

WELCOME HOME



THE ABUNDANT HARVEST BY FATHER WALTER NOLTE

This weekend we welcome Reverend Nghia Cao, a missionary priest for Cross Catholic Outreach. He is from Vietnam and has been in the United States for 37 years. He is a Redemptorist priest of the Denver Province and was ordained in 2005. We are blessed to have him with us this weekend to share his experiences of working in the fields of the Lord.

Parish leaders from Saint Charles Borromeo, Saint Leo, Saint Lawrence, Saint Rose, and Saint Patrick continue to meet as a Family Pastoral Planning Team [FPPT] to discuss what parish life will look like for us as a "Family Group" of parishes. We have been tasked with making plans reflecting the projected reality that in less than ten years we will have only two priests to minster to the needs of the members of all five parishes. Our three parishes have been working on this since we joined together three years ago. So, we have already experienced

some of the necessary changes, however, some adjustments will still need to made for us to be able to meet the guidelines set by Phil Lasalla and his team from the chancery office of the Archdiocese. Our goal, after communication to all five parishes, is to begin implementing our plan in phases starting January 1, 2023 and concluding January 1, 2024. A letter outlining the plan will be mailed to members of all five parishes prior to a Family Group meeting on October 1. [see below]

- Facilities Assessment: We are in the completion stage of a facilities assessment for our parish. More information to follow once the document and analysis is completed. We are looking to have a town hall discussion during the first part of November.


FEEDING THE HUNGRY

WORDS OF MERCY

POWER TO HEAL - WORDS OF KNOWLEDGE-FR. BILL CREMERS

For Refiner's Fire, we are going through the series "Power to Heal" by Randy Clark. What follows is a paraphrased summary of the fifth section, "Faith" (study guide, page 149).

It is important for you to know what kind of faith someone has so you can pray for them most effectively. When you know what level of faith a person is at, you can work with them to bring them to a place where they could receive healing. Here are four possible levels of faith:

- 1. Very weak faith: "If you can do anything" The beginning of the seed of breakthrough indicates some obstacles to belief. However, this honesty is an open door for God to work and demonstrate that He certainly can do anything! Be compassionate and understanding, sharing from your own faith.
- 2. Some faith: "If you are willing" Many people don't think that God would want to heal them, thinking mainly of the sovereignty of God. Let people know that God does want to heal, sharing testimonies of how He has already done so!
- 3. Great faith: "If I can" (i.e. woman touching Jesus' cloak if I can touch Him, I will be healed) Faith is often spelled r-i-s-k, and those who are willing to take risks or look foolish are often the ones who are open to God's healing work. Help people position themselves to receive healing from God and to be encouraged in their faith.
- 4. Reckless faith: "I can't, but he can" Bartimaeus cried out recklessly to the Lord asking for healing and grace, and Jesus heard him, asking him what he wanted to receive. This is very encouraging and is our own model of faith!

EMHC AND LECTOR TRAINING - DATE CHANGE!

Is God asking you to serve as an EMHC or Lector? If you have received all Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) and are a practicing Catholic in good standing in the Church, then contact the parish office. High school students must be beginning at least their junior year. The archdiocese video presentation will be on August 31st, Wednesday at 6:30 pm in Mary's Room at the Church. Those attending will complete an on-line form for the Archdiocese. A practice session will be held in Tuesday, Sept. 20th at 6:30 pm in the church. Mandation will be celebrated at the 10am St. Patrick Mass on October 9th.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) – BEGINS WEDNESDAYS STARTING SEPTEMBER 7TH 6:30PM-8:30 PM IN MARYS ROOM AT THE CHURCH

RCIA is for those who wish to explore the teaching of the Catholic Church with the desire to become Catholic; are either baptized or unbaptized, but are not Catholic; are 19 years and older. RCIA is a journey of faith: It is the process by which men and women enter the Catholic Church; it is a journey in that you are paired with a Catholic sponsor to help guide you along the way; you will join other candidates and sponsors in the form of weekly classes that begin in September, culminating with the entry into the Catholic Church the night before Easter. RCIA is about Sacrament: Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion) are typically celebrated at the Easter Vigil Mass. At this time, those participating in RCIA become full members of the Catholic Church. SAINT HIGHLIGHT: AUGUST 10— ST. LAWRENCE, DEACON AND MARTYR

