A WORD

After the Empty Tomb, What Next?

The light of Easter cascades like a torrent into this world, but it happens only through the lives of believers. We have entered into the mysteries of Lent and Holy Week. We have walked with Jesus on the way to Calvary. We have stood at the foot of the Cross on Good Friday and gazed upon the creator of the universe as He died. Then came the Resurrection on Easter morning—our Lord walks among His people again.

Where do we go from the empty tomb? What is next as we return to the routine of daily life? How do we express, deeply and authentically, the Resurrection in our daily schedule? Fortunately, on the very day of the Resurrection, our Lord laid out the essential direction and pattern of the life of a disciple. It is captured in the story of two disconsolate travelers making their way to Emmaus, a small town about seven miles west of Jerusalem. They are discussing the events of the past couple days, of Jesus' arrest, His suffering, and His death on the cross.

A fellow traveler joins them, but they do not realize it is really Jesus. How often has Jesus walked with us and we knew it not—especially in times of sorrow, darkness, loneliness, fear, or confusion? Then Jesus proceeds to explain the Old Testament scriptures, showing where they spoke of His coming. Can this be the first Bible study?

When they arrived at Emmaus in the evening, they begged their newfound friend to remain with them. At the meal, He broke the bread, blessed it, and gave it to them. As He did so, their eyes were opened and they recognized their fellow traveler to be Jesus Himself. The two travelers rushed back to Jerusalem to share their joy with the other disciples—they had seen the resurrected Jesus!

The mission of Jesus culminated in an empty tomb. His physical journey on earth has ended, but ours continues. And it begins anew every morning as we unite with Him in a closer and deeper relationship. Since the consolation of His Easter-presence will pass and may become less tangible, so now are the eyes of faith needed. The Lord is no longer "out there." Now He dwells within, and desires a greater possession of our heart and soul.

The road of discipleship stretches before us. It is in discovering our Lord, in faith as He walks with us throughout life. It is in finding Him in the Scriptures. It is gazing upon Him, depths upon depths, in the Eucharist. And, it is in gathering around His presence in the community, especially in the parish. The Empty Tomb is an invitation to joy!



DAILY PRAYER THIS WEEK



We now begin a celebration of the **Resurrection of our Lord** for the next seven weeks - when we mark the **Ascension** forty days after Easter and culminating in the celebration of **Pentecost** on the fiftieth day after Easter. This week, we begin that deepening realiza-

tion of, and reflection upon, the meaning of the gift of life we have received in God's raising Jesus from the dead so that we might have eternal life.

Just as it is difficult for many of our cultures to face the reality of death, it is difficult to accept the reality of life after death. St. Paul invites us to live in this passing world with our hearts set on the world that will never end. This week let us try to open our hearts to a deeply-felt sense of what a difference it makes that the tomb is empty, that Jesus is alive, that he allows us to recognize him in the breaking of bread, and that he missions us to proclaim this Good News.

Each morning this week, we can pause for a moment and simply thank God for our being alive today. Even more, we can thank God for the life that Jesus won for us. Throughout the day, and at different brief moments, we can remember that this is Easter Week and ask to live more freely today, more gratefully. We can name the grace in our own terms and in the context of what we are experiencing, what gets us discouraged or what gives us life. Overall, we want to live the freedom we have been given. If death has no hold on us, so many of our fears would melt away. If we realized our ultimate home is in heaven, our spirits would be lighter and we would walk around more gratefully.

So, as we go through this week, we can let ourselves believe in the Resurrection that was won for us. "Lord, I believe in the gift of life you have given me in the death and resurrection of your Son, Jesus." We can say this act of faith, or sing any of the wonderful Easter songs in the back of our minds, as many times as it takes to let ourselves feel the effects of Easter.

Perhaps we had a difficult Holy Week or Easter. There might have been loneliness or family conflicts. Perhaps we are facing a chronic illness or deep struggles with a loved one, or we are grieving the loss of a loved one. These, and many other struggles can challenge our Easter hope and joy. This is the week to place our trust in the one who is now alive, so that we can live forever. We can ask for the gifts of hope renewal these days. In giving thanks, we can ask that our hearts be opened even more to receive the gift of his Spirit.



SAINT OF THE DAY

St. Mark, Evangelist ? - April 25, 68





usually identified with the Mark of Acts 12:12. When Saint Peter escaped from prison, he went to the home of Mark's mother.

Paul and Barnabas took him along on the first missionary journey, but for some reason Mark returned alone to Jerusalem. It is evident, from Paul's refusal to let Mark accompany him on the second journey despite Barnabas's insistence, that Mark had displeased Paul. Because Paul later asks Mark to visit him in prison, we may assume the trouble did not last long.

The oldest and the shortest of the four *Gospels*, the *Gospel of Mark* emphasizes Jesus's rejection by humanity while being God's triumphant envoy. Probably written for gentile converts in Rome—after the death of Peter and Paul sometime between A.D. 60 and 70—Mark's *Gospel* is the gradual manifestation of a "scandal": a crucified Messiah.

Evidently a friend of Mark—calling him "my son"—Peter is only one of this *Gospel*'s sources, others being the Church in Jerusalem (Jewish roots), and the Church at Antioch (largely Gentile).

Like another *Gospel* writer Luke, Mark was not one of the 12 apostles. We cannot be certain whether he knew Jesus personally. Some scholars feel that the evangelist is speaking of himself when describing the arrest of Jesus in Gethsemane: "Now a young man followed him wearing nothing but a linen cloth about his body. They seized him, but he left the cloth behind and ran off naked" (Mark 14:51-52).

Others hold Mark to be the first bishop of Alexandria, Egypt. Venice, famous for the Piazza San Marco, claims Mark as its patron saint; the large basilica there is believed to contain his remains.

A winged lion is Mark's symbol. The lion derives from Mark's description of John the Baptist as a "voice of one crying out in the desert" (Mark 1:3), which artists compared to a roaring lion. The wings come from the application of Ezekiel's vision of four winged creatures to the evangelists.

Reflection Mark fulfilled in his life what every Christian is called to do: proclaim to all people the Good News that is the source of salvation. In particular, Mark's way was by writing. Others may proclaim the Good News by music, drama, poetry, or by teaching children around a family table.

Saint Mark is the Patron Saint of Notaries and Venice.
