



## A Message from Father Andrie

### Sunday Special Third Commandment



This week we look at the third commandment to *“Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work; but the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; in it you shall not do any work.”* (Ex. 20:8-10).

Genesis 2 reminds us that after God completed the heavens and the earth, He rested on the seventh day from all the work He had undertaken (Gn 2:3). Obviously, God’s rest does not suggest fatigue, but rather points to something much deeper. God created the world for a purpose, i.e., for rest or communion with Him.

In Hebrew, the word oath, “shevuah,” is closely related to the number seven “sheva.” On the seventh day, God swears an oath (literally “to seven oneself”) or makes a covenant with creation. In other words, the sabbath signifies that God binds creation to Himself in a perpetual covenant relationship. We could say it this way: Creation exists as the place where God makes a covenant with us. The reason why God created the world was to enter into a covenant (a loving relationship) with it.

Additionally, Sacred Scripture reveals that the Lord’s Day is a memorial of Israel’s liberation from its bondage in Egypt (CCC 2171). *“Remember that you too were once slaves in the land of Egypt, and the LORD, your God, brought you out from there with a strong hand and outstretched arm. That is why the LORD, your God, has commanded you to observe the sabbath day.”* (Deut. 5:15). Keeping the sabbath not only imitates God, but it also reminds us of God’s power in bringing the Israelites out of slavery. The sabbath, then, reminds us of the freedom God gives us in living our covenant relationship with Him.

Our understanding of the Sabbath was radically transformed with the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Jesus rose on the “first day” of the week. His Resurrection, sometimes understood as the “eighth day” given that it followed the Jewish sabbath, symbolizes the new creation (CCC 2174). Hence, Christians began celebrating the sabbath not on Saturday, but rather on Sunday, the first day of the week.

Interestingly, the early Church picked up on the eighth-day sabbath motif by creating baptismal fonts with eight sides. Symbolically, the baptismal font reminded parents that their infants were baptized into the death of Christ (immersed in water) so as to share in His Resurrection (coming out of the water) (Rom. 6:8). As parents, they were to help their children participate in the “new creation” or the new life that Christ gives through a life of faith, hope, and love in Him.

As Catholics, we remember the sabbath not only by setting aside a day for rest each week to spend time with family and serve others (especially the poor), but most of all by worshipping God. Furthermore, as Catholics, we do not worship God in some private, personalized and vague way, but rather through a visible, public, and communal celebration called the Mass.

The Mass is a visible expression of our communal relationship with God, not simply as isolated individuals, but as His covenant family. In the Mass, we celebrate the covenant that God makes with us in Jesus Christ, i.e., in His passion, death, and Resurrection. At the consecration of the wine into His Blood, Jesus says, *“Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.”*

Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (Jn 1:29), is the fulfillment of the Passover lamb sacrificed in the Old Testament. As the true Lamb, Jesus is sacrificed so that we can be brought out of slavery from sin (Egypt) and brought into the Promised Land of heaven. He is God’s covenant with us. In the Mass, we celebrate all that God has done for us, continues to do in us, and trust that He will do for us as we make our way to be eternally united with Him. By honoring the sabbath via worship of God and rest on Sunday, we celebrate our covenant with God in Christ.

With all that said, we can better understand why the Church, our Mother, obligates her children to participate in Mass on Sundays. As has become clear in the last year with the pandemic, we can also see why the Church asks us to do this in person. Your presence, including your unique personality, is critically important as we listen to God’s Word, participate in the Church’s prayer, and receive the Eucharist together as God’s covenant family.

Practically, a helpful reminder that our Sunday obligation includes maintaining the one-hour Eucharistic fast (no food or drink) so as to respect the tremendous gift of the Eucharist. Dressing well is also important! Arrive a little early so you can offer your prayers. And most importantly, participate in the mystery of the Mass with your whole heart! In doing so, you will be all the more prepared to participate in heaven, your eternal sabbath rest in God.


## Deacon John's Corner

## The Power of God's Grace

We have probably all been told at one time that "God never gives you more than you can handle." But doesn't that sound like God is up in heaven dealing out trouble to all of us? It is like He deals out only so much trouble to each of us, based on what we can handle. God is not dealing out trouble as a dealer might in a poker game. Instead, God gifts us all freewill. Unfortunately, freewill decisions can sometimes hurt us and/or others. The world is full of accidents or intentional actions taken by us or others that may impact our lives in some fairly bad ways. God allows these things to happen – not based on our ability to handle the consequences, but because He loves all of us so much that He gives us freewill, even if He knows that a bad decision may impact someone He loves very much.

In this week's second reading (2 Cor 12:7-12), St. Paul begged God to have an angel of Satan to leave him alone (God even allows freewill to angels). But God responded to Paul, saying, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." God knew that Paul could create power out of his weakness and suffering if he was open to God's gift of grace. We should all reflect on this gift of grace before a storm hits our life. Sometimes when we are in the middle of suffering it is hard for us to reflect on anything, let alone the gift of grace.

St. Paul did not fear troubles that might be coming on his horizon, because he had absolute confidence in God's grace. Paul took this confidence to his martyred death. "God's grace is sufficient" for us too. Nothing in life is too big for us to handle, if we allow God's grace to work through us. In fact, through God's grace, "power is made perfect in us" - the power to get through our troubles and the power to grow closer to God.


