Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time *August 22, 2021*

The prime directive, as all Star Trek fans know, is to change nothing while traveling to other worlds. I've always thought this to be an excellent principal for interim parochial ministry. Your pastor has charted a steady course, and he has gathered an excellent crew to keep this wonderful parish faithful and true. It is indeed an honor to be asked to serve here, during Fr. Steven's much deserved sabbatical, and we will all pray that he has a fruitful time of renewal as he follows our Lord's counsel in Mark 6:31, to come away and rest a while.

Who am I? My story is a little different from most priests. After serving as an Episcopal priest and bishop for some 28 years, my wife and I entered into full communion with the Catholic Church in 2007. I believe this had been the trajectory I was on for years, as I have been in love with the church fathers and yearning for the assurance of apostolicity, that foundation represented by the Chair of St. Peter, on which the Lord built His Church (Matt. 16:18).

I still remember that day in 1978 when, as a seminarian, I watched the moment when the new Pope, St. John Paul II, walked out on the loggia of St Peter's, and I sensed that the course of my life would in some way be inevitably linked to him. It was Pope John Paul II, who made it possible for married clergy converts to be ordained in the Catholic Church.

It took some years, but I had come to realize that I could not in conscience continue to serve in an ecclesial community that did not have this Petrine foundation. The Archbishop of Santa Fe, the Most Rev. Michael Sheehan, helped me to cross the Tiber. I then spent a formation year at the Pontifical Irish College in Rome, a wonderfully vibrant community, blessed by perhaps the most dynamic English-speaking Sunday mass in the Eternal City, gathering families from all over Rome. Looking back on those days now, I cannot help but notice how that same spirit is to be found in the dynamic parish of St. Peter's in Mendota.


In 2009, I was ordained a priest in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe and began to teach at the University of St. Thomas and St. Mary's Seminary in Houston. In late 2010, I was asked to become the first ordinary of the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter, which Pope Benedict XVI had launched with the apostolic constitution, Anglicanorum Coetibus, welcoming groups of Anglicans into the Catholic Church. In 2017, the Ordinariate in the U.S. and Canada had grown to the point that the Holy See gave us a bishop,

and so my wife and I moved to St. Paul, where I served on the St. Paul Seminary faculty for three years.

Now I help in the archdiocese and am very involved with the Coming Home Network, an apostolate dedicated to helping people come into full communion with the Catholic Church. My work is especially focused on those Protestant clergy, whose consciences are leading them "to come home."

Perhaps I should also confess that aviation is my hobby, and I am much looking forward to watching aircraft on approach to MSP runway 30R from the gardens of St. Peter's. Over the years, I've worked on an amateur-built bush plane, christened "Petra," which is now airworthy and flying.

It will be a great privilege to serve as your priest at St. Peter's for these next weeks until Advent. I pray that I may faithfully bear witness with all of you to the joy of belonging to our Lord Jesus Christ, and that Fr. Steven will find his parish in the good order in which he left it, when he returns from his sabbatical.





CATECHISM CORNER *BY DAVID DUNST*



**Catechism
Corner**

The Catechism reminds us that prayer cannot be understood simply as the outpouring of our own mind (or heart), because we must choose, or “will” that connection with God. Furthermore, it isn’t enough to know about prayer, one must learn and experience prayer through the real action of the Holy Spirit (CCC 2650).

We all too often forget the Holy Spirit in the day-to-day, but as the “Master of Christian prayer,” the Holy Spirit makes us able to enter into prayer at its source, which is the person of Christ. Reciprocally, Christ then lets us in prayer to enable us to receive more and more the Holy Spirit. In this loop, we thus grow deeper and deeper in our connection and relationship with God through prayer (CCC 2652).

From here, the Catechism begins to enumerate the “wellsprings of prayer”—vehicles through which we gain greater fuel for the journey of prayer.


Firstly, the Word of God is a primary source of dialogue with God, however, we must be careful to pray with the Word as we consume it. If we fail to pray along with Sacred Scripture, we lack that element that makes for true communication in dialogue. The Catechism quotes *Dei Verbum* saying, “we speak to him when we pray; we listen to him when we read the divine oracles (CCC 2653).” Put another way, we knock in mental prayer and it is opened to us in contemplation of the Sacred Scripture (CCC 2654).

Secondly, the Catechism directs us to the Liturgy of the Church: that is, the Mass and the Divine Office. What we experience in the Mass, we can truly receive through contemplation, during and after, which makes present in us the very mystery of salvation (CCC 2655).

Thirdly, we receive great direction in prayer, through the theological virtues: faith, which makes us seek the face of God (CCC 2656); hope, which makes us trust that God is the source of all good (CCC 2657); love, which is both the root and fruit of communion with God (CCC 2658).

Lastly, the Church tells us that the events of each day are there to drive us to prayer. We can find the Holy Spirit leading us into prayer, through every moment—through the present moment, where we encounter God in the now, rather than in the yesterday or tomorrow (CCC 2659).

Next week: prayer in the Blessed Trinity.




SISTERS OF ST. JOSEPH OF CARONDELET 2021 SEPTEMBERFEST
