Fourth Sunday of Easter *April 25, 2021*

I have mentioned before that I write my bulletin articles in the adoration chapel. I try to find a time when the chapel is empty—or nearly empty—so that the sound of my keyboard doesn't distract others. I love writing in the chapel with Jesus, because so often the words that end up in my article are not what I was expecting, but rather the Lord at work, using me as His humble instrument.

With COVID, things have looked a little different though. Over the past year, I have sat at my desk in my room, typically early in the morning, the sound of the baby's sound machine coming through the monitor and sometimes interrupted by our beloved black lab, who wants to go outside or has decided it's time for second breakfast. Sitting on my desk though, I have YouTube open on my phone to a livestream of adoration from Melbourne, Australia. It's certainly not the same beautiful space as our adoration chapel—but Jesus still joins me here—and still guides my heart and crafts my words.

Our psalm from today was the theme of a retreat I did early in my ministry here at St. Peter's. The retreat was based around a brick. Each participant received a brick at the beginning of the retreat and then had to bring it everywhere with them, and if they were caught without their brick, they got an extra to carry around. They carried them until Saturday night when they left them in the confessional—a physical sign of the weight of their sins being lifted from them. The bricks were then decorated and given back to them as a symbol of Jesus, their cornerstone.


I remember being very excited for this retreat. Thursday night, before we left, my daughter started throwing up. By Friday morning she was fine, but then my husband started feeling sick. I was feeling good and, after being reassured by my mom and in-laws that they would help with Clare while Mike recovered, I headed off to St. Peter's for the retreat. It was a great retreat, and by Saturday afternoon, I had nearly forgotten about the stomach bug going through my home. As Saturday evening rolled around though, it was clear that I was not going to escape the bug. I was put in my own cabin to keep the bug to myself (thank you, Lord, that no one else got it!) and handed over the reigns of the retreat to my awesome leadership team. I was devastated, and, in my own pride, was worried the retreat would be ruined without me.

The Lord worked beautifully that weekend though, and

although I didn't witness it, I heard many stories of how the Lord worked powerfully throughout the rest of the retreat. The circumstances were less than ideal—but the Lord is capable of working in way less than ideal circumstances. Which brings me back to my desk and my livestream adoration. The sound machine, the whining dog, and the ongoing pandemic. This last year has been less than ideal in many ways, but the Lord continues to move and work.

Jesus is our good shepherd who seeks, guides, and lays down His life. And He doesn't just do that for perfect people or in perfect circumstances, but rather He came to seek, guide, and lay down His life, because people and circumstances are not perfect. "I am the good shepherd." He tells us this weekend. The good shepherd, who seeks the lost, guides with care, and lays down His life for His sheep. Jesus—the King of the Universe—seeks us, guides us, and lays down His life for us. That's probably not a new or profound statement for you, but I would encourage you to let that truth sink in a little more today. Jesus, the King of the Universe, seeks you, guides you, and laid down His life for you—no matter what the sin or circumstance.

This is cause for great joy and hope. So let us join our psalmist today and say, "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His kindness endures forever."




HELP WANTED

Ever wonder what God has planned for your life?


Discover God's plan of sheer goodness in the Class of St. Joseph!



MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES

We are very pleased to see events and ministries beginning to be active again here at St. Peter's! We have many exciting ways for you to be involved. At this time, we do have a few specific needs. Wedding Coordinator

Once the marriage prep is completed and the blessed day approaches, our engaged couples are guided through the rehearsal and wedding day by one of our St. Peter's wedding coordinators. Responsibilities include leading the wedding rehearsal, opening the church for the wedding party, supporting them during their preparation time, and serving as sacristan/server for their marriage ceremony on the day of the wedding. Training and materials are provided. This ministry does require availability that includes Thursday and Friday evenings, and Saturday mornings and afternoons.

Giving Tree Co-coordinator

The Giving Tree provides help for almost 50 families every Christmas. Our team, comprised of two co-coordinators working closely with Lisa, works hard to gather gift requests, collect donations to meet those needs, and facilitates the sorting and distribution of donations to families in both our own St. Peter's family and the community we serve. This ministry is active from October through December. Good communication and organization skills are a must for this ministry, as well as a deep desire to help and maintain confidentiality.

Blood Drive Coordinator

In general, St. Peter's hosts a Red Cross Blood Drive twice a year. The coordinator's responsibilities include liaising with our Red Cross representative and Lisa to schedule drives, oversee sign ups, recruit volunteers for the drive day, and be onsite for each drive, typically in May and September. This is a great ministry for someone whose schedule makes weekly commitments difficult, but who can give up two full days a year. Computer access is helpful for working with the Red Cross and facilitating sign ups.

CATECHISM CORNER *BY DAVID DUNST*



Catechism Corner

Beginning this week, and for some weeks to come, we'll be employing a different resource in our survey of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. I'll be drawing much of the material from the Compendium to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

This resource is a much smaller volume, about one-quarter as thick as the Catechism itself, published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), as of 2006, at the direction of a Pope Benedict XVI *motu proprio*, which entrusts this book to the faithful as a reliable reflection of the Church's teaching as set forth in the Catechism. It is written in much more manageable chunks, and while still containing much of the conclusive material of Catholic teaching, in a condensed, Q&A format.

I think this will help us wade through the content of Church teaching a bit more efficiently. With that, we return to the Catechism's survey of the revelation of Prayer in the Old Testament, picking up with the example of Moses.

Moses's prayer is largely exemplary of what is known today as "contemplative prayer." That is, prayer that is marked by long, quiet, intimate, interior conversations with God. We read in the book of Exodus that Moses would meet with God, "face to face, like a man with his friend." This intimate and private time with God gave him strength to intercede on behalf of the Jewish people, whose care and leading God had entrusted to Moses. There is certainly a likeness to the prayer of Christ Jesus in his example (Paragraphs 2574-2577, 2593).

In the Old Testament, there is a pronounced relationship between the Kingship of Israel and the temple, as the place of worship, and the people. For the People of God, prayer was an outgrowth of the law of God, the Ten Commandments, and the place of the presence of God, the Ark of the Covenant—and after, the Temple. In time, the kings of Israel became a sign of God's providence, and his prayer—specifically the prayer of King David, the "man after God's own heart"—became the model for the prayer of the people. And that prayer was to be an act of trust in God, who is the only true King (Paragraphs 2578-2580, 2594).

Next week: the role of prayer in the prophets; the place of the psalms; and the coming of Christ, the fruition of prayer.
