

He Is Already Here!

The beauty of our faith is that if we truly seek to draw closer to God, then everything in life becomes a signpost, a springboard, a byway, and a reminder of the goal of our journey, who is Christ Jesus our Lord. Even tragedies and struggles can be invitations to come to know the Lord in new and unexpected ways. We see more and more that everything in the natural world alludes to the presence of someone just beyond appearances. We begin to realize that everything that comes to us throughout each day is more than a coincidence or happenstance. With new eyes, we begin to perceive the dance of life to be purposeful and guided. We slowly realize that we never had to travel to far off places to find Him. He is already in our midst, and even closer-He awaits our coming within the inner chambers of our heart. Yet the journey is important, if only to arrive back at the beginning where He has been all along.


A faith-filled life finds the world imbued with meaning and purpose. Everyday happenings become occasions for an intimate dialogue with our Maker. The value of a retreat, a shrine, a pilgrimage, or even a vacation, is that our routine is interrupted. We move into unfamiliar territory. We are forced to depart, briefly at least, from the day-to-day lives to which we are accustomed. Perhaps we will begin to perceive another reality, to glimpse traces of His Presence. It is a Someone who has always been near to us.

The liturgical year offers the great gift of encountering Jesus in the everyday flow of "Ordinary Time." While periodically pausing to celebrate Advent/Christmas, Lent/Easter, or a host of other holy days and saint's days, we find a consolation and peace in descending from the mountaintops and returning to the valleys of ordinary life. As we experience each of these seasons, we have the opportunity to encounter Jesus anew. Every year, the liturgical cycle reveals new dimensions of the mystery of Christ. Each year, we see a little more.

In our faith-journey, our relationship with God will change, often in unexpected ways. As we move through our day, a simple upward movement of the heart toward God becomes our ceaseless prayer. Words are not needed, but if they are spoken, they are few, simple, and direct. Our conversation with Him arises from the ground of wherever we are at the moment—our tiredness, frustration, anger, or even boredom. He is especially present in times of horror, heartbreak, or calamity. Often there are no easy answers, to which the silence of our faith and trust in Him must endure. Yet He is here, and He is nowhere else.


