AWORD

Saying Yes to God

Lent is a time when we feel our distance from God. We realize once again in our heart of hearts how deep is our need for Him. Lent is the time when many will be thinking about what to give up for Lent. Some people will focus on will-power and give up chocolate or sweets. Others might focus on the moral life and try to give up a vice or bad habit. Some will do something spiritual such as attending daily Mass, saying the rosary, or praying in the mornings.

But in a Marian sense, there is a better way! Instead of picking and choosing, we can cede control of what to do penitentially for Lent by finding ways to <u>say yes to God</u>. This approach more directly benefits our soul because the direction of the source is God Himself. He knows perfectly what is needed for life in Christ.

We first say yes to God by accepting and being grateful for our current circumstances, and by seeing in them the mysterious movement of Divine Providence. It is the hand of God moving intimately in our life. Gratitude and saying yes to God are roommates, even when we cannot see the fuller context of where God might be leading us. We simple trust in God's goodness and bottomless love for us.

Saying yes to God means doing so today, here and now, in the immediate situation in which we find ourselves. There is no need for looking back, no need for asking "what if" or "if only." We may carry wounds, brokenness, shame, or sadness from the past (buried in the present) but we give them over into God's care—for healing, for forgiveness, and for renewal.

We often say yes to God with an asterisk. We prefer it to be on our own terms. We like to be in control and to filter out anything that forces us out of our comfort zone. Yet that is exactly God's purpose. Saying yes to God may not always be convenient, but it will lead to the greatest fruitfulness (though not always apparent to us). There is something in every experience God brings to us that can lead to greater holiness and peace, if only we embrace it as a gift from His heart to ours.

Saying yes to God often leads to the cross, but also to great freedom and consolation. Perhaps this is the secret of the saints simply saying yes to God, ardently and gratefully. Saying yes to God will take us into wild new vistas in our relationship with Him! O Lord, we want to say yes, yes, yes to You. Grant us the courage and love to do so.



DAILY PRAYER THIS WEEK



This first week of Lent is the time we are given to begin our Lenten patterns, to re-align our priorities, and to make use of more reflective time each day. It is a time to fast and abstain from those things that hinder our relationship with the Lord, and to consider being more generous to the poor.

As we make this beginning, we are offered some beautiful instruction about what is expected of us. These readings describe a very Jesus-like love. We can examine our care for the hungry, thirsty, naked, sick or imprisoned. We can reflect upon who in our lives needs us and whether we love them as we want to be loved. And we can look at the deeper things, like our anger or how we treat others, and our response to those who are our "enemies." What is most important this first week, beyond a sharper examination of our consciences, is to see this as a time for God's grace to work in us. So, it is a time to ask for the graces we are starting to see we need.

Each morning this week we can ask our Lord to help us focus this day on the neediest people around us. We can ask to begin new patterns this week by practicing special charity and love, where I haven't been so generous or kind before. The key is to ask and to be very specific. Then, throughout the day, we can keep talking with our Lord, in the "background" about these graces we ask for and the concrete circumstances we find ourselves in. It is in the particular events of our day that we will become attentive to our need for our Lord's presence and grace, as well as our need to choose a new pattern. Each evening, we can briefly review the day and recognize some missed opportunities to connect with the Lord or take advantage of a situation here or there, but most of all, we can thank the Lord for the moments of connection that have begun our Lenten journey.

One resource that may be helpful is the <u>Praying Lent</u> website with reflections on how we can set a different tone for our Lent by making choices about how we want our Lent to be and what we want God to do in us this Lent.

SAINT OF THE DAY

March 7

Sts. Perpetua and Felicity d. 203

"When my father in his affection for me was trying to turn me from my purpose by arguments and thus weaken my faith, I said to



him, 'Do you see this vessel—water pot or whatever it may be? Can it be called by any other name than what it is?' 'No,' he replied. 'So also I cannot call myself by any other name than what I am—a Christian.'"

So writes Perpetua: young, beautiful, well-educated, a noblewoman of Carthage in North Africa, mother of an infant son and chronicler of the persecution of the Christians by Emperor Septimius Severus.

Perpetua's mother was a Christian and her father a pagan. He continually pleaded with her to deny her faith. She refused and was imprisoned at 22.

In her diary, Perpetua describes her period of captivity: "What a day of horror! Terrible heat, owing to the crowds! Rough treatment by the soldiers! To crown all, I was tormented with anxiety for my baby.... Such anxieties I suffered for many days, but I obtained leave for my baby to remain in the prison with me, and being relieved of my trouble and anxiety for him, I at once recovered my health, and my prison became a palace to me and I would rather have been there than anywhere else."

Despite threats of persecution and death, Perpetua, Felicity–a slavewoman and expectant mother–and three companions, Revocatus, Secundulus and Saturninus, refused to renounce their Christian faith. For their unwillingness, all were sent to the public games in the amphitheater. There Perpetua and Felicity were beheaded, and the others killed by beasts.

Felicity gave birth to a daughter a few days before the games commenced.

Perpetua's record of her trial and imprisonment ends the day before the games. "Of what was done in the games themselves, let him write who will." The diary was finished by an eyewitness.

Reflection Persecution for religious beliefs is not confined to Christians in ancient times. Consider Anne Frank, the Jewish girl who with her family, was forced into hiding and later died in Bergen-Belsen, one of Hitler's death camps during World War II. Anne, like Perpetua and Felicity, endured hardship and suffering and finally death because she committed herself to God. In her diary, Anne writes, "It's twice as hard for us young ones to hold our ground, and maintain our opinions, in a time when all ideals are being shattered and destroyed, when people are showing their worst side, and do not know whether to believe in truth and right and God."

St. Perpetua is the Patron Saint of Widows and Mothers of Deceased Sons.
