

**EASE FUND GUIDELINES**

Dear Parishioners,  
 We are pleased to provide you with information regarding the guidelines for Endowing Assumption Students with Education (EASE) Fund.

The EASE fund was established by Father Terry Lees in the 1980's and shall be maintained to provide tuition assistance to Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary families.

Financial assistance from the EASE fund is made available to any qualifying student who seeks a secure K-12 Catholic education at an accredited elementary or high school located within the Diocese of Des Moines.

The application period opens the first business day of February and will close the first business day of April. The award-notification letters of financial assistance will be sent by May 15<sup>th</sup>.

The amount awarded to a qualifying family in any given year will be \$300 per elementary student and \$500 per high school student, as long as the total distribution is within the limit of total funding available. The amount of total funding available for disbursement to all qualifying applicants in any given fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the EASE fund balance at the end of the prior fiscal year.

**Know Your Catholic Faith**

**Next week: Tithe**

Although the Church teaches that offering some form of material support to the Church is obligatory for all Catholic adults who are able to do so, it doesn't specify what percent of one's income should be given. Remember, tithing (referring to 10%) was an Old Testament obligation that was incumbent on the Jews under the Law of Moses. Christians are dispensed from the obligation of tithing ten percent of their incomes, but not from the obligation to help the Church. In speaking about tithing and what we should give to the Church, we often forget that everything we have already belongs to God. Our money and possessions are not ours but His. All that we have is ours only because He allows us to have it. If we in the world today were to place God first in our lives, there would be no question or problem about tithes because our hearts would be filled with charity and we would give to and support the Church in the best way that we were able to. To paraphrase: God doesn't demand a fixed amount of money from us; he wants us to give from the heart. If people are forced by their church to give a certain percent of their income, that's extortion. If they give freely and cheerfully the amount they are able, that's a gift. (10:11)

### **Life is a Mystery**

The book of Job discusses a problem that distresses the people of all times. The question we often ask is why do so many people in the world suffer? At some point in time, all of us have asked ourselves why so many calamities, injustices, wars, diseases, disappointments, and exploitations have plagued the world? We often see upright people experiencing a lot of suffering while everything seems to go well with wicked people.

The story of Job has been written to help us reflect on such a problem. As the bible tells us, Job was a religious person, upright, and always well-behaved, and yet an endless string of calamities struck him (Job 1:1-2, 13).

This weekend's first reading contains Job's comments on humans' miserable conditions in this world. Starting from his theatrical experience, he says that life is all sorrow. A person is like a "slave" forced to undergo immense privations without getting anything in return. One is like a 'hireling' who labors from morning till evening in a field that is not one's own. When Job looks at his conditions, he says that his life is even worse than a "hireling" because these laborers at least can rest during the night, while he knows that even the night will not bring him relief but pain, sorrow, and restlessness.

Job's assessment of human life is partly accurate but not the entire truth. In this weekend's gospel, we see Jesus dealing with the problem of human suffering and misery by healing Peter's mother-in-law. We see Jesus healing the sick and casting out demons. Jesus did these to show us that God is not indifferent to the miserable conditions of human life. He does not like to see us suffering, oppressed, and rejected. He is always on the side of those who do not resign themselves to misery. Job himself concedes in chapter 19:25 when he says, "But as for me, I know that my redeemer lives and that he will, at last, stand forth upon the dust."

Today's readings challenge us to avoid the pessimistic and desperate view of life. Instead, we should accept life with hope and optimism as a precious gift from God.
