Algonquins, is the only Native American to be canonized. She was born of a Mohawk father and a Christian Algonquin mother in 1656. She was orphaned at the age of four and eventually converted to Christianity at 19 under the influence of the Jesuits who were missionaries in French Canada. She also took a vow of virginity, which was extremely unusual.

She underwent other hardships as well. Because she did not work on Sundays, she was not permitted to eat. She was in danger in her village because she was Christian. She left it and walked 200 miles to a Christian Native American village near Montreal. She also survived smallpox, but with half her sight and severe disfigurement. However, she accepted her crosses and spent long hours in prayer, charity, and penance.

Do we accept our crosses in our ordinary lives? Let us listen to St. Kateri and follow her example: "I am not my own; I have given myself to Jesus. He must be my only love. The state of helpless poverty that may befall me if I do not marry does not frighten me. All I need is a little food and a few pieces of clothing. With the work of my hands I shall always earn what is necessary and what is left over I'll give to my relatives and to the poor. If I should become sick and unable to work, then I shall be like the Lord on the cross. He will have mercy on me and help me, I am sure."




