*Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time* *July 11, 2021*

One of the great blessings of this past year's abnormalities has been the launch of the "Bible in a Year Podcast," with Fr. Mike Schmitz and presented by Ascension Press. Those who are listening to it may find some humor in the fact that I refer to it so specifically, because Fr. Mike, somewhat comically, repeats all of the same details every day. Part of this blessing for me, as a fan of words, has been getting to know a different translation of the Bible (Revised Standard Version Catholic Edition).

So far, considering only a large percentage of the Old Testament, the takeaway has been, I might say, the word "persistence."

Not only are God's chosen people persistent in turning to the gods of the nations around them, especially their principle rivals at a given time, but God is persistent in his love for those same people—even if that love means allowing the evils they invite in to befall them. Before they were even a "chosen nation, a people set apart" (incidentally, this means literally "a holy people"), the people God had intended to make his own were quite susceptible to the evils of the pagan peoples around them and found ways to adopt practices we would find unthinkable.

Sin itself is a persistent state of the human race, and for generation after generation evils, like slavery (even if that meant something very different than it does to our understanding) and polygamy, were rampant. Looking at the merely historical basis, ideals (equality in dignity of men and women, for example) we hold now would have seemed even more foreign than worshipping a false God.

I might dare to say that there is no sin committed by those we consider to be Christians that should shock us. Even something so gruesome as child sacrifice was committed by the kings of God's people. Altars or places of sacrifice to other gods than the Lord were re-erected by Manasseh, even though the good and holy king Hezekiah, his father, had just destroyed these places of idol worship.

On the other hand, God's loving generosity, his desire to bless his people, is just as persistent. God is genuinely eager to enact grace and blessing in the midst of the Israelites when they but honor him as he prescribed. No matter how long or how far the hearts of this people wandered or how deeply they had sinned, God's blessing was readily available, when the hearts of the people returned to him.

I read in some Facebook post a quote I wish I could attribute correctly, but it said, in so many words, "No matter how far you have wandered away from God, the return journey is only one step."

Let's not delude ourselves, however, in thinking this return easy or short. As is said in a Sioux proverb, "The longest journey you'll ever make is from the head to the heart." And yet, that journey is but one step. The trouble is, it so often takes us years of searching and wandering for our hearts to find rest in God.

We cost ourselves time, emotional and physical pain—blood, sweat, and tears, both literally and figuratively—prodigally spending our affection on whatever passing fancy catches our eye. We scavenge amongst the wreckage of this world's pursuits for a balm for the brokenness and hurts we carry, trying to patch our own boat, attempting to fill our bucket with a drink that satisfies at last.

An African-American spiritual says, "There is a balm in Gilead to make the wounded whole / There's power enough in heaven to cure the sin-sick soul." Of course, we've all heard the quote from St. Augustine: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

Another word on persistence, in closing...

This "Bible in a Year" effort has been, dare I say, the most fruitful and powerful undertakings in which I have engaged, since the daily rosary. There is, unsurprisingly, great power in routine and structure. Our choice is to prioritize those things we enshrine in our daily routines. What component necessities of life do we deem important enough to make consistent investment of time and effort?

I would encourage you: unless you place God in that handful of items that are important enough to include in each and every day, you will not experience that healing. It is more like a program of daily exercise than open-heart surgery. There is healing in Christ, but it is best administered daily, rather than as an invasive procedure.


### HISTORIC CHURCH OPEN HOUSE AND TOURS

### CATECHISM CORNER BY DAVID DUNST



#### Catechism Corner

The Lord’s Prayer contains seven distinct petitions. The first three center on God, as love would first seek the good of the other. So, we first desire that God would receive the glory and worship he is due. The last four express our needs and our reliance upon God and his provision (CCC 2803-2806, 2857).

“Hallowed be thy Name” is a petition that all would praise, make holy (that is, set apart as sacred and worthy of praise and devotion), and acknowledge as most holy the name of God. God revealed his name to Moses, and we keep that name in reserve, holding it in highest esteem, such that we do not say it (CCC 2807-2812, 2858).

“Thy kingdom come” is the request that God’s reign would come about both through the glorious return of Christ, and through the continual sanctification of people throughout the world, bringing about the justice, charity, and peace God desires (CCC 2816-2822, 2859).

“Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven” is the expression of our hope and trust that the will of God would be accomplished in this world, as it is perfectly in heaven. We are chiefly praying for the salvation of all—that in the fullness of time, our will would be one and the same with that of our Lord Jesus (CCC 2822-2827, 2860).

Next week, because we know well our shortcoming and that God surpasses all powers, we will consider the petitions we make for our own goods.


