

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

A word Pope Francis uses often is "encounter." It is through encounters that we grow in understanding and love for each other. To help facilitate these encounters across the worldwide Church the Holy Father is asking every parish to engage in a process of synodality. Synod is an uncommon word, but it is basically a gathering of the members of the Church - both clergy and laity - to dialogue about some topic of importance. The topic for this worldwide dialogue is how well are we a Church community encountering each other - not just with Catholics in the pews, but also those no longer coming to Church and non-Catholics.

We have until June 15, 2022, to conduct a series of listening sessions, to compile the responses, and send them off to the Vatican. The Vatican has given us a list of topics, but we are not limited by those topics. I am looking for several parishioners who are interested in conducting a few in person gatherings, online gatherings, and collecting written/emailed responses, then compiling that data to forward to the Vatican.

More important than what Pope Francis receives is how we are transformed and learn from our encounters at the local level. The Holy Father hopes our eyes and hearts are opened to what we hear in regards to how our local Church is responding or not responding to the needs of the people in our community.

Please contact the parish office if you are interested in being part of the leadership team. Calling the office is not a firm commitment, but letting us know you are interested in potentially being part of this important project.

Ordinary Time is Far from Ordinary

Christmas is officially over when all the poinsettias have been cleared from the sanctuary and we return to the greens of Ordinary Time. While that's partially true, we begin counting the Sundays of "Ordinary Time" (think "ordinal" as in numbers rather than "ordinary" as in commonplace) when Jesus has been fully manifested as the Son of God – celebrated through all the feasts of Christmas (Nativity, Holy Family, Epiphany, and Baptism of the Lord). In Year C, the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time offers yet another manifestation of Jesus' divinity – the changing of water into wine at the wedding of Cana. We will sing "Songs of the Thankfulness and Praise" one last time before retiring it for next year.

Time Away is a Time for Learning

This past weekend, I attended and presented at the International Teaching and Learning Cooperative Conference in San Diego, CA. I submitted a proposal knowing that I would get a chance to see two of my four children (and even welcomed the warmer climate). The presentation went well, and I learned several things that can be incorporated into my teaching. In addition to attending the conference.

I also take the opportunity to attend Mass and see how other parishes worship (and cope with COVID) and worshipped this morning at St. Brigid's Catholic Church in Pacific Beach, CA. The cantor and organist for the 7:30 AM Mass were both excellent...as was the preaching. Everyone wore masks and were safely distanced from one another. There was a head nod during the sign of peace and the communion procession included the dialogue (with masks) while offering only hosts. They also had a collection and presentation of the gifts, which I haven't seen in a couple of years! It was great to be away, but it will be even better getting back home!!
