The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ *June 6, 2021*

What must it have been like to be seated at the table with Jesus, for the Last Supper? After giving his disciples instructions for the preparation of the place, Jesus gathered with them one last time before his death. We can imagine that they were confused by his words in those last days. There was a shift to talk about his passion and death and resurrection. They were confused, frightened, and didn't really understand what Jesus was trying to tell them. It is clear that they weren't ready for what was about to happen, and yet it was the Father's time and the Father's plan.

How many times have we sat down together as a family at the table to enjoy a meal? The gathering of loved ones around a table is one of the most basic forms of celebration in our society. It is also one of the most important. How many of us have memories of grandparents or uncles and aunts sharing family stories, while we enjoyed a meal together? Or what about the memories of how mom and dad went around the table at Thanksgiving and asked each of us to share something for which we were thankful? The family dinner table is not unlike the table where Jesus shared his last meal with his friends. There was food and drink, time of relaxing and enjoying the company of others, but it was also a place where lessons were taught.

My adult children have fond memories of our family meals together. I am happy to report that my love of cooking has found its way to each of our children. While growing up, I often pulled one of the kids into the kitchen to help prepare the meal. This was a wonderful time of sharing and working together to put the meal on the table. Thankfully, I am now able to do that same thing with my grandchildren. There is a beautiful lesson in the preparing of the meal. My children soon learned that food doesn't just appear on the table. There is work involved. I think they also learned that preparing food for family is an act of love on the part of the persons preparing it.

The table where the Last Supper was celebrated was really the first altar where a consecration took place. Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke and gave it to them. Then he took the cup; he pronounced the blessing on the wine and passed it to each of them. As they received the bread and wine, now pronounced by Jesus as his Body and Blood, they received their first Holy Communion. His simple words, "Take and eat. Take and drink. This is my Body; This is my Blood." Jesus was not only feeding their bodies but also their souls. This was a meal that has been reenacted on altars throughout the world for more than two thousand years.


Many times I have gone to the Washington County Jail on a Saturday morning to offer a Word and Communion service. I set up in a conference room, never knowing how many people will gather around that table. I always make the point of saying that the room in which we meet is not a conference room but a church. The table around which we gather is not a conference room table but an altar. I place the consecrated Eucharist on the table and remind those attending that this is Jesus, truly present with us.

Sometimes the most beautiful and profound things in life are actually really simple in their beauty. A piece of unleavened bread and a sip of wine. These elements were well-known to Jewish people in Jesus' time. He took an old practice and did something new. This bread was no longer a symbol, but his Body. The cup of wine was now his Blood. In just a few minutes he would leave the table and enter the garden to pray one last time before Judas betrayed him, and he would make the walk to Calvary to meet a cruel and inhumane death.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We reflect upon the mystery of the Eucharist, with wonder and awe. We look to the altar in our church where the sacrifice is re-presented again and again. It is always the same words; it is always the same Christ. We do here on earth what is celebrated forever in heaven!

Jesus offered this sacrifice at a table where his closest friends were gathered. There is something sacred about a family or close group of friends gathered around a table. The conversation, the laughter, and sometimes the tears are a shared experience in which Jesus is the unseen guest. In the Jewish Passover there is always an empty place at the table for the prophet Elijah. Maybe we should consider setting a place at our table for Jesus. He comes to us simply and beautifully in every Eucharist. While we receive what looks like a wafer of bread, in our hearts we know that it is something much more. It is Jesus!

Let us ask Jesus, the unseen guest at our family table, to bless every meal and to help us remember what he did for us two thousand years ago in that upper room.


HISTORIC CHURCH OPEN HOUSE AND TOURS





CATECHISM CORNER BY DAVID DUNST



Catechism Corner

Prayer is an endeavor that, as natural and authentically human as it is to reach out for God, always starts with a good amount of awkwardness. Like anything in life worth doing, doing it well takes practice, and practice requires commitment, and commitment is only born of true affection. Therefore, we who long to know God better through prayer—truly the only way that knowledge comes—often need to turn to examples and help to get started.

In the Catechism, we are directed to the example of those who loved God best in this life, the saints. For us, the saints are in prayer what they are for us in every aspect of Christian living, examples and models. So, we call on them in prayer ourselves, asking those alive in the very unity of God to intercede on our behalf. Often, in response, spiritualities or schools of prayer grow organically out of devotion to the patronage of various saints (CCC 2683-2684, 2692-2693).

The family is the primary school of prayer. As the first witness to Christian prayer, daily prayer together as a family is highly recommended, but that does not represent a comprehensive prayer regimen. In addition, catechesis and prayer groups, along with spiritual direction, make up a more complete school of prayer formation (CCC 2685-2690, 2694-2695).

While one can pray anywhere, the Catechism suggests some places are appropriate for given forms of prayer. For example, the church is the appropriate place for liturgical prayer and Eucharistic adoration. Beyond that, a shrine, monastery, or home "prayer corner" are very helpful settings for approaching prayer (CCC2691, 2696).
