

A Message from Father Andrie

Being Childlike

Ambition can be good, but also harmful. The apostles certainly had it. Poor Jesus. In this weekend's gospel, the apostles argue over who is the greatest right after our Lord predicted that He was going to die. It's like they didn't even hear Him.

To correct them, Jesus brings in a child. Later in Matthew's gospel, Jesus will say, *"Unless you become like a child, you will not enter the kingdom of God"* (18:3). For Jesus, then, a child points the way to the kingdom. Let's look at how children can teach us about following Jesus.

First, let's be honest, children can be quite cruel. They can also throw temper tantrums. For example, I remember once seeing a child have a complete meltdown in a department store parking lot. His poor mother almost had a nervous breakdown. Certainly, this is not what the Lord had in mind.

Instead, we are to focus on the good qualities of children. For example, generally speaking, children trust their parents. They don't wake up every morning and say, "I wonder if mom or dad will take care of me today? Will mom and dad decide to give me food, clothing, or send me to school?" Children instinctively trust that their parents will care for them. They are dependent and are completely fine with being so. Dependency, for children, is natural and good.

In this light, the Lord may be reminding us, "Trust me as this child trusts his parents." Obviously, it's easy to do this when things are good, but much more difficult when things are not so good. We are to trust the Lord and His providential care as children trust their parents.

Second, children have a natural disposition for unconditional love. Think of children who run to their mom or dad when they get home from work, making them feel like they are the best parents in the world. In other words, children do not tend to put a lot of conditions on their love. I will love you "if" you do this or "if" you give me that.

Using a child as an example, our Lord may be saying, "Approach your heavenly Father like a child. Run to Him with open arms. Be grateful for what you have." Certainly, we can present our needs to the Lord, but we don't love Him because of what He gives us, but rather for who He is. Like a child, love the Lord with an unconditional love.

Third, generally speaking, children have a wonderful gift of not worrying what other people think of them. They are just comfortable being themselves. A couple of years ago I was sitting in the back of an Adoration chapel doing my prayers. A mom and her three little ones came marching in. The little three-year-old smiled and waved at me. She went to the front of the chapel where she stood on the kneeler and read her book in front of the Eucharist. Every once in a while, she would turn around, smile, and wave.


At one point, she jumped off the kneeler into the main aisle. She made the sign of the cross, knelt for a minute, then got up and started dancing in front of the Eucharist. After laughing interiorly, I thought to myself, "I wish I was that free." I have danced before, but it's not pretty. The little girl didn't care what other people thought. Her heart was full of joy before the Lord and she expressed it by dancing as David did before the Ark of the Covenant (2 Sam. 6:14). The beauty of children is that they are comfortable with who they are.

Children aren't always looking at themselves wondering, "What do people think of me? Am I doing this right? How can I get ahead of this person or that person?" They are who they are and take great joy in it. There's real freedom in that mentality. By pointing to the child, Jesus may be saying, "Be who you are in me. Don't worry so much about what others think of you. Put away the comparison charts and stay focused on me. Rejoice in who you are." And let others be who they are. Give people the freedom, the space, to be who God created them to be.

How does a child answer the question, "Who is the greatest?" The greatest is the dependent one, who trusts that God will provide. The greatest is the one who loves God unconditionally, for who He is, and not what He does for him or her. The greatest is the one who is not overly concerned about what others think but rather knows who he or she is in God's eyes. In your prayers, ask the Lord for the beautiful qualities of a child and for the grace to follow Him each day.




Deacon John’s Corner

Our Christian Role

It is refreshing to see the true honesty of the accounts of the disciples in the New Testament. In this week’s Gospel (Mark 9:30-37), we find Jesus walking along the dusty roads with his closest followers, the twelve apostles. While they are on their journey, Jesus shares with them that he will soon be arrested, unjustly condemned, mocked and crucified. After Jesus’ dramatic prophesy, the apostles just turn to each other and begin talking about the new Kingdom and what leadership roles each would have in it. The New Testament is full of stories where the apostles seem oblivious to what Jesus is saying to them. With our hindsight, it is easy for us to look back and see their errors. But Jesus is very patient with them. Instead of rebuking them, Jesus teaches them that the role of Christians isn’t to achieve fame, fortune, power, and worldly success. Rather, it is the same role that Christ himself undertook: to serve others and to reach out to those who are weak and in need.

It is easy to get focused on worldly successes. Using our God-given skills in life is a great thing. However, we must always keep in mind our primary mission on earth, as Christians, is to serve God and others.


