A WORD

God Is At Work, Even Now

If there is one thing that can be said of our good and gracious God, it is that He works in mysterious and unpredictable ways, often disconcertingly so. His designs are frequently inscrutable. We envision how certain events or plans should unfold, how a marriage, a family, a career, or a vocation will turn out—but we come to realize that we really have less control over life than we thought. Our best-laid plans often go awry. We would prefer to have more control and certainty but "life" itself often interrupts.

On the other hand, there are endless wonders that God has in store for those who yield to His guidance and direction. For those who have surrendered to His will and His love, this incomprehensible and enigmatic God has become a friend and confidant. They have learned to move with ease in the ebb and flow of life. They have developed a nimbleness of spirit, always with an ear to the Holy Spirit and moving in concert with His purposes.

God works in unexpected ways. It may be that He calls us to do something that might be quite beyond our strength, but there is good to be accomplished, and we must learn that God alone is to be the source of our strength. He might withdraw His presence for a time, even for a prolonged time, but He means for our faith to deepen, knowing of His presence hidden in apparent absence.

In our apparent failures, even in those we most regret, the Holy Spirit is at work. Seeds of hope and goodness may be deeply buried under layers of misfortune, adversity, or evil but never so deep that the Holy Spirit cannot resurrect and heal. He is a masterful genius in bringing good out of evil, a different kind of success from failure, and unexpected fruitfulness from inauspicious beginnings or happenstance. God is always at work. Sometimes it takes a long time to realize how deeply and for how long God had been involved in the details of our lives, though we never knew it at the time. It seems that our Creator is always the gentleman-infinitely courteous, respectful, and self-effacing-as He works on the need for our wholeness and repentance.

Why does God work in such a hidden manner? Perhaps we are left in the dark because if we were aware of His "doings," we would probably mess it all up through our grasping, curiosity, wanting to take charge, and lack of humility. He knows us all too well. But He knows exactly what must be done. Struggle mightily, but be at peace and trust in God. He is at work, and He knows what He is about.

DAILY PRAYER THIS WEEK



We sometimes keep the idea of the Trinity firmly in our heads, rather than move it to our hearts. Our logical, practical minds cannot make sense out of three persons in one God.

But clearly this week Jesus wants us to have some sense of what the Trinity is - a continuation of the seamless love and

identity between him and the Father. It is the Spirit of that love between them that lives on in us today, guiding us and helping us to follow the message of Jesus' life. It is that Spirit of Jesus that is with us in each of the difficult and joyous moments of our days.

Jesus invites us to discover the power of the Spirit in our lives through an awareness of "the Advocate" supporting us each day. Jesus encourages us in the same kind of intimate relationship he has with the Father. The startling idea of this close, personal conversation one might have with a parent, models for us how we can speak to him.

If we feel tongue-tied or don't know where to begin, that is exactly the place to start. Each morning as we awaken, we can speak from our hearts.

Loving Jesus, I'm not sure how to do this. I can feel in my heart an emptiness or longing for something deeper in my relationship, but I don't always know where to begin. Help me to open my heart to you this day, and to carry with me the sense of how much you love me and how much you want this kind of personal relationship with me.

Let me feel your Spirit present with me as I face the challenges of the day and let me live my life this day as your follower, in the peace of your love.

It is a simple prayer and one that we can remember as we go about our day, head to a meeting, stand in the kitchen or fold laundry. It is not complicated to have a closer relationship with God but it takes focus. And always, we can end our day with a simple prayer of thanks for the many blessings of the day.

Jesus ascended into heaven, leaving us with the gift of the Spirit - a comfort and accompaniment for our journey. Let us turn to Jesus in our daily life and trust that we are not alone and ask for the graces we need to love as we have been loved

SAINT OF THE DAY



St. Bede the Venerable 672 - May 25, 735

Bede is one of the few saints honored as such even during his lifetime. His writings were filled with such faith and learning that even while he was still alive, a Church council ordered them to be read publicly in the churches.

At an early age, Bede was entrusted to the care of the abbot of the Monastery of St. Paul, Jarrow. The happy combination of genius and the instruction of scholarly, saintly monks, produced a saint and an extraordinary scholar, perhaps the most outstanding one of his day. He was deeply versed in all the sciences of his times: natural philosophy, the philosophical principles of Aristotle, astronomy, arithmetic, grammar, ecclesiastical history, the lives of the saints and especially, holy Scripture.

From the time of his ordination to the priesthood at 30—he had been ordained a deacon at 19—till his death, Bede was ever occupied with learning, writing, and teaching. Besides the many books that he copied, he composed 45 of his own, including 30 commentaries on books of the Bible.

His Ecclesiastical History of the English People is commonly regarded as of decisive importance in the art and science of writing history. A unique era was coming to an end at the time of Bede's death: It had fulfilled its purpose of preparing Western Christianity to assimilate the non-Roman barbarian North. Bede recognized the opening to a new day in the life of the Church even as it was happening.

Although eagerly sought by kings and other notables, even Pope Sergius, Bede managed to remain in his own monastery until his death. Only once did he leave for a few months in order to teach in the school of the archbishop of York. Bede died in 735 praying his favorite prayer: "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As in the beginning, so now, and forever."

Reflection

Though his *History* is the greatest legacy Bede has left us, his work in all the sciences, especially in Scripture, should not be overlooked. During his last Lent, Bede worked on a translation of the *Gospel of Saint John* into English, completing it the day he died. But of this work "to break the word to the poor and unlearned" nothing remains today.




