



Music Notes


Merry Christmas! Have you ever wondered where the greeting "Merry Christmas" originated? In England, from Catholic Bishop John Fisher (now a saint) in a letter to King Henry VIII's chief minister Thomas Cromwell in 1534. Prior to Fisher's new greeting, the common greeting was "Happy Christmas." Before long, "Merry Christmas" became the favored greeting, as it evoked a behavior, rather than a feeling...that we should be merry, joyful, exuberant and lively in celebrating the Love that came to us on Christmas day! So today, on the Feast of the Holy Family we joyfully sing, "Love Has Come," by Matt Maher, with its beautiful refrain, "Word of God...dwell in us forevermore. Love has come to show the way."

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question:

I have been away from the Church for a few years and really want to get active again, not so much for me, but for my children. Is this a bad reason to come back to Church?

Answer:

If you are on your way to the supermarket, and you are forced to detour from your usual route because of road work, does the food you buy taste different? Is the meal less filling? Are the vegetables less tasty? Of course not. In our faith journey, there are many detours called sin. Some are greater than others, some are even a bit longer. But God's grace comes to us in ways we understand and recognize and need. Your children leading you back to the Church is not as important as the fact that you are back.

This is an opportunity for you to renew, strengthen, and deepen your faith. Regardless of how we get to Church, or what draws us closer to God, the fact is we are there. Do what you need to do to get right with God and the Church. Go to confession, begin good family religious practices, and be involved in the ministries your parish offers. Be more than a lukewarm parishioner. Be the kind of Catholic you want your children to be. ©LPi



Mitten Tre


