

#### A Message from Father Andrie

#### The Adorable Face

There is something beautiful about babies, especially their little faces. Human faces are unique and, in a particular way, they reveal not only the uniqueness of the person but also the glory of God.

The Old Testament alone speaks about the "face" 400 times, 100 of which refer to God's face. In the opening pages of Genesis, Adam and Eve were able to see God "face to face." After breaking the commandment, ashamed, they ran and hid their faces from God (Gn. 3:8). In their brokenness, they felt like they could no longer see God's face and live.

And yet, throughout the Old Testament, the strong desire to see God's face remained. Psalm 80:3 says, "O God, restore us, light up your face and we shall be saved." There is salvation in seeing God's face.

In the Book of Exodus, Moses asks God to guide them through the desert. And God agrees. Encouraged, Moses then asks to see God's glory. He wants to see God's face. The Lord responds, "I will make my goodness pass before you...but you cannot see my face, for no one can see me and live" (Ex. 33:18-20). As the Lord passes by, He covers Moses so that His face cannot be seen. Moses is not allowed to see the Lord's face, but only His back (Ex. 33:20-23).

On Christmas, everything changes. A little baby is born who reveals the face of God in an utterly new and splendid way. John's Gospel says it beautifully: "No one has ever seen God; the only Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, he has made him known" (Jn 1:18).

In a quiet, little stable on that chilly night, Mary and Joseph gaze upon the adorable little face of a baby, i.e., the face of God. It is the face of infinite love, sublime beauty, and profound humility.

And, it is the face of hope for one day, that that little face would give strength for the suffering, encouragement for the discouraged, healing for the broken, comfort for the anxious, connection for the lonely, and fulfillment for the empty.

And as Mary and Joseph gaze upon that little face, they also see the face of mercy. One day, those tender little eyes will bring healing for the sick, peace for the anxious, forgiveness for the sinner, and new life for the dead.

On Christmas, we not only celebrate the beauty of God in the human face of Jesus, but we also celebrate that every human face is an icon of Christ. In other words, now that God has a human face in Christ, each human face reflects the splendor of Christ, who is the face of God. For the person of faith, the beauty of Christ shines through each human face.

At this point, you may be thinking, "C'mon father, have you seen my face? I have wrinkles and blemishes. And you should see me without my makeup on. I could scare the neighborhood cats away." This would not necessarily be a bad thing.

But it's true! The person of prayer seeks the presence of Christ and recognizes Him in every human face. We could call this way of seeing a "sacramental vision," i.e., seeing the invisible in the visible – seeing Christ in the face of another. The saints see the world this way. Wherever they look, they not only see the fingerprints of God, but also the reflection of Christ in the face of each human person.

Additionally, the saints were aware of a spiritual secret – seeing the face of Christ in the face of others – leads to a new way of living, a new way of relating to others. How *radically* different the world would be if every person recognized Christ in the face of others and loved Him in them!

Seeing the face of Christ in my neighbor, I begin to treat him or her as I would treat Christ Himself. "Amen, I say to you," Jesus says, "whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Mt. 25:40). When you lift the burdens of those struggling more in life – the hungry, thirsty, the ill, those in prison – you serve Christ Himself. In short, when you see the face of Christ in others and serve them, you are the face of Christ for others! What a gift to be the face of God, i.e., the face of love!

#### Deacon John's Note

#### The Gift of Christmas

The true meaning of Christmas can sometimes be missed. Non-Christians will often say that we are celebrating the anniversary of the birth of Jesus of Nazareth, a spiritual leader whose teachings form the basis for our religion. I've often heard from those who have walked away from the Catholic Church, that they don't need any formal religion - but they do believe that the teachings of Jesus are a good way to live their lives. They think that Jesus is a good moral compass. When I hear this, I can begin to understand why they might want to leave the Christian or Catholic faith. Sadly, they are missing the most important part of our faith. Jesus Christ is not a spiritual leader whose teachings form the basis of our religion. Jesus Christ is God!

Christmas means that God became a little baby. Christmas means that God entered our world. If fallen away Christians and Catholics stopped to really understand that Jesus is not just a spiritual and moral teacher but is God Himself – I don't think they could walk away from our Faith.

Pope Benedict was once asked, "What did Jesus actually bring? We still have wars. We still get sick. People still suffer. We still die. So, what did Jesus bring?" Pope Benedict's response was, "Jesus brings us God."
The gift of Christmas is that Jesus brings us God.


