
## SUNDAY, APRIL 3rd, at 2:00 p.m. or MONDAY, APRIL 4th, at 6:30 p.m.

#### **A Lenten Prayer**

O Lord, come down and visit Your people. Show Your face to us and we will be renewed and converted. Show forth your glory and we shall never again depart from You. Heal our brokenness, forgive our many sins and failings, bring peace to our disconsolate hearts. Fill the depths of our soul with your Presence. Let us know of your compassion and love for us. Our hearts cry out for You but You remind us to have faith. We cast about seeking for You but You encourage patience. We long for Your touch but in Your silence, we sense a word to endure. We grow weary of our constant failings, our slipping into judgmental or unkind responses, into cynicism, sarcasm, or envy. Save us from the weight of our selfishness. Bridge the distance between ourselves and You.

We are a weak and fickle people, easily given over to distraction and shiny things. Come and put Your seal upon our heart, sear it with your Holy Spirit that we may never again wander from You. Your people hunger for Your touch, a glimpse of Your mantle—do not abandon us to ourselves. Let your light shine into our darkness. Renew and recreate our inner being that we may know of Your closeness and kindness. In the stillness of our sleep, visit our soul and leave a shadow of Your passing. Free us from the suffocating blanket of material comforts, the deadening stupor of a safe routine, the vacillation of a rootless heart.

Forgive our many transgressions against You. Make our souls to be clean and pure just as they were at creation. Like the lost sheep, seek out Your lost children and bring them back to You. We often stumble about in darkness and confusion. Let Your light illuminate our pathways and guide us to our true homeland with You. Give us new eyes that we may see Your hand at work among us, and to be consoled by seeing Your face shining through the eyes of our neighbor.

Do You not see how Your people struggle? Yet do put our trust in You and draw comfort in Your words. Yet do we hope in You for we have nowhere else to turn. Yet even in our discouragement, we turn to You to save us. For the gift of the Confessional, we thank You. For your forgiveness and to know we are loved, a wondrous gratitude. Our hearts long for the gift of absolution, to be embraced like the Prodigal Son by his father. Even so, we will praise You still. We know Your ways are not our ways, and that Your designs are inscrutable. In all things, glory be to You O Lord!

#### DAILY PRAYER THIS WEEK

This is the last full week of Lent. We can feel the conflict and struggle developing in the readings. As we read about the drama that surrounded Jesus' last days on earth and reflect upon its meaning, we ex-

perience how the drama that is going in our own hearts is more intense the closer we get to the end of Lent. The Spirit of the Lord is really trying to help us be more open and more free, to receive the graces our Lord wants to offer us.

There is another spirit that is fighting just as hard to distract us, discourage us, and prevent us from being open and attentive to God's gifts. The closer we get to the mystery of our Lord's passion, death and resurrection for us, the more we can experience struggle. If I experience myself somewhat "at war" with myself, then these are very important days to keep deliberately asking our Lord to help me.

It is also a great time to begin to prepare to renew our baptismal promises at Easter. We can reject the unloving choices we've made, all that is unjust, dishonest, disrespectful and violent. We want to refuse to be mastered by empty promises. Declaring our desire for freedom is a great preparation to receive this great gift. If we are <u>celebrating the Scrutinies</u> with the RCIA candidates and catechumens, this is a wonderful time to pray for them as well, for their protection from the evil one in the last days of their journey.

If we have developed the habit of naming a desire the first thing each morning, and carrying on a conversation with our Lord in the brief background moments of the day, we are already comfortable with letting the Word or the Season interact with the concrete events of the week. This way of finding intimacy with our Lord, through our daily interaction even in a very busy life - is so appropriate for the Fifth Week of Lent. We can discover areas that are still resistant to God's grace. We can ask for help to practice new ways of being free, or new ways of loving. We can find ways to make financial sacrifices to give to the poor this week.

Each night this week, we can give thanks. The closer we get to celebrating Holy Week and the events that brought us our salvation, each of us can express our gratitude, realizing this was all for me.

#### SAINT OF THE DAY



Saint Isidore of Seville C. 560 - April 4, 636

The 76 years of Isidore's life were a time of conflict and growth for the Church in Spain. The Visigoths had invaded the land a cen-

tury and a half earlier, and shortly before Isidore's birth they set up their own capital. They were Arians—Christians who said Christ was not God. Thus, Spain was split in two: One people (Catholic Romans) struggled with another (Arian Goths).

Isidore reunited Spain, making it a center of culture and learning. The country served as a teacher and guide for other European countries whose culture was also threatened by barbarian invaders.

Born in Cartagena of a family that included three other sibling saints—Leander, Fulgentius and Florentina—he was educated by his elder brother, whom he succeeded as bishop of Seville.

An amazingly learned man, he was sometimes called "The Schoolmaster of the Middle Ages" because the encyclopedia he wrote was used as a textbook for nine centuries. He required seminaries to be built in every diocese, wrote a Rule for religious orders, and founded schools that taught every branch of learning. Isidore wrote numerous books, including a dictionary, an encyclopedia, a history of Goths, and a history of the world—beginning with creation! He completed the Mozarabic liturgy, which is still in use in Toledo, Spain. For all these reasons, Isidore has been suggested as patron of the Internet. Several others—including Anthony of Padua—also have been suggested.

He continued his austerities even as he approached age 80. During the last six months of his life, he increased his charities so much that his house was crowded from morning till night with the poor of the countryside.

**Reflection** Our society can well use Isidore's spirit of combining learning and holiness. Loving, understanding and knowledge can heal and bring a broken people back together. We are not barbarians like the invaders of Isidore's Spain. But people who are swamped by riches and overwhelmed by scientific and technological advances can lose much of their understanding love for one another.

St. Isidore of Seville is the Patron Saint of Internet users and Computers users.







## **RENEW** your commitment to Parish Stewardship

During the Lenten Season set aside some special time to ask God how you should serve him by using your gifts he has bestowed on you with others.

#### Pillar - Service - Love in Action

"Amen I say to you, whatever you did to the least of my brothers, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40). This scripture was one of Mother Teresa's favorites. Each time she picked up a poor and hungry child, she knew she was ministering to Christ. While we may not view ourselves as saints, we too are called to such heroic service right within our own community. As Mother Teresa said, "To be a saint is not the privilege of a few, but the duty of everyone."