"Bring me the treasure of the Church!" This was the charge made by the prefect of Rome to St. Lawrence in A.D. 258. As first among the seven deacons of Rome, St. Lawrence was responsible for the goods of the Church, its treasury and monies, as well as distributing alms to the poor. Thus it was most likely that he be the one to hand over (*traditore*—from which we get the word "traitor") the wealth of the Church. He requested three days to gather the wealth. In that time he distributed all that he could to the poor of the Church and on the third day presented the true wealth of the Church to the prefect: the poor, the suffering, the blind and crippled, saying that these were the treasures of the Church. It is said that he declared to the prefect: "The Church is truly rich, far richer than your emperor.... This is the Church's treasure." With that, according to legend, he was sentenced to death by being grilled alive on a gridiron. Jesus tells us in the Sermon on the Mount: "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be (Mt. 6:21). The Church's treasure is Jesus, himself. And where do we find Jesus? In our families, in our neighbors, but especially in the poor and downtrodden. "Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours" (Lk 6:20). Moreover, Pope Francis reminds us about poverty and the connection to Jesus when he spoke on June 7, 2013 to students from Jesuit schools in Italy and Albania: "You can't speak of poverty in the abstract: that doesn't exist. Poverty is the flesh of the poor Jesus, in that child who is hungry, in the one who is sick, in those unjust social structures. Go forward; look there upon the flesh of Jesus. But don't let well being rob you of hope, that spirit of well being that, in the end, leads you to becoming a

nothing in life. Young persons should bet on their high ideals, that's my advice. But where do I find hope? In the flesh of Jesus who suffers and in true poverty. There is a connection between the two." Jesus is our treasure. We are the Body of Christ. JOURNEY OF FAITH: SUMMER ACTIVITY

Families of Parishes recently received their all-important Journey of Faith pastoral planning template. For the next several months, Family Pastoral Planning Teams will gather to complete the required information in the comprehensive document. Archbishop Lucas recently grouped the archdiocese's 134 parishes into 33 Families of Parishes. This bold move was in response to current realities: drastic declines in Sunday worship, shifting demographics, and

decreasing availability of priests. Family Pastoral Planning Teams submit plans to Archbishop Lucas by November 15. There is a lot to think about, discuss, and decide.

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." Philippians 4:6

It's hard to believe that students will be starting back to school this week or next Monday. Many people have commented that this summer has gone by fast and they aren't kidding! With the start of school, students, teachers and parents may be feeling a little anxious. Here are some ideas from Focus on the Family to help everyone as school begins.

The week before school begins, say a "commissioning prayer over your children. A week before school begins, remind your children that God has called them to be missionaries in their school. On the way to school, pray for them to be good ambassadors of Christ on their mission field. Before school begins, ask your children to choose one verse that he/she could read every night before bed and another verse to read every morning before school. If your child is particularly shy, maybe Isaiah 41:13 or James 4:7.

Find a wake-up routine. If your child is not a morning person, maybe set your alarm for a half-hour before you need to start getting ready. During that half hour, go to your child's room or carry them to your room. Take that time to snuggle together while talking quietly or read together. Your reading might include the day's Bible passage and a message. When it is time, everyone get up together.

As your child goes off to school, send him with a "mission." For example, you might ask him to tell a friend one kind thing today or invite someone who doesn't have many friends to sit with him at lunch.

Finally, when you drop your child off at school, give him a focused perspective about who God calls him to be. An example might be to teach your child what "integrity" means...doing what is right even when no one is looking. Ask your child, "How will you return to me?" when you drop him off. His answer would be, "With integrity, Mom!" The good-bye ritual could be the same every day. By emphasizing this character quality, you help your child connect who he/she is at school with who he/she is at home.
