AWORD

Something for Something

Do we sometimes view our relationship with God as transactional in nature? Something that we have to do to earn His attention or love? Do we suspect God will not like us unless we do this or that in order to please Him? Then maybe He will look kindly upon us and grant us peace or comfort. But where is the trust? When we relate to God in the way of a contract, our faith will remain fragile and lacking in strength.

Everything changes when we view God as

someone who loves us, has always loved us, and will love us no matter what we do. There is nothing we can do that will make God not love us. There is never a time that He hasn't been head-over-heels in love with us individually and at every moment. *"For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Mt 5:45)*. Once we begin to accept, humbly and gratefully, that we are deeply loved, then we can relax and dwell in it, knowing that we belong to Him. We are His beloved son or daughter. God is always inviting us into the closest possible relationship with Him.

We see this in the parable of the Prodigal Son. With a profound immaturity and lack of gratitude, the son asks his father for his inheritance. The father gives it to him and the son goes off to live a life of dissipation and decadence. After a while, his money runs out and he is reduced to tending swine. The son "comes to himself" and decides to return home and at least work as a hired servant for his father.

Jesus tells us, "While he [the son] was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him." Before his son could hardly make an apology, the father called for a feast and celebration. "This son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and now been found."

This is the lavishness of the Lord's love and compassion for us. We have but to lift our eyes and turn our gaze upon Him. There is nothing to earn. There is no need for preening or putting on makeup—He already knows us deeply. There is no quid pro quo. We have but to humbly live in His love, and most importantly, offer the only true gift that we can make to Him, to love Him with our whole heart, mind, soul, and strength. We enter into an intimacy that will transform us and overflow into everyone around us. Then the celebration begins.

DAILY PRAYER THIS WEEK



The gospels this week make it very clear toward the end of the week that Jesus faced opposition that couldn't accept who he is. We see that Jesus comes to lay down his life that we might live. So, this week of Lent is an important time for us to ask ourselves if there are any parts of our hearts, any of our patterns,

that oppose Jesus and his desire to give us life. This kind of honesty can transform our lives. It can allow the grace of God to bring reconciliation and healing we might not have imagined.

Even if it hasn't been easy to get really engaged with Lent so far, we can still make a beginning, even now. The key is openness and desire. If we can feel any attraction, any sign that the Lord is possibly drawing us, then the Lord can work with us - no matter what resistance or fear we might also be experiencing. All we have to do is act out of these desires and simply ask the Lord for the grace to help us be more honest and more open to what he is offering us. For example, we can ask for the grace to examine our consciences more thoroughly. We could try a different approach to facing any resistance we might have to the Lord's working in us. We might not commit the big sins, but we may not have examined what we fail to do. Who am I failing to love, to forgive, to be generous to? From whom am I withholding affection, care, reconciliation? Where can I live more honestly, with more integrity? How might I proactively change my own personal patterns of escape with patterns of care for others?

It is a time of grace when we can experience moments of "recognition," or self-understanding. But it is *not* a grace to beat up on ourselves or become self-absorbed in our own guilt. It *is* grace to feel grateful to the Lord for showing us obstacles to the life he is offering us. It is grace to feel our spirits lighten as we feel drawn to greater freedom and peace. It is incredible grace when we are drawn to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This week, let us give thanks to the Lord who deeply desires our greater freedom and joy. As we go to bed each night, let us thank the Lord for what we saw that day and renew our desires for the next day of grace.

SAINT OF THE DAY

St. Turibius of Mogrovejo Nov. 16, 1538 - March 23, 1606

Together with Rose of Lima, Turibius is the first known saint of the New World, serving the Lord in Peru, South America, for 26 years.



Born in Spain and educated for the law, he became so brilliant a scholar that he was made professor of law at the University of Salamanca and eventually became chief judge of the Inquisition at Granada. He succeeded too well. But he was not sharp enough a lawyer to prevent a surprising sequence of events.

When the archdiocese of Lima in Peru required a new leader, Turibius was chosen to fill the post: He was the one person with the strength of character and holiness of spirit to heal the scandals that had infected that area.

He cited all the canons that forbade giving laymen ecclesiastical dignities, but he was overruled. Turibius was ordained priest and bishop and sent to Peru, where he found colonialism at its worst. The Spanish conquerors were guilty of every sort of oppression of the native population. Abuses among the clergy were flagrant, and he devoted his energies and suffering to this area first.

He began the long and arduous visitation of an immense archdiocese, studying the language, staying two or three days in each place, often with neither bed nor food. Turibius confessed every morning to his chaplain, and celebrated Mass with intense fervor. Among those to whom he gave the Sacrament of Confirmation was the future Saint Rose of Lima, and possibly the future Saint Martin de Porres. After 1590, he had the help of another great missionary, Francis Solanus, now also a saint.

Though very poor his people were sensitive, dreading to accept public charity from others. Turibius solved the problem by helping them anonymously.

Reflection

The Lord indeed writes straight with crooked lines. Against his will, and from the unlikely springboard of an Inquisition tribunal, this man became the Christlike shepherd of a poor and oppressed people. God gave him the gift of loving others as they needed it.


