

A Message from Father Andrie

Discerning God's Voice

This weekend forty-two of our little ones will receive their first Holy Communion at a special afternoon Mass. What a gift to receive Jesus who is the fullness of love in the Eucharist! Our precious little sheep will receive the Good Shepherd for the very first time. Please pray for them and their families!

This weekend we hear Jesus remind us that His sheep hear His voice. Mary Magdalene stands outside Jesus' tomb weeping, and while she does not recognize Him visually, she recognizes His voice. Hearing her name, "Mary," she hears the voice of the Good Shepherd.

Recognizing God's voice is one of the great challenges today. Fairly regularly, people ask themselves, "When praying or discerning something, how do I recognize God's voice?" How do I know whether it is God's voice, my voice, or the voice of the evil one?

A few preliminary comments are helpful before providing some principles. First, you must be a person of prayer and be comfortable with silence to hear God's voice. If your day is surrounded by noise, it's nearly impossible to hear God's voice. There are too many other voices competing for your attention. During Lent, I abandoned watching the news via television and the Internet except on Sundays now and then. It is amazing how much easier it was to hear God's voice when other voices were quieted!

God's voice is often subtle. Think of how the Lord whispered to Elijah when he was on the mountain. Daily prayer and time for silence provide the "space" or structure for God to reach you.

Second, God speaks through Sacred Scripture, the Church, and the Tradition of the Church. These three make up the "living voice" of Jesus today. We refer to Sacred Scripture, the Church, and Tradition of the Church (Apostolic Tradition) as public revelation. What we receive from God in prayer is called private revelation. God cannot contradict Himself, so whatever He reveals to you in prayer or personally will be consistent with what He has revealed publicly through the Church.

Now let's look at a couple of principles for discerning God's voice. Here is the first: Look at the overall direction of your life. Are you moving away from the Lord or toward Him? God tends to speak in a consistent way depending on the direction of your life. For those moving away from the Lord, the evil one tends to present apparent pleasures to keep them moving along in that direction.

God, on the other hand, tends to sting and bite the conscience of those moving away from Him. He wants them to turn around. I know this personally well. When I was in my teens, I drifted away from the Lord. There was a feeling of emptiness and guilt in my heart. The Lord tried to get my attention to draw me back to Him.

For those moving toward the Lord, the opposite is true. The evil one does not like this movement, so he stings, bites, and places obstacles in their path so that they may not go forward. There was a saying in the seminary, "If the evil one cannot keep you away from the Lord, he will try to make your life miserable in the Lord." God, on the other hand, consoles, comforts and removes obstacles for those moving toward Him.

The first principle, then, is to look at the overall direction of your life. For those moving away from God, He stings and bites the conscience so that they turn around. For those moving toward God, He consoles and encourages them.

The second principle helps you discern between two different goods. For example, a mother has two job offers and needs to figure out which one to take. A student discerns which college to attend. Or a young girl discerns a vocation: marriage or religious life? Or a family discerns whether it is the right time to get a puppy. Those moving toward God want to know His will.

When discerning between different goods, know that God can speak to you in many different ways: a still small voice (locution); a song in your head; a memory; through an image; a Scriptural passage; or sometimes just a deep sense of peace. God will speak to you in the way that He knows will touch your heart most deeply.

Additionally, when discerning between goods, or the timing of something, pay close attention to your thoughts/heart over an extended amount of time. What brings peace? What causes unrest? The former is typically from God, while the latter is not. In short, pay close attention to your thoughts/heart over time and what brings peace, joy, life, and rest. These "fruits" are from the Lord and meant to encourage you!



"Goldy, where are you? Don't you hear my voice?"

Regardless, as they say in sports, practice, practice, practice and you do not win games alone. The same is true in hearing Jesus' voice. Practice each day in prayer, and ask others – a spiritual director, friend, family member, priest – to help you discern God's voice. Ultimately, it is His voice that knows you by name and calls you that you might have life and have it more abundantly.


Helping the Good Shepherd

In this week's Gospel, we hear Jesus say, "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." Jesus literally laid down His life for us, His sheep. Jesus did this so that the sheep in His flock might be saved. We can never repay Him for His sacrifice, nor does He expect us to repay Him. But there are at least a couple of ways that we can help our good shepherd.


The first way to help the good shepherd is by being good sheep. Jesus, as our shepherd, wants us to get to heaven. We can help Him by simply being good sheep. We should do all we can to not wander off too far, or too often, from our shepherd. We can do this by always keeping our good shepherd in view. We don't want to wander off into dangerous territory, where a wolf might pick us off. We need to take care of ourselves.

Secondly, we can help the good shepherd by looking for those around us who might be wandering too far away. We all have different vantage points where we might be in the best position to gently lead someone back to our good shepherd. It might be a family member, a friend, a neighbor, or a co-worker who has wandered, or is wandering away.

We can play our role in ensuring that His flock grows as large as possible. God does not limit the pastureland in heaven. Let's try to help our good shepherd fill it up as much as possible.






