A Message from Father Andrie

Wedding Banquet of Heaven

There is something truly heartwarming about the moment of a marriage proposal. It is a moment of great excitement and anticipation. One of the great threads that runs throughout Sacred Scripture is a wedding. For example, on March 25th, we celebrate the **Annunciation**, when the Archangel Gabriel, on behalf of heaven (God, the angels, and saints) proposed to Mary. God wills to unite Himself with the human race in a covenant of love. It's no accident that many paintings of the Annunciation have Gabriel bowing or on one knee with a hand extended like a wedding proposal.



Mary offers her "yes" on behalf of everyone. She represents the best of humanity – open, docile, full of grace, trusting, and a heart filled with love and ready to suffer for God. "Yes, let it be done to me, according to your word." The wedding proposal is accepted, and the Word becomes flesh in her womb. Jewish tradition gave March 25 as the date of creation, when God said, "Let there be light." Every March 25, we celebrate Christ's conception, the date when all of creation, fallen in Adam, is renewed in Christ.

On **Christmas**, we celebrate Jesus, the Bridegroom, leaving heaven, His Father's house, to betroth himself to us, the Church, His Bride. On Christmas, we decorate trees, bring out festive colors, and offer beautiful music because the Bridegroom has arrived. He comes to betroth himself to us. And He offers us not just a ring or a cup of wine, but *Himself*.

Today, we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Epiphany**. On this day, the wedding guests arrive with gifts for the baby Bridegroom: Gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The Magi symbolizes all those who are open to the truth. They represent the human heart that hungers for God. In short, they represent those who say "yes" to Christ's wedding invitation, i.e., to His betrothal. When wedding invitations are sent out, one must RSVP. By giving your yes, you are saying, "I will be there because this is important. I want to celebrate with you and to honor you." We RSVP to God's invitation by the way we live.

Next week, we conclude the Christmas season with our **Lord's baptism**. In the Jewish tradition, there was a custom wherein the bride (and sometimes the bridegroom) underwent a ritual washing prior to the wedding. This was called the bridal *mikvah* or "bridal bath." It was done in running water either the night before the wedding or as close to the wedding as possible. The bath recalled the rivers from the Garden of Eden and symbolized the new birth and the new world that begins with marriage.

It's no accident then, that in humility, Christ is baptized or undergoes the *mivkah* or spiritual cleansing, not for Himself, but for us. Baptism is our *mikvah* or bridal bath that cleanses us for the marriage covenant in Christ, and prepares us for the wedding banquet in heaven

The theme of betrothal during the Christmas season also sheds light on Jesus' miracle which was performed at a wedding. By turning water into wine, Jesus reveals that He is the long-awaited Messiah-Bridegroom who arrives with a wedding invitation. Jesus will give Himself to us in what John calls His "Hour," or His passion, death, and Resurrection.

The theme of a wedding also sheds light on the meaning of the Mass. Jesus, the Messiah-bridegroom, promises to be with you "in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health." "This is my body, which will be given up for you." And then the chalice, "This is the chalice of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you." These are marriage vows. Your vow, for its part, is one word: Amen. Your Amen is your "yes," your acceptance of Jesus' Love and your promise to be faithful to Him on good days and bad ones, when you are healthy or sick, until you draw your last breath.

Finally, in a traditional Jewish wedding, during the betrothal period, the groom returned to his father's house to prepare a place for his bride. The bride, for her part, focused on her personal preparations, the wedding garments, lighted lamps, etc. Although the bride expected her bridegroom after about a year, she did not know the exact day or hour when he would return. The groom's father gave final approval for the groom's return.

During this time of waiting, the bride kept her oil lamp ready at all times, just in case the groom came in the night. Hence, Jesus gives the parable of the ten virgins in Matthew 25:1-13. Five are well prepared with oil, while five are not. It is a reminder that as the Messiah-Bridegroom, Jesus could return at any time. Therefore, one must be prepared.

The theme of a wedding, with a proposal, a time of betrothal, the exchange of wedding vows, helps put all our celebrations in their proper context. In a wedding, a bride and groom each give their vows in love as they enter into a covenant together.

Christ, the true Bridegroom, offers a proposal to you every day. He betroths Himself to you with His life. And as heaven waited with anticipation and excitement for Mary's response, so heaven waits with eagerness for your response. The angels and saints hope and pray you give your "yes" with a life of sacrifice, of service, and of love for our Lord. Like Mary, may Jesus help you give your "yes" to Him each day, and in doing so, prepare you for the wedding banquet of heaven, an eternal celebration of great joy.

Deacon John's Note

Our Epiphany

The word "epiphany" originally meant a manifestation or appearance of something, often a divine being. This week we celebrate the Magi (3 Kings, Wise Men) following a star to the place of the birth of Christ. The Magi were not Jews and yet they came to worship Jesus. This should reinforce that Jesus came to save the entire world - both the Jews and Gentiles. So, we all fall into that category of who Jesus came to save. God invites each of us to be saved.

Today, when someone has an "epiphany," it also means they've had a sudden insight into the deeper meaning of something. We must all hope to have an epiphany with God. Sometime during our lives, we need to see and know God as our loving and merciful Father. It may happen early in our life, or right before we take

our last breath on earth. It doesn't matter if you grew up in the Faith or never walked into a church in your life – at some time in our lives we are called to find and love God.

God gives each of us the gift of faith at our baptism. He gives each of us the faith to come to know and love Him. God has already done his part. We must activate that gift of faith to find Him, which will lead us to our own personal epiphany! We may not have to travel on the back of a camel across a hot dessert, but we do have to take time in our lives to follow the star to our Savior.




