# A Message from Father Andrie

## Wedding Preparation

I typically experience a tinge of sadness leaving the Christmas season because it is so lovely. There are many joyous celebrations: Christmas, Holy Family, Epiphany, and the Baptism of the Lord.

On Christmas, we celebrated that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us (Jn 1:14). Additionally, we celebrated the Holy Family – Jesus, Mary, and Joseph – and through them, the beauty of marriage and family life. We also celebrated Mary, the Mother of God, on January 1. As His mother, Mary was intimately involved in the life of her Son. She is the Mom of all moms, who loves us right into the arms of her Son.

Furthermore, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Epiphany or the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles symbolized by the Magi. Finally, this week we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord, where our heavenly Father sends the gift of the Spirit upon His Son. In baptism, He blesses us with the same Spirit!

With all these celebrations, there is a common thread that weaves them all together. Obviously, Jesus is the center of all our celebrations. However, if you think about it, there is also the theme of a wedding that brings them all together. Let's look at this more closely.

On Christmas, we celebrate the birth of Jesus, our Savior. Essentially, we celebrate Jesus (whom John the Baptist refers to as the "Bridegroom") leaving His chamber in heaven. Psalm 19:6 speaks of a voice (i.e., the Word) "*which comes forth like a bridegroom leaving his chamber, and like a strong man runs its course with joy.*" On Christmas, we celebrate the arrival of Jesus our Bridegroom.

In the Jewish tradition, there was a betrothal period where the bridegroom left His Father's house and went to the house of his respective bride. There, he paid the purchase price and established the marriage covenant with his bride. In this light, Jesus leaves His Father's house (heaven) and comes to our house (earth) and pays the purchase price, i.e., His own life on the Cross.

On Epiphany, the wedding guests arrive. The Magi travel from the east, bringing their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Essentially, these are the wedding gifts for the baby Bridegroom. The Magi, of course, symbolize all those whom God invites to the wedding feast.

The saints, for their part, are all those who accept the Lord's wedding invitation and respond with great charity. If Jesus is the Bridegroom and John the Baptist is His best man, the saints are like the groomsmen and bridesmaids. They are the wedding party.

How does Jesus' baptism fit into this picture? Again, the Jewish tradition helps us out. In the Jewish tradition, there was a custom wherein the bride (and sometimes the bridegroom) underwent a ritual washing prior to her wedding. This was called the bridal *mikvah* or "bridal bath." It was done in running water either the night before the wedding or as close to the wedding as possible. The bath not only recalled the rivers from the Garden of Eden but also conveyed the sense of new birth and the new world that begins with marriage.

In this light, we find John the Baptist "baptizing" or administering the "bridal bath" for those willing to repent. In other words, John is preparing the bride – you and me for the wedding with Christ. Our baptism is a "bridal bath," a cleansing as we begin the marriage covenant, our new life in Christ.


Finally, we have the wedding feast at Cana. It is no accident that Jesus performed His first miracle or "sign" at a wedding. By turning water into wine, Jesus reveals that He is the long-awaited Messiah-Bridegroom who will give Himself to His Bride, the Church. And Jesus will do so at what John calls His "Hour," or His passion, death, and Resurrection.

At every Mass, we hear the Bridegroom's voice giving us His vow that He will be with us "in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health." "*This is my body, which will be given up for you.*" And then the chalice, "*This is the chalice of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you.*" Our vow, for its part, is only one word: Amen. This means, "I believe" or "so be it." By saying "Amen," we accept Jesus' Love and offer our love back to Him.

Our Christmas celebrations are a great reminder that Jesus loves you and like a marriage, desires to give Himself to you. And He hungers to receive your love in return! While our Christmas season has come to an end, there is reason to remain joyful; Jesus, your Bridegroom, is preparing you for the wedding banquet of heaven!

### Deacon John's Corner

#### The Most Important Day in Our Life

This Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. But why was Jesus baptized? After all, Jesus is free from sin, the Son of God, and baptism from John the Baptist was administered as a "baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" (Mark 1:4).

Jesus had no need to be cleansed by the waters of baptism, because he didn't have any sins to wash away. However, he changed the baptism waters forever. Christian baptisms are much greater than John's baptism. A Christian baptism not only forgives sins, but it infuses the life of God into our souls, making us God's children. At each of our baptisms we are claimed as adopted children of God. Think about that for a moment - through baptism, we become part of God's family!

We celebrate our birthday as an important day in our life. But, being baptized into God's family gives our lives meaning. We are given great hope for an eternal reward in heaven. The day we are baptized we are given the opportunity to join God in heaven for eternity! Birthdates are good to know – but our baptism date is, without a doubt, the most important day of our life.

My baptism date is August 23<sup>rd</sup>. I never get cake and candles on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August – but that date is much more important than my birthday.


## Early Learning Center






