Know Your Faith

O God, who were pleased to give us the shining example of the Holy Family, graciously grant that we may imitate them in practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity, and so, in the joy of your house, delight one day in eternal rewards. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.



Sunday Readings

First Reading – SIR 3:2-6, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother. Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard. Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother. My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life; kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins—a house raised in justice to you.

Gospel – LK 2:22-40

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, They took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, He took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted — and you yourself a sword will pierce — so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.



The Nicene Creed



The Nicene Creed arose from the first two ecumenical councils of the Church. The first ecumenical council is the First Council of Nicaea in 325 AD. and the second is the Council of Constantinople in 381 AD. This Creed is ancient and it has preserved the faithful from a variety of heresies for over 1,600 years. To understand it is to understand what we believe as Catholics.

The Incarnation and The Virgin Mary:

and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

By the free choice of Mary, our Mother, and by the power of the Holy Spirit, the Word of God took on flesh. Jesus Christ, the uncreated Word through which all things were made, condescended to share in our humanity. The almighty God emptied Himself and took on the form of a slave, to use the language of

St. Paul. In the Latin Rite, there is a tradition of bowing during this paragraph in honor of the Incarnation. The Incarnation is literally the "enfleshment" of Jesus; it is what we celebrate at Christmas. This paragraph marks one of the most important moments in human history. Our God became one of us.





The CAP Board of Directors has launched a major gifts campaign and hired a new executive director: Chris Krampe, director of Fine Arts and Humanities at the College of Saint Mary in Omaha. Chris has joined CAP as part-time executive director. An expert in arts fundraising, Chris is a trained performance artist, conductor, composer and keyboard soloist.

"I'm excited for the future of CAP," said Krampe. "I look forward to serving the fantastic mission of Cathedral Arts Project and promoting CAP programs to the public."

CAP's mission, he said, is unique in the Omaha arts landscape.

"It directly serves St. Cecilia Cathedral, so our goal isn't just to provide art for enjoyment, but for spiritual renewal and growth," said Krampe. "This spring we'll have a mix of wonderful programs. There will be something for everyone."

Hiring Krampe is part of a \$300,000 major gifts campaign launched to ensure CAP's strategic growth during the next three years, said Kennedy.

"These funds will give CAP leadership a window of opportunity to position the organization for future advancement and sustainability," she said. "Not only will we enhance our programs - music in the beautiful acoustics of the Cathedral and arts events in the gallery and museums - but all of our events are admission-free."

Krampe joins CAP as it plans to work more broadly with local schools to support fine arts and music education and increase collaboration on diverse programming with other Omaha area arts organizations.
