Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time *January 31, 2021*

The readings for this Sunday’s Mass are a meditation on the mystery of God’s voice. In all four readings, we can glean something different about the experience of hearing the Lord—just as we heard the story of God calling Samuel two weeks ago. We may have a spectrum of reactions to that call, but when we truly feel that God has spoken, we must shape our decisions around the idea we receive.

Like the Israelites in the first reading, we may be too terrified to hear him again and beg him to guide us through a proxy, such as Moses himself or the prophets after him. As in the Psalm, we may resist the urge to hide from God and thus soften our defenses to his voice. As in Paul’s letter to the Corinthians, we might miss God’s leading altogether because of voluntary or incidental distractions. Finally, today’s gospel serves as a kind of synopsis in this brief curriculum on discernment.

The Hebrew people under Moses’s care and leadership had had an experience at Mount Horeb when on hearing the voice of God, they recoiled and begged God to speak through prophets for fear of the Lord’s own voice. On the other hand, it’s so much easier for us to say no to the voice of a prophet in your life than to that still, small, but ineffable voice you only hear when you are at your quietest. I can relate to this fear.

When you hear his voice, it can be terrifying. Knowing you must change, but fearful of the ramifications, the dread makes following God all the more difficult. The most unnerving part is that this change wasn’t our own idea, but the uncanny prompting of the Holy Spirit.

Psalm 95 challenges us to respond in faith and praise when we hear his voice, knowing his voice to be that of the Shepherd of Our Souls. As people on the way, we weigh and test the direction we hear—this is the very nature of discernment. However, the time for prayer and discernment must end, and we must trust that God is leading and preparing each step before us, no matter how uncomfortable it may appear to be. The challenge is to be greater than our forebears who heard, but doubted and hardened themselves against his voice.

Distraction is the theme of the second reading. St. Paul’s writing encourages us to be free of distraction from the leading of God. In his letter, distraction takes the form of a spouse. While a person who is single may be free to move with the will of God, almost on a whim, two people

together, especially those joined by God, have a responsibility to God and to each other to carefully choose their steps. This message calls those who are yoked together to leverage their discernment into obedient, faithful action together.

This week’s scriptures come together in the Gospel, wrapping up what is a kind of primer on discernment.

First, the people hear Jesus teach with authority, the voice of God given to them directly, not as related through the scribes. Then, an unclean spirit interrupts, as if to distract. Jesus dispels that unclean spirit—again, with authority and a simple command. Everyone who experienced this moment is amazed and sees clearly that the voice of God has power over objections and dissention.

So often God’s voice comes to us, as with so many things in this world, as through a filter. In this current season, we can imagine it as if trying to understand someone speaking through a mask on a cell phone with poor reception. The real lesson to be learned is to place ourselves in locations with the best signal: going into silence, going to Adoration, eliminating distraction, exerting focused dedication in the Mass, receiving the Sacraments often and with earnest intentionality.

Then, perhaps starting with trivial things, ask the Holy Spirit to lead. Which parking space? What time should I go to the store? What route is best, even if not most expedient? I found in my life that these tiny steps, taken in faith, formed my heart for choices that had real meaning. Trust that we will hear God better and know his will more clearly, with humble faith and practice.







CATECHISM CORNER BY DAVID DUNST



Catechism
Corner

In last week's Corner, we recalled Jesus's admonition against looking at someone with lust in the heart, because that desire for sin denotes a bent will that tends toward sin (remember the word concupiscence). The appetite that leads to sin is not wrong, and the fleeting thought of sin (while it reveals our disordered desire) is not sinful, but the will to entertain the thought is where that line is crossed. Sin is in the will, not only in the commission of any immoral act.

Therefore, the Catechism speaks of undertaking the total of purifying one's heart, in order to combat the will to sin and mitigate against concupiscence.

We are encouraged to “Remain simple and innocent,” that we will “not know the evil that destroys man's life,” because “out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, saddlery, fornication...” So we must practice temperance and work to purify the heart in order to control the desires of the flesh. In other words, the heart is where moral decisions are arbitrated. (CCC 2517)

In the sixth beatitude, Jesus tells us that the pure in heart shall see God. That is, “those who have attuned their intellects and wills to the demands of God's holiness.” This applies foremost in the areas: charity (love of the other for their own sake), chastity (purity in sexual conduct), and love of truth and orthodoxy of faith. In this we see there is a connection between purity of heart, of body, and of faith (CCC 2518).

Paragraph 2518 quotes St. Augustine:

The faithful must believe the articles of the Creed “so that by believing they may obey God, by obeying may live well, by living well may purify their hearts, and with pure hearts may understand what they believe.”

The pure heart enables us to see according to God, accepting others as “neighbors” and perceiving the human body—both our own and our neighbor's—as a temple of the Holy Spirit and a manifestation of divine beauty (CCC 2519).
