



PARISH NEWS

PASTOR'S NOTES

"Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will" we proclaimed together in our psalm response this weekend. The psalmist, in doing so, experienced God putting a "new song" into his mouth and so announced God's justice. Justice is the constant and firm will to give each person what is due to him or her. As Christians, the way we pursue justice is from the standpoint of love: willing the good of the other person. While loving acts of justice are possible for each of us as individuals, at times there are needs which demand a collective response. As Roman Catholics, we are part of a Universal Church, and next weekend we have an opportunity to manifest our solidarity with the Pope through participation in the Peter's Pence Collection, which is taken up each year in January. This collection has ancient roots, linking back to New Testament times when people would provide material support to those preaching the Gospel for distribution to those in need, as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles. Donations to the Peter's Pence Collection support the charitable works of Pope Francis for the relief of those most in need. Among these charitable works carried out during 2019, some of which began in previous years and continued into 2020, were responses to natural disasters, such as earthquakes in Albania and Nepal and a cyclone in Africa, and "non-natural" disasters, such as the civil war in Ukraine and the situation in refugee & immigrant camps in Greece and in northern Mexico. The Pope also seeks to support health care in a variety of settings. Street pharmacies for the poor in Rome provided in one year some 9000 packages of medicine with a value of around \$100,000. A pediatric hospital was supported in the Central African Republic, not only with materials, but also providing training and updating initiatives for local medical and nursing staff and for family education. When Pope Francis addressed the world on that rainy March evening towards the beginning of the Coronavirus pandemic, he spoke of God calling on us "to seize this time of trial as a time of choosing. It is not the time of your judgement, but of our judgement: a time to choose what matters and what passes away, a time to separate what is necessary from what is not. It is a time to get our lives back on track with regard to you, Lord, and to others." Choosing to participate in the Peter's Pence Collection is an acknowledgment that, while individually we cannot directly perform loving acts of justice to hurting people everywhere in the world, we are not indifferent to them. It is also a way of embracing a culture of life, as our recent popes have been continually urging us to do. Our U.S. Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities proclaims "that human life is a precious gift from God; that each person who receives this gift has responsibilities toward God, self and others; and that society, through its laws and social institutions, must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence." Put more briefly, their goal is "building a culture of life 'from womb to tomb'." One effort by the U.S. Bishops to



build this culture of life is "Walking with Moms in Need," a year of service where Catholic parishes and communities "walk in the shoes" of local pregnant and parenting women in need. Bishop Folda has primarily entrusted this effort in our diocese to Catholic Charities North Dakota (CCND). This year of service began on March 25, 2020, just as the coronavirus pandemic was hitting the United States, which may have limited parish awareness and involvement in this effort. The pandemic has also limited CCND's efforts, but in November 2020 they held "Bundle Up Your Baby Bump." At this event, expectant parents were able to get donated baby blankets and other items, while being kept safe by observing guidelines for masking and physical distancing. Your support this past October on CCND Sunday helped to make this event a reality. That support, as well as any support you can give to the Peter's Pence collection, contribute to building up the culture of life both in our local communities and around the world, as our Popes and U.S. Bishops are calling for.

PREPARING FOR LITURGY AT NATIVITY: A REMINDER FROM FR. BILL

* Governor Burgum has issued a new Executive Order, effective until January 29, 2021. The language regarding churches has not changed from previous Orders: our governor continues to strongly encourage churches "to utilize COVID-19 mitigation strategies" from the North Dakota Department of Health and the federal Centers for Disease Control (CDC), which include wearing of masks, proper social distancing, and good hand hygiene.

*I appreciate the efforts of our Nativity community to wear masks, as this is a sign of charity: the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has stated: "a cloth face covering may not protect the wearer, but it may keep the wearer from spreading the virus to others." Knowledge that all are wearing masks may help some to overcome their fears and return to Mass.

*Bring along your own hand sanitizer to use before and after communion.

Handmaid of the Lord ~ Sister Sharon Houle

"Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord." (Luke 1:38).

What does it mean to be a handmaid of the Lord? A handmaid is someone whose essential function is to assist or serve, not to take charge. They are the lowliest of a household. When given a job our first inclination is to organize, to mobilize skills. When God nudges us to intervene in a situation, we move into action. When results are not favorable, we assume that we are not trying hard enough. None of this is being a handmaid of the Lord. None of this is an extension of God's hand; it is me being me.

Let us consider how Mary was a handmaid of the Lord. Mary trusted in God. She uttered her "Yes" in faith, entrusting herself to God without reserve and devoting herself totally as handmaid of the Lord. Mary's "Yes" was not conditional; she left the consequences of her "Yes" in God's hands. God took care of Joseph's hesitation to take Mary into his home by sending an angel in a dream.

Being the Lord's assistant, Mary lived in true humility, total self-giving. Mary cooperated with the Holy Spirit. Through her consent to becoming God's handmaid, she allowed God to do things **to** her but also **for** her. There were difficult moments in Mary's life: traveling to Bethlehem in the last months of pregnancy, giving birth in a stable, fleeing to Egypt. These must have been disappointing and challenging times. Yet, she did not complain; she was the handmaid of God, willingly accepting all out of tremendous faith and love for God. His desires became her desires. Mary suffered at the foot of the cross: she watched her son Jesus die on a cross, though she did not fully understand. God was in charge, and Mary united herself to whatever he wanted. As handmaid of the Lord, she is also a disciple of Christ, a true follower; her mission is to serve.

Mary was assumed into heaven and crowned Queen of Heaven and Earth. As Queen of Heaven and Earth she continues to serve as God's handmaid. Whenever we need help, we can reach out to her for assistance, and she offers a listening ear, a mother's care. There are numerous apparitions of Mary bringing a message of hope and love, encouraging people to turn from the ways of darkness to the light and life of Christ. Mary is a great intercessor. Pray to her; she will intercede for you to her Son Jesus. She is God's handmaid but also our Mother.

Are you a handmaid of the Lord? Mary is our greatest model. Being a handmaid requires surrendering all to God in love with humility and desiring what God desires. Responding to all God's promptings can be a challenge. Saying "Here I am Lord" absolutely is not an easy road but a sure one.

In 2008, over 4000 children were seen around the state of North Dakota for Abuse or Neglect. It is the goal of Project Ignite Light to equip each child seen for these reasons with a "Bag of Hope"
