PASTOR'S NOTES

Last weekend in my Notes I made some introductory remarks on the Bread of Life discourse from the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel, in which Jesus speaks of himself as the "bread of life" and the "bread that came down from heaven." As we move into the heart of the Bread of Life discourse this weekend, we again hear of the crowds searching for Jesus and finding him. To some extent, this is a summary of each of our lives: desiring to draw closer to Jesus but moving away from him at times and recommitting ourselves to "finding" Jesus again. I have always been interested in words and their origins, but it was only a few years ago that I discovered the root meaning of the word "religion": to tie (ligere) + back/again (re). We come to worship not to establish our faith relationship with God, but to "tie us back" closer to God in Jesus Christ. As I reflect today upon the Second Vatican Council's teaching on the presence of Jesus in the gathered assembly, this means that worship ties us not only closer to God, but also closer to one another. The Eucharistic Liturgy is the most important celebration of the parish family, and we begin each liturgy with the Gathering Rites (formally called the Introductory Rites): raising our voices together in song as the ministers approach the altar, each acknowledging our need for God's mercy in the Penitential Rite, glorifying God in sung prayer, and silently expressing our needs at the priest's invitation: "Let us pray." Of course, we don't gather for liturgy as a random group; we gather in the name of Jesus, and as he promises in St. Matthew's Gospel: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Mt 18:20). The first two chapters of the Second Vatican Council's document on the Church, *Lumen Gentium*, are entitled "The Mystery of the Church," focusing on the Church as the Mystical Body of Christ, and "The People of God." The first chapter states: "By communicating his Spirit, Christ mystically constitutes as his body those brothers of his who are called together from every nation." Thus, not only Jesus but the entire Church is truly present in each assembly gathered to celebrate the Eucharistic Liturgy. The second chapter notes that the Church was "established by Christ as a communion of life, love and truth" and "an instrument for the salvation of all." Jesus is the head of his people, the Church, and the baptized are given a share in Jesus' "offices" (in Latin, *munere*) of priest, prophet, and king. As priest, each member of the lay faithful, though in a different way than the ordained, joins in the offering of the Eucharist. This is seen in the Eucharistic Prayer, which begins with a dialogue between the priest and lay faithful, and following the preface, all singing the Holy, Holy, Holy, praising the Father. In the middle of the prayer itself, the gathered faithful, lay and ordained, sing the Memorial Acclamation, praising Jesus. At its conclusion, we all together pray the Our Father, the model of all prayer given by Jesus in the fifth chapter of St. Matthew's Gospel.

A CALL IN MEMORY AND HOPE

This August marks the 76th anniversary of the dropping of the first atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki Japan. Despite broad recognition today that these attacks created a humanitarian catastrophe, as would any future use of nuclear weapons, we now know that even a limited nuclear exchange would have disastrous consequences for the global environment and human survival. Presidents Biden and Putin, representing the two nations whose arsenals contain the vast majority of these weapons, provided hope in stating that "A nuclear war cannot be won and must never be fought", and agreed to pursue arms control negotiations.

The United States and Russia today are locked in a new nuclear arms race, spending hundreds of billions of dollars to upgrade their nuclear warheads and delivery systems. The danger of nuclear war, triggered by an accident or miscalculation, remains. Similarly, the U.S. and China have precipitated a new and dangerous Cold War.

Let us continue to follow Pope Francis in seeking true and lasting peace for all of our troubled world.

Parable of the Lost Son ~ Sister Sharon Houle

The Pharisees and scribes were complaining about Jesus' association with tax collectors and sinners. He was welcoming them and eating with them in their homes. So, Jesus told them this parable. A man had two sons. The younger son asked the father for his share of the inheritance. So, the father divides the property between them. The younger son collects all his belongings and set off to a distant country. He squanders it recklessly as he lives a life of indulgence. With nothing left of his inheritance, he found himself in dire need. He is forced to work as a hired hand on a swine farm. He is so destitute that he longs to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed. Realizing that his father's servants had plenty of food and better working conditions, he resolves to return to his father, beg forgiveness, and ask to be one of his servants. So, the prodigal son gets up and goes back to his father. While he is still far off, his father caught sight of him; filled with compassion he runs to his son, embraces him, and kisses him. His son says, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son." The father hardly hears his son's confession, but embraces him, tells his servants to bring a robe, put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Slaughter the fattened calf. Let us celebrate: this son of mine was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found. Luke 15:11-24.

God the Father has given us free will. He respects us and allows us to choose our own path in life, even when it is wrong. With our free will, we make good choices and harmful choices. God does not force anyone to remain with him or to love him. The prodigal son chose to take his inheritance, leave home; he ends up squandering it. When asked, the father gives his younger son his share of the inheritance and lets him leave home even though he knows the son is making a poor decision; he gives his son the freedom to leave.

God loves us, God's love for us does not depend on our faithfulness; it is unconditional. He loves us while we are still sinners. Even though we do not remain faithful, God is still faithful and continues to love us. When we recognize our error, repent of our sins, and accept Jesus Christ as our Savior and Lord, God forgives us. He welcomes us into his eternal family.

In his desperate state, the younger son comes to realize he has sinned and unworthy to be called a son. He also recognizes his need for the father, remembers the father's kindness and generosity. His father's servants are treated well and have plenty to eat. He will return to his father as a servant. The son is not returning, seeking to be treated as a son but seeking the father's mercy. He is humbled before the father. The father rejoices in the son's return. He pours his generosity on the son and celebrates life. God's generosity, forgiveness and mercy knows no bounds. If we repent of our sins and accept Jesus Christ as our Savior and Lord, God will forgive us all our sins. He will welcome us into His eternal family.

The lesson of the parable is that God is continually and lavishly forgiving. When the son repented, he is met with mercy. A mercy that overwhelms, embraces, restores, and heals. A mercy that rejoices and celebrates.




