

Know Your Catholic Faith

Baptism of the Lord

At first glance, the Baptism of the Lord might seem an odd feast since the Church teaches that the sacrament of Baptism is necessary for the remission of sins, particularly Original Sin. Therefore, why was Christ baptized? After all, He was born without Original Sin, and He lived His entire life without sinning. We have to think He had no need of the sacrament, as we do. But Christ's baptism foreshadows our own baptism. In submitting Himself humbly to the baptism of St. John the Baptist, Christ provided the example for the rest of us. If He should be baptized, even though He had no need of it, how much more should the rest of us be thankful for this sacrament, which frees us from the darkness of sin and incorporates us into the Church, the life of Christ on earth! His Baptism, therefore, was necessary-not for Him, but for us. With the celebration of the Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord the season of Christmas comes to a close. (11:7)

Also Adoration on the third Tuesday of the month, January 18 at 6pm in the Church.


2021 ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL

TAMANIQUE, OUR SISTER PARISH

"Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime." This proverb applies directly to our parish's Tamanique project, which is in its tenth year. It provides scholarships to students in Tamanique, El Salvador, many of whom would not be able to attend, or finish, high school. Our scholarships pay only about 75 percent of the cost. The students and their families pay the rest. However, it's enough to help graduates assist their families and communities, and find work in El Salvador instead of emigrating to the U.S. and other countries. It helps us fulfill our Christian obligation of building a more just world. Over the years, we have received innumerable letters of gratitude from the students and many of our parishioners have received the thanks personally in our annual visits there. The annual cost of a scholarship for one student is \$330, but we'll take donations of any amount. 


JOPPA IS IN NEED OF VOLUNTEERS

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

The Baptism of the Lord was the occasion of the first public revelation of all the Three Persons in the Holy Trinity. It was also the official revelation of Jesus as the Son of God. To the world by God the Father. Hence, all the four Gospels describe it. It marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

Jesus' baptism by John was a significant event in the life of Jesus. Because (1) It was a *moment of identification* with us sinners. Sinless, Jesus received the baptism of repentance to identify himself with us. (2) It was a *moment of conviction* about his identity and mission. He is the Son of God, and His mission was to preach the Good News of God's love and salvation to Israel, and eventually to us, and to atone for our sins by becoming the "suffering Servant." (3) It was a *moment of equipment*. The Holy Spirit equipped Jesus by descending upon him in the form of a dove, giving him the power of preaching and healing. (4) It was a *moment of decision* to begin his public ministry at the most convenient time after receiving the approval of His Heavenly Father as His beloved Son.

Why was Jesus baptized? He is sinless and has nothing of which to repent. According to Mitch and Sri, Jesus does not need baptism. Nevertheless, at the beginning of his public ministry, Jesus dramatically demonstrates his solidarity with us by going into the same waters that the repentant crowds have been entering. In this way, Jesus shows that he has come to unite himself with sinners, and he foreshadows how he will bear the sins of humanity at the climax of his mission on the cross.

According to Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, "Jesus loaded the burden of all humanity's guilt upon his shoulders; he bore it down into the depths of the Jordan. He inaugurated his public activity by stepping into the place of sinners. His inaugural gesture is an anticipation of the cross."

At baptism, the Church commissions us to become other Christ. May the events at Jesus' baptism inspire us to know who we are and what the Church calls us to do as Christians.
