Pentecost Sunday

May 23, 2021

“When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled...”

Here we are 50 days post resurrection—the time for Pentecost! And time for me to take down my Easter decorations! The Easter season is a favorite of mine in the Church, and as such I leave up my “Happy Easter!” décor long after our secular culture would think it appropriate. And 50 days is a long time! I remember last year Clare would ask me “Mama is it *still* the Easter season?” “Yes it is!” I would reply. I thought it was sweet that she was so tuned in, until this year when, 2 weeks after her birthday, she declared that extra dessert was required, because it was still her birthday season.

In all seriousness though, think how long 50 days would have felt to the apostles. Jesus has been resurrected, but His appearances were sporadic, and they seemed to spend a lot of time in a locked upper room. At the last supper, Jesus had promised He would send the advocate, but they still couldn’t have fully known what that meant and they just kept waiting.

I don’t know about you, but I’m not always so good at waiting. Often I think I’ve got it all figured out, and that my plan is the best plan. In my pride I get so wrapped up in my timelines and planning, that I don’t ask God what His plan is. Or I get impatient with Him when things don’t go according to my carefully plotted timeline.

I’m coming up on 6 years of professional ministry here at St. Peter’s. When I think back on how God worked in bringing me here and building my family, I just have to smile at His timing and faithfulness.

When I was fresh out of college hunting for ministry jobs, I said “I would never work at St. Peter’s. No one would take me seriously—they’ve known me for too long.” Fast forward five years; Mike and I were looking to start a family, and I knew that full time ministry just would not be feasible for me with a baby. But the position I was in was full time, and there was no possibility of part time.

I remember feeling a little hopeless, just not sure what we were going to do. I tried to find a solution on my own, but nothing was lining up. Then Fr. Steven announced that the position at St. Peter’s was moving to a part time position and was going to be open. “Really, Lord?” I asked. “I said I would never work there.” Well, I applied and was offered the job. Two weeks after I started, I found out we were expecting our first baby. And serving the parish that has

always been my home has been more rewarding than I could have ever expected.

God’s timing is always the best. His plan is always the most fulfilling. Fifty days is a long time and those 10 days after Jesus ascended must have felt like an eternity. But when the time was fulfilled, the Holy Spirit showed up and brought to life our beloved Church.

So I would encourage you today—lean into the Lord and His timing. Even if you feel like you’ve been waiting for a long time or you don’t see what the plan is moving forward. God is good—and His plans for you are too.

HOW IS GOD WITH ME IN TRIALS AND LOSS: WITH FR. STEVEN







Wedding Coordinator

Once the marriage prep is completed and the blessed day approaches, our engaged couples are guided through the rehearsal and wedding day by one of our St. Peter's wedding coordinators. Responsibilities include leading the wedding rehearsal, opening the church for the wedding party, supporting them during their preparation time, and serving as sacristan/server for their marriage ceremony on the day of the wedding. Training and materials are provided. CATECHISM CORNER BY DAVID DUNST



Catechism Corner

In the time of the Church, prayer takes on added dimension. Especially as it pertains to Liturgy and Sacrament, our prayer is clearly descendant of the traditions of Judaism, however, with the added character of the knowledge of Christ, which fulfills and enriches the imagery of more ancient prayers.

In the Acts of the Apostles, it says explicitly that the Holy Spirit taught the earliest Christians to pray, and that the life of faith was encompassed by learning the teaching of the Apostles, living in community, "the breaking of the bread"—essentially the Mass—and "the prayers" (CCC 2623-2624). What this last one could have referred to I'm not sure, but for us, it is loaded with developments that came not long after the Apostolic Age.

For us, "the prayers" can refer to traditional moments of prayer: at waking, before meals, before sleep, etc. Additionally, and more formally, it can refer to the Liturgy of the Hours, or the "Divine Office," as it is also known. These are prayers that mark the hours of the day, suffusing the whole day with scripture, with Psalms, with praise to God, and with the instruction of our renowned ancestors in the Christian faith.

The Holy Spirit takes on a very central role in Christian prayer in particular. As we have said in previous weeks, prayer is about communion with God, and Jesus is exactly that embodied; therefore, for us to subsist in prayer, we must receive the Holy Spirit, the Gift of God, and interior "Master of Christian prayer." The Spirit leads us into ever deeper contemplation of the mystery of Christ, and this prayer takes several classifiable forms (CCC 2623, 2625).

- Blessing is a prayer of man's response to God, blessing Him who first blessed us.
- Adoration is a prayer of humility, acknowledging our utter dependence on the all-holy God.
- Petition is asking God for our needs, spiritual and physical, encompassing our need for forgiveness, all the way up to our greatest need—that God's Kingdom come.
- Intercession is like petition, but on behalf of another, in imitation of Jesus's own prayer, which thus extends even to our enemies.
- Thanksgiving is gratitude to God, for his very goodness and generosity. For Catholic Christians, this very deeply occurs in the Eucharist.
- Praise is recognition and restatement of the goodness of God, making explicit his glory and his worthiness to be praised all the more. This is disinterested prayer: singing out the praise of God for his own sake, not because of any benefit to us.
