



A Message from Father Andrie

Respecting Goods Seventh Commandment



We continue our series on the Ten Commandments by looking at the seventh commandment: *You shall not steal* (Ex 20:15). The seventh commandment is about a respect for persons and their goods. Hence, this commandment forbids *theft*, that is, the usurping of another's property against the reasonable will of the owner (CCC 2408). People have a right to their property and the fruit of their labor.

St. Paul has strong words to the Corinthians against thieves when he says that neither "*thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers will inherit the kingdom of God*" (1 Cor. 6:10). Such immoral practices are incompatible with life in Christ. Those who commit the sin of theft are required to do some type of restitution of stolen goods to the owner. In Luke's Gospel, Zacchaeus tells Jesus that he will restore fourfold anything he has stolen (Luke 19:8).

As the sixth commandment encompasses human sexuality, the seventh commandment encompasses broader issues than stealing, strictly speaking. The Catholic Catechism says, "The seventh commandment forbids unjustly taking or keeping the goods of one's neighbor and wronging him in any way with respect to his goods. It commands justice and charity in the care of earthly goods and the fruits of men's labor. For the sake of the common good, it requires respect for the universal destination of goods and respect for the right to private property. Christian life strives to order this world's goods to God and to fraternal charity" (CCC 2401).

Along with respecting others' goods, this commandment also concerns a respect for the integrity of creation under the seventh commandment. The Catechism provides a nice reflection on human beings as stewards (not absolute masters) over animals, plants, and inanimate beings. The idea is that nature is destined for the common good of past, present, and future humanity (CCC 2415). Abuse of the created order not only offends God the Creator but also is an injustice (or theft) against the common good.

Interestingly, the Catechism speaks about animals under the "Care of Creation" section. Specifically, it says "Animals are God's creatures. He surrounds them with providential care. By their mere existence they bless him and give him glory. Thus, men owe them kindness" (CCC 2416). Although the Catechism does not list specific animals, almost everyone knows they have dogs in mind as it is common knowledge. A footnote in my Catechism says, "Cats may possibly give glory to God. However, this remains theological speculation." Oddly enough, the important footnote is not in all editions of the catechism so you may not see it in yours. :)

Furthermore, the Catechism speaks about Catholic Social Teaching (CST), or the whole body of doctrine around social and economic matters first developed in the nineteenth century. At the heart of CST is the fundamental dignity and welfare of human beings. Human beings are not pawns at the mercy of the state (contra communism or socialism) nor are they slaves of economic systems (contra unbridled capitalism). Economic activity must always be exercised within the limits of the moral order (CCC 2426). In short, human beings, including their dignity and fundamental rights, must always remain at the center of political and economic activity.

There is also a lengthy section on the meaning of human work, including the roles and responsibilities of workers. In short, work has the following benefits: It honors God and the talents He has given; through work we participate in God's creative work in shaping the world according to His plan; work is the means by which we provide for ourselves and our family; through work we imitate Christ who also worked; and finally, work gives each person a share in Christ's redemptive work (i.e., His cross and Resurrection).

The Catechism's reflection on human work provides guiding principles for different segments of society. The state must guarantee human freedom and recognize that its citizens have a right to private property (CCC 2431). Businesses must consider the wellbeing of their employees and not focus solely on profits (CCC 2432). Society should help citizens find work and employment (CCC 2433). Workers, for their part, are entitled to a just wage so as to live a dignified life and support their families (CCC 2434). In return, they must put in an honest day's work and use company time and resources appropriately.

Finally, the seventh commandment concerns our obligation to the poor. Our Lord has a very special place in His Heart for the poor. The poor includes not only material poverty, but also cultural and religious poverty (CCC 2444). In light of the gospel and Christ's love for the poor, everyone is challenged to participate in the *works of mercy* (corporal and spiritual) to alleviate the sufferings of the poor. Justice and charity also challenge every person, according to his or her ability, to support the poor by giving away a portion of income and goods he or she does not need.

In short, the seventh commandment is about rights and responsibilities around earthly goods, as well as our duty to care for God's creation and the poor. Naturally, Jesus is our model! May we strive to imitate Christ and help bring about His kingdom by the way we responsibly use and share our earthly goods in our families and toward the needy around us.


Deacon John’s Corner

We Don’t Want to Become a Grumble

In this week’s first reading (Exodus 16: 2-15), the “whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron.” God had just freed them from slavery, and they were complaining about the desert and the lack of food. They saw what was wrong in their lives, while being blinded to their blessings.

In his book “The Great Divorce”, CS Lewis has an interesting perspective on those who grumble all the time. He said that those who grumble all the time – often become the grumble itself. A periodic grumble might be warranted from time to time. However, perpetual grumbling can actually impact who you are and how you treat others. It’s hard for us to be nice to others, while we are grumbling. Grumbling is usually a black cloud that hovers over us as we dwell on some kind of injustice or bad luck that has impacted our lives.

Studies show that constant complaining and frustration, can lead us to feeling powerless and frustrated. The accumulation of frustration and helplessness can add up over time and impact our mood, our self-esteem, and even our general mental health. We need to steer away from grumbling. It is bad for our health and bad for our relationships with others. It’s impossible to appreciate God and grumble at the same time. We can reflect on what is wrong in our life, or appreciate our blessings. It is our choice.




