

CHRISTMAS – THE INCARNATION OF OUR GOD

Christmas is the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world. Jesus Christ, the Son of God and the Word of God, became flesh (cf. John 1:14), was born of the Blessed Virgin Mary (cf. Matt. 1:22-25). It is a time to recall God's ineffable love and to renew our resolve to love as He has loved us. The incarnation is a mystery with deep spiritual significance. In other words, Christmas is profoundly a spiritual or religious celebration. Unfortunately, however, commercial activities and the over-emphasis on the social dimension of the feast have increasingly overshadowed the spiritual significance of Christmas.

Christians have every reason to celebrate Christmas because there is an excellent exchange between God and us. God becomes a man to share in our poverty so that we will have a share in his riches. God shares in our humanity so that we have a share in his divine nature. St. Augustine beautifully captures this when he says, "You would have suffered death, had he not been born in time. Never would you have been freed from sinful flesh had he not taken on himself the likeness of sinful flesh. You would have suffered everlasting unhappiness had it not been for this mercy. You would never have returned to life had he not shared your death. You would have been lost if he had not hastened to your aid. You would have perished had he not come."

In his Apostolic Letter entitled, "Admirabile Signum" (An enchanting image), Pope Francis writes that, "By being born in a manger, God himself launches the only true revolution that can give hope and dignity to the disinherited and the outcast: the revolution of love and tenderness. From the manger, Jesus proclaims, in a meek yet powerful way, the need for sharing with the poor as the path to a more human and fraternal world in which no one is excluded or marginalized."

As we celebrate Christmas, let us not lose the essence of the feast. It is a season of Love and Gift: God loves us so much that he gave us his Son as a Gift. In this season, in particular, we express love by sharing our resources as the angel told the shepherds, "I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by the whole people." It is about reaching out to others, especially the poor. We are, therefore, encouraged in this season to reach out to the less privileged who find life burdensome.
