

A Message from Father Andrie

Jesus, Our True King

When I was in the Holy Land in 2012, I was impressed by how much King Herod had built. He built fortresses, aqueducts, and huge palaces. He even built a mountain where he put a fortress and a palace on top of it called Herodium.

Herod's most well-known project was that he expanded and embellished the Temple in Jerusalem. He began work on the Temple in 19 B.C. His plans for the expansion were so big that he had a platform built that could accommodate 24 football fields. It was the largest structure of its time. The Western wall in Jerusalem, which is the holiest place in Judaism, is one of those supporting walls.

Given all Herod's building projects, one historian says that "Herod the Great is widely recognized as the greatest builder of ancient times in the Land of Israel." In this light, one would think that the Jewish people respected and loved him. However, they did not. In fact, they feared and disliked him very much. Why?

First, Herod's projects were built on the backs of Jewish slaves. For example, it took 10,000 men ten years just to build the retaining walls around the Temple Mount. Some blocks of limestone weighed more than ten tons.

In addition to forced labor, King Herod was a tyrant. He ruled with an iron fist. He established an enormous secret police force and brutally killed anyone suspected of plotting against him. In short, he kept the peace by the sword. In the minds of the Jewish people, Herod was not their true king. Instead, God was their true King.

As King, God would come and deliver His people from the brutal oppression of the Romans. God, of course, is King. He arrived, however, in a most unexpected way – as a little baby. As King, He built no fortresses, aqueducts, or splendid palaces. He had no government, no military, and owned no land. And yet, millions of people love and follow Him.

And for those with eyes to see and ears to hear, this King rules in a most surprising way: from a Cross. He wears not a crown of gold, but a crown of thorns. He did not wear splendid garments, but rather was mocked and clothed in purple. And finally, as we hear in today's gospel, as King, Jesus speaks the truth. Those who belong to the truth listen to His voice.

Over the course of 2,000 years, we know that this King has changed the lives of millions. Thousands upon thousands have died for Him. Even today, while not of this world, His kingdom is alive as ever.

Hospitals, schools, and charitable organizations are built because of Him and work to express His teachings. Entire cities have been named after the saints who made Him alive in their own time.

The King whom we celebrate today and always, of course, is our Lord Jesus Christ. Unlike Herod, who ruled for such a short time with an iron fist, Jesus reigns forever by truth, mercy, and love. Jesus is not interested in magnificent buildings, but rather in human hearts. He "thirsts" for human love. Whenever anyone accepts Him as King and loves Him in return, His kingdom grows.

Jesus, our King, does not care about magnificent homes or bank accounts. Instead, He cares about relationships, primarily the one with Him and through Him with others. As our King, Jesus invites us to "see Him" in those most in need – the hungry, thirsty, naked, and the imprisoned. He invites us to stand for Him who is the "way and the truth and the life." (Jn 14:6)


I would also add that we are invited to see Him in your spouse, parents, children, classmates, friends, co-workers, etc. After all, this is where Jesus' kingdom grows in your life, i.e., in your relationships with those around you. If you cannot see Jesus in those closest to you, it is pretty difficult to see Him in strangers.

On this feast, renew your love and service to our King! Make Him King of every area of your life: your family, work, friendships, leisure time, etc. And in prayer, ask Him where you can serve Him in the lonely, the hurting, the poor, or those who are confused. Our King and His kingdom grow not by force, but by love, self-sacrifice, and service.

My hope and prayer is that each of you, by God's grace, will more fully and joyfully serve Jesus as King by always putting people and relationships at the heart of everything you do. In doing so, you will bear witness that Jesus is King now and forever.


Deacon John's Note

A Different Kind of King

What do we often picture when we think about kings? When we think of kings, don't we usually think about things like wealth, power, and honor? Kings are supposed to sit on thrones, and occasionally lead their army into battle. I know when I was young, I thought a king had it all. They didn't have to clean their room, do dishes, or yard work. They had servants who would provide them with any of their needs.

This Sunday we celebrate "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe." However, Jesus was unlike any king we have seen in history. Jesus was not born into great wealth or had servants providing for his every need. In fact, as "King of the Jews," he was crucified and killed for his teaching and leadership. But as Jesus informs Pilate in our Gospel (John 18:33-37), "My kingdom does not belong to this world." By our world standards, Jesus did not look much like a king. However, Jesus was a different kind of king. Jesus is a king who would lead us and countless others to a kingdom that is infinitely greater than we can ever imagine - a Kingdom of God!

Most kings grow their kingdoms through violent conquest. Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young have lyrics to one of their songs that says, "Jesus Christ was the first non-violent revolutionary." Jesus grew his kingdom through love and sharing the truth. Jesus shared the truth about our Creator, and His great love for us. Jesus is still growing His kingdom today and will continue through the end of time. Now that is surely a different kind of king. He is a King that is not of this world – but a King of the Universe.




The Giraffes

- 1) St. Anne's Place emergency shelter, opened in response to the rapid rise in the number of homeless families in Hennepin County in 1990.
- 2) Ascension Place transitional housing opened in 1981 to meet the needs of women facing complex barriers such as homelessness, mental illness, chemical dependency, histories of sexual and domestic violence, and incarceration.
- 3) Next Step Housing established in 2011, provides supportive housing to women and women-led families throughout Hennepin County.

Parishioners are invited to shop for and assemble a shower kit in your home and then drop off at St Therese in the gathering space by






